Wrangler ProRodeo Tour gets underway with SandHills Stock Show & Rodeo

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - The 2006 edition of the Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour makes a visit to the Mile-High City this Sunday, Jan.22, for the National Western Stock Show & Rodeo.

The second of 12-Tour stops, the National Western will feature the best in ProRodeo competing for Tour points to qualify for the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out, May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla. The top 12 in each event following the 12th and final Tour stop in Guymon, Okla., on May 7 will qualify for this prestigious event.

Each regular Tour stop is the final round of one of the top rodeos in the country. Contestants earn Tour points based on his/her performance at the Tour rodeos. Fans can catch all the

action of the Tour on Fox Sports Network (FSN) for the first time in history. Each stop will be televised on FSN within 10 days of the event. Check local listings for times in your area.

The National Western Stock Show & Rodeo is celebrating its 100th anniversary this year and has been a stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour since its debut in 2000.

The event which started on Jan. 7 will conclude with the Wrangler Tour round on Jan. 22 at 2 p.m. MT at the Denver Coliseum.

The third stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour will be the Black Hills Stock Show and Rodeo with the Wrangler Tour round is scheduled for Sunday, Feb. 5 at 1:30 p.m. MT.

Stevenson wins big in Odessa to begin 2006 season

ODESSA, Texas - Wes Stevenson started his 2006 rodeo season with a big win at the SandHills Stock Show and Rodeo in Odessa, Texas, in front of a sold-out crowd totaling 5,000.

Stevenson, a native of the Lone Star State, initially drew Vold Rodeo's Pine Cone, but after an equipment failure during the eight-second ride, he was awarded a re-ride. Stevenson, of Kaufman, then matched wits with Vold Rodeo's Sky Dancer for 81 points. That added to the 81 he received in the first round on Vold Rodeo's Eagle Feathers put him in a tie for the average with Logan Hodson with 162 points on two head.

"That was a good horse, and they have won a lot of money on him," said Stevenson, who picked up a check worth \$5,313. "I am glad it all worked out for me tonight. I feel like I am riding with the same confidence I was at the Wrangler NFR, so I hope I can keep it rolling all year long."

Hodson, of Goodwell, Okla., won the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with an 83-point ride on Vold Rodeo's Big Valley. He pocketed \$4,539 for his efforts in Odessa.

The SandHills Stock Show and Rodeo marked the first stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour, and 2006 also marked the first time Odessa was a stop on the 12-stop Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out upon the conclusion of the Winter Tour.

The Pace Chute-out will be held May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla. All 12 stops on the Winter Tour will be televised on Fox Sports Network for the first time in history, and the SandHills Stock Show and Rodeo is scheduled to air Jan. 20. Check local listings for times in your area.

Rodeo News and Notes

▶ Road to Pocatello continues.

Qualification for the 2006 Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo (DNCFR) will wrap up this weekend with the Dodge Turquoise Circuit Finals in Lake Havasu City, Ariz.

To qualify for the DNCFR, which will be held in Pocatello, Idaho, March 15-18, a contestant must win either the year-end circuit award or the average title at the Dodge Circuit Finals. The year-end winner is the one who has collected the most money in their event during the year, while the average champion is solely based on their performance at the circuit finals. Each circuit will send two contestants from each event to Pocatello for a total of 16 from each circuit. Each event at the DNCFR will feature 24 contestants in each event representing all 12 circuits.

The 2006 DNCFR winners will get an added bonus this year from Dodge. Each event winner will win a brand new Dodge Truck to drive for a year.

▶ Bowers, Sisk win 32nd Cowboy

Downhill. Present and former rodeo champions from across North America took part in the 32nd Annual Cowboy Downhill on Jan. 17 in Steamboat Springs, Colo. Year after year, generations return to the Headwall Trail at the base of the ski area to experience Steamboat's own wild-West cowboy action, the most unique ski rodeo in the world.

Canadian bareback rider Kyle Bowers won the dual slalom race for the second consecutive year and third overall, while Steamboat's own saddle bronc rider Michael Sisk, who is also an orthopedic surgeon, won the stampede race for the second consecutive year and third overall.

The Cowboy Downhill coincides with the 100th National Western Stock Show and Rodeo in Denver, Jan. 7-22. The downhill features a dual slalom race and a winner-take-all stampede race.

▶ World champs win inaugural team roping in Fort Worth.

2005 World Champion team ropers Clay Tryan and Patrick Smith won the inaugural team roping title at the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show in Fort Worth, Texas.

Tryan, of Billings, Mont., and Smith, of Midland, Texas, roped two steers in 9.9 seconds to win the average and a check worth \$6,324. They tied for fourth in the first round with a run totaling 5.2 seconds and returned for the second round to post a 4.7-second run, good for third place.

In 2005, the PRCA Board of Directors voted to make team roping a standard event at all PRCA sanctioned rodeos.

This was the first year for Fort Worth to have team roping, and it was held prior to the start of the regular rodeo in Terrell, Texas. The actual rodeo begins on Jan. 20 and will end on Feb. 5.

round win and the average title in the steer wrestling after stopping the clock in 3.9 seconds in the final round. That, combined with his 4.6-second winning run in the first round and a 5.7 in the second round, gave him a total of 14.2 seconds on three head and a check worth \$7,244. Van Campen, of Granada, Colo., finished nearly two seconds ahead of the rest of the field. K.C. Jones and Jason Miller tied for second with a total time of 16.1 seconds. Van Campen was aboard his stellar horse Caesar, which finished third in the PRCA/AQHA Horse of the Year voting in 2005 and the horse that steer wrestlers Garrett Nokes and Ryan Jarrett rode at the 2005 Wrangler NFR.

"He is a solid horse, and it doesn't matter what situation you are in, he can put you in a winning position," said Van Campen of his 19-year-old horse. "This was a big win for me and a great way to start the year."

It has been a roller-coaster month for team roper Kory Koontz. Koontz, of Sudan, Texas, was in the hunt for a world title in December when his partner, Jake Barnes, suffered a devastating injury in the fifth round of the Wrangler NFR. Koontz stayed strong and finished the 2005 Wrangler NFR with Trevor Brazile.

Now, fast-forward three weeks to the Wrangler Tour round in Odessa. Koontz was partnered with David Key of Caldwell, Texas, and they stopped the clock in 5.5 seconds to win the round. That winning run also gave them a total time of 17.4 seconds on three head and a second-place finish in the average race. They each picked up \$3,944.

Travis Tryan and Allen Bach finished atop the leaderboard in the average race with a total of 16.2 seconds on three head. Tryan, of Billings, Mont., and Bach, of Weatherford, Texas, finished second in the first round with a 4.6-second run, finished out of the money in the second round and was fourth in the Tour round with a time of 6.3 seconds. They pocketed \$5,755 to get their season rolling.

South Dakota is known for great saddle bronc riders, and Chad Ferley is looking to add his name to the list of world champions that includes his traveling partner and reigning World Champion Jeffery Willert. Ferley, of Oelrichs, got his 2006 season off on a high note by winning the average title with 166 points on two head, edging six-time world champion Dan Mortensen, who finished with 164 points.

For Ferley, it was a sense of redemption in Odessa after breaking his leg in 2005, and injury that kept him sidelined for most of the year. This year, he had a different outcome and walked away with the title and \$7,680. Mortensen, of Billings, Mont., won the Tour round with an 85-point ride aboard Vold Rodeo's Elvis.

It was the Monty show in the tie-down roping in Odessa. 2004 world champion Monty Lewis of Hereford, Texas, stopped the clock in 9.0 seconds to win the Tour round. Monty Eakin of Slaton, Texas, finished second to Lewis in the Tour round with a 9.1, but captured the average title with a total time of 28.3 seconds on three head. Eakin collected a check totaling \$4,176 to jumpstart his 2006 campaign.

Barrel racer Layna Kight of Summerfield, Fla., stopped the clock in 14.01 seconds to win the Tour round, with Sabrina Ketcham of Yeso, N.M., finishing second with a 14.14-second run. However, Ketcham picked up the average title with 42.62 seconds on three runs, while Kight was second with a 42.66-second total. Ketcham won \$6,944, while Kight left town with \$7,136.

Bull rider Dusty Higgins, who is originally from New Mexico but now calls Midland, Texas, home, finished atop the leaderboard in the Tour round and the average. Higgins rode Triple V Rodeo's Tin Man for 81 points to win the Tour round and finish with 160 points on two head. He won a total of \$5,040.

J. Paul Williams of Burbank, Okla. captured the steer roping title in Odessa with a total time of 52.6 seconds on four head. He won a total of \$4,493.

Busy weekend for circuit cowboys with three Dodge Circuit Finals

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. -- It was a busy weekend for circuit cowboys from coast to coast. Three circuits, Montana, California and First Frontier, crowned their circuit champions over the weekend and added to the list of those who have qualified for the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo in Pocatello, Idaho, March 15-18.

Bareback rider Andy Bolich and saddle bronc rider Shaun Stroh punched their tickets to Pocatello after winning average titles in their respective events at the Dodge Montana Circuit Finals in Great Falls.

Bolich, of Belgrade, Mont., rode three horses for a total of 239 points. A member of the U.S. Army Team, he won the second round with an 83-point score on Kesler Rodeo's Sky Reach. He was second in the first round with an 81 and tied for second in the third round with a 75.

Stroh, of Glendive, Mont., added another win to his resume after totaling 249 points on three head. A two-time Wrangler NFR qualifier, Stroh won the first round with an 84 and tied for first in the second and third rounds with scores of 80 and 85, respectively.

Joining Bolich and Stroh as average champions at the DNCFR representing the Montana Circuit will be: Dan Yates, Red Lodge, Mont., steer wrestling, 17.9 seconds on three head; Derrick Fleming, Dillon, Mont./Kory Mytty, Lolo, Mont., team roping, 18.7 seconds on three head; Ryan Siemsen, Huntley, Mont., tie-down roping, 33.8 seconds on three head; Mercede Knudson, Bozeman, Mont., barrel racing, 40.49 seconds on three runs; Beau Hill, Columbia Falls, Mont., bull riding, 248 points on three head.

Steer wrestler Levi Rosser and barrel racer Linda Vick were among the big winners at the Dodge California Circuit Finals in Norco over the weekend.

Rosser, of Wheatland, Calif., comes from a large rodeo family that includes his grandfather, PRCA stock contractor Cotton Rosser, and his father, Lee Rosser, who is also a PRCA stock contractor. He won the average title in the steer wrestling with a total time of 15.2 seconds on three head. He won the third round with a time of 4.2 seconds and was second in the third round with a 4.6-second run.

Levi was diagnosed with stage 3 cancer in the spring

of 2002. The cancer is now in remission after undergoing chemotherapy.

Vick, of Hesperia, Calif., made a name for herself in 2005 after she qualified for her first Wrangler NFR and finished second in the world. She punched her ticket to Pocatello after turning in three clean runs for a total time of 52.57 seconds.

Joining Rosser and Vick from the California circuit will be: Tyson Thompson, Templeton, Calif., bareback riding, 248 points on three head; Daniel Green, Oakdale, Calif./Todd Hampton, Chowchilla, Calif., team roping, 17.9 seconds on three head; David Howard, Fallon, Nev., saddle bronc riding, 240 points on three head; J.D. Miller, Creston, Calif., tie-down roping, 30.1 seconds on three head; and Ted Bert, Modesto, Calif., bull riding, 240 points on three head.

Bareback rider Luis Escudero, tie-down roper Carmine Natri and barrel racer Lynne Winkers all earned trips to the DNCFR after winning their respective average titles at the Dodge First Frontier Circuit Finals in Harrisburg, Pa.

Escudero, of El Paso, Texas, picked up the average title with 225 points on three head. His highest score of 85 came in the third round, giving him the round win. He finished fourth in the first round with a 74 and third place in the second round with a 73.

Natri, of Ballston Spa, N.Y., will make the trip once again to Pocatello as the tie-down roping average champion from the First Frontier Circuit. He roped and tied three calves in 35.6 seconds to win the title. He won the first round with an 11.1-second run and was second in the second round with an 11.0.

Winkers, of Woodstown, N.J., will make her second consecutive trip to Pocatello after winning the average in the barrel racing. She finished with a total of 44.03 seconds on three runs to earn her spot in the prestigious event.

Rounding out the list of First Frontier average winners are: Wayne Stoltzfus, McClure, Pa., steer wrestling, 13.7 seconds on three head; Keith Brown, Keedysville, Md./Kenny Brown, Keedysville, Md., 42.7 seconds on three head; Tim Sloan, Whitehall, Mont., saddle bronc riding, 149 points on two head; and John Constantinople, Prospect, Conn., bull riding, 158 points on two head.
