ProRodeo's best atop the leaderboard at the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - For the sixth time in seven years, the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour's winter series makes a visit to the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, winner of the 2005 PRCA Large Indoor Rodeo Committee of the Year.

The rodeo, which got underway on Feb. 4, has already seen many of rodeo's top athletes. Among those who currently sit atop the U.S. Smokeless Tobacco Company scoreboard are Texas Tech Red Raider Ryan Gray in bareback riding, Oklahoma's Ronnie Fields in steer wrestling, Billy Etbauer in saddle bronc riding, Idaho's Matt Shiozawa in tie-down roping and Utah's Wesley Silcox in bull riding.

Gray, of Cheney, Wash., leads the field of bareback riders with 249 points on three head and is currently first in the third round with an 88-point ride on Bar T Rodeo's Goldilocks. Fields, of Oklahoma City, leads the field of steer wrestlers by two and a half seconds. Fields holds the lead with a total time of 13.7 seconds on three, while Wade Sumpter of Fowler, Colo., is second with a time of 16.2 seconds.

Five-time world champion Etbauer, of Edmond, currently holds first place in the first round, is tied for the lead in the second round and leads the average with 251 points on three head. He posted an 89-point ride on Bar T Rodeo's Fire Fly in the first round and finished with an 83 aboard Cervi Championship's Big Sky in the second round. Rusty Allen of Lehi, Utah, also posted an 85 in the second round aboard Bar T Rodeo's Buckskin Bill. Allen is second to Etbauer in the average standings with 249.

Shiozawa, of Chubbuck, is the overall leader in the tie-down roping with 29.8 seconds on three head. 2004 World Champion Monty Lewis of Hereford, Texas, is a close second with a time of 29.9.

Bull rider Wesley Silcox, of Payson, competed at this first Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in 2005 and is on a mission to return in 2006. Silcox currently leads the field of bull riders in San Antonio with 251 points three head. Silcox and Jarrod Craig of Hillsboro, Texas, are the only two that have

Ford looks to go two-for-two at Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour stop in San Antonio

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Bull riding fans in San Antonio will get a second helping on Monday, Feb. 13, with the second stop of the 2006 Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour. The tour got under way in San Antonio on Friday, Feb. 3 with the top 40 bull riders battling it out atop 2,000 pound beasts for eight-seconds at a time.

Colorado's Jarrod Ford took home the first Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour title in San Antonio on Feb. 3 after scoring 177 points on two head. The 25-year-old from Greeley stuck an event-best 93-point ride on Andrews Rodeo's Fender Bender to win the final round and finish a single point ahead of veteran Myron Duarte for the average title. Ford picked up a check worth \$12,943.

Ford will look to go two-for-two in San Antonio but will face some stiff competition,

including his traveling partner and 2004 World Champion Dustin Elliott, reigning world champion Matt Austin and 2005 PRCA Resistol Rookie of the Year Steve Woolsey.

B.J. Schumacher of Hillsboro, Wis., returns to the arena after being sidelined with a broken collarbone sustained prior to the 2005 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo. Schumacher was successful on his first bull back, posting an 89-point ride on Powder River Rodeo's Mudslinger on Thursday, Feb. 9, during the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo. Schumacher is currently in a tie for first in the first round of bull riding for the annual rodeo, which concludes on Feb. 19.

The Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour is considered a separate stand-alone event from the PRCA rodeo. Action begins at 7:30 p.m. at the AT&T Center.

- ▶ **57th annual Pony Express Ride.** The Harris County Sheriff's Mounted Patrol 57th annual Pony Express ride, consisting of 40 horses and riders primarily from local law enforcement mounted patrol agencies, set-out on Sunday, Feb. 12 from the Hockley (Texas) Auction Barn on Old Highway 290 on their way to Austin, the State Capital of Texas.

The objective for the annual ride, which is done in relay fashion, is to deliver official invitations to the 2006 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo to state officials. The ride concluded on the south steps of the Texas Capitol, Monday, Feb. 13 at noon, and invitations were delivered to the governor and lieutenant governor of Texas. The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo runs from Feb. 28-March 19.

- ▶ **Bull riding DVDs available.** ProRodeo Films, the official video and distribution and licensing company of the PRCA, has produced two bull riding DVDs that will be distributed by TimeLife Video. The DVDs, *Ultimate Bull Riding* and *Extreme Wrecks*, will be sold primarily in Wal-Mart stores across the country, and the Wal-Mart in San Antonio near the AT&T Center kicked off the release of the DVDs on Feb. 12. World champion bull riders Terry Don West, Tuff Hedeman and Cody Hancock signed autographs at the location as part of the in-store promotion.

- ▶ **Barnes returns to competition.** Seven-time world champion team roper Jake Barnes, who severed his right thumb at the joint during the fifth round of the Wrangler NFR on Dec. 6, returned to competition at the Yuma (Ariz.) Jaycees Silver Spur Rodeo over the weekend.

Barnes, of Scottsdale, Ariz., roped with Brock Hanson of Montrose, Colo., and finished second in the first round with a time of 6.8 seconds. They finished out of the money in the second round with a 12.9-second run but finished fourth in the average with a total time of 19.7 seconds on two head. Barnes and Hanson won \$676 each.

- ▶ **McSpadden scholarship created.** A scholarship named for ProRodeo Hall of Famer Clem McSpadden has been created at Oklahoma State University.

McSpadden was named a Graduate of Distinction from OSU and received an Oklahoma State University Hall of Fame award. McSpadden helped organize the Oklahoma (A&M) rodeo team. He graduated from OSU with a degree in Animal Science.

He previously served as general manager of the National Finals Rodeo and on the RCA Board of Directors, and has been one of the PRCA's top announcers for many years. McSpadden was an Oklahoma state senator for 18 years. He and his wife, Donna, currently maintain ranching interests in the Bushyhead and Chelsea communities of Oklahoma.

Recipients of the McSpadden Endowed Scholarship will be selected by a committee, appointed by the Head of the Department of Animal Science, and McSpadden will serve on the committee.

Scholarship recipients must be enrolled as a full-time student within the Department of Animal Science at OSU and must have a grade point average of 2.5 or better.

made the eight second whistle in all three rounds. Craig has posted a total score of 242.

Team ropers Tyler Magnus and Travis Graves are tied with Dugan Kelly and Clayton Grant with total times of 17.4 seconds on three head. Barrel racer Terra Bynum leads the field with a total time of 44.25 seconds on three runs.

Competition continues at the AT&T Center through Saturday, Feb. 18. The top 12 in each event will qualify for the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round slated for Sunday, Feb. 19 at 2 p.m. CT.

Contestants will be battling it out for key Wrangler Tour points in their efforts to qualify for the \$350,000 Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out, May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla.

Williams and O'Brien Cooper pick up first 2006 season victory in Belton

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Eight-time world champion Speed Williams and seven-time world champion Clay O'Brien Cooper have teamed together for the 2006 rodeo season. They picked up their first rodeo title at the Bell County Youth Fair & Livestock Show & PRCA Rodeo in Belton, Texas.

Williams, of Llano, Texas, and O'Brien Cooper, of Morgan Mill, Texas, turned in a 5.0-second run to take the title. They each collected \$1,776. Earlier this year, they won the second round at the National Western Stock Show & Rodeo in Denver with a time of 4.2 seconds.

The magic number was 88 in bull riding in Belton over the weekend. Chad Besplug and Myron Duarte posted scores of 88 points aboard Bad Company Rodeo's Satan's Own and Start Me Up, respectively. Besplug, originally from Canada, but currently attending Odessa College in Odessa, Texas, is on a mission to qualify for his first Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in December. Duarte, of Auburn, Wash., is proving that age is not a factor. The 38-year-old recently finished second at the first Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour stop in San Antonio, Texas, and is looking for his ninth Wrangler NFR qualification.

Besplug and Duarte both picked up a check totaling \$1,813 and are ranked 10th and sixth, respectively in the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings.

Each regular Tour rodeo is one of the top rodeos in the country and contestants earn Tour points based on his/her performance at each Tour stop. Fans can catch all the Tour action on Fox Sports Network (FSN) for the first time in history. Each stop will be televised on FSN within 10 days of the event. Check local listings for times in your area, or log onto www.prorodeo.com or www.prorodeotour.com for the latest TV listings.

The San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo follows the Wrangler Tour's first three stops in Odessa, Texas, Denver and Rapid City, S.D. The Tour resumes Feb. 25 at the San Angelo (Texas) Stock Show and Rodeo and continues the next day with the Tour round of La Fiesta de los Vaqueros in Tucson, Ariz.

Joining Besplug in the winner's circle was fellow Canadian Marty Becker. Becker, of Cardston, Alberta, turned in a time of 7.6 seconds to take home the tie-down roping title in Belton. Becker pocketed a check worth \$1,336.

Barrel racer Shali Lord finished in a tie with Edi Williams with times of 15.24 seconds. Lord, of Lamar, Colo., competed at her first Wrangler NFR in 2005 and finished third in the world standings. Lord and Williams, who hails from Wellington, Texas, won \$1,868 each.

Three-time all-around champion Trevor Brazile picked up the all-around title and a share of the steer roping title in Belton. Brazile, of Decatur, Texas, finished in a tie with J.R. Olson for the steer roping title with a total time of 34.4 seconds on three head. He won a total of \$3,502 in the steer roping and picked up an additional \$645 in the tie-down roping after finishing fourth with a time of 9.0 seconds. Olson, of Sheridan, Wyo., won \$4,055 for his steer roping victory.

Other winners included Buddy Gulley, Malakoff, Texas, bareback riding, 80 points on Bad Company Rodeo's No Satisfaction, \$1,030; Nick Stubblefield, Helena, Mont., steer wrestling, 3.5 seconds, \$1,143; and Tyler Corrington, Hastings, Minn., saddle bronc riding, 77 points on Bad Company's Vogue, \$1,045.

PRCA to Relocate Headquarters, Hall of Fame to Albuquerque

SANTA FE, N.M. - Governor Bill Richardson announced that the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association, the largest and oldest rodeo sanctioning body in the world, has chosen Albuquerque as the location for its new headquarters and ProRodeo Hall of Fame facility. This move will bring 85 full-time jobs, a \$3.35 million payroll and approximately 50,000 annual Hall of Fame visitors to Albuquerque.

"This announcement is a win for the entire state of New Mexico," Governor Richardson said. "This move will have a major positive impact, not just on rodeo in New Mexico, but on New Mexico's economy as well."

"The move to New Mexico is a very exciting development for the sport of ProRodeo," stated Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association Commissioner Troy Ellerman. "The PRCA Board of Directors and administration sees this as more than an attractive financial offer. It's also a great opportunity to grow the ProRodeo brand, and elevate professional rodeo to the level of other major league sports."

ProRodeo is a multimillion-dollar industry that will have a major positive impact on New Mexico's economy. As part of the agreement, the PRCA has agreed to both bring major rodeo events to New Mexico and promote the state at their out-of-state events. In 2005, 24 million spectators purchased tickets to PRCA events, PRCA rodeos paid out over \$35 million in prize money and contributed in excess of \$25 million to charitable causes and scholarships.

The exact details of the agreement to move the PRCA to New Mexico are still being finalized. This includes the exact location of the headquarters and ProRodeo Hall of Fame in Albuquerque. However, the package will include state funding assistance to help finance the construction of a new facility within the next 18 months, and \$5 million to promote the sport of ProRodeo. The package will include a public/private partnership.

"For generations, rodeo has been an important part of our culture," said Governor Richardson. "This announcement will ensure that rodeo remains a vital and exciting part of New Mexico's future as well."

This announcement builds upon the efforts the Richardson Administration has already made to grow rodeo in New Mexico. These include the \$3 million the Governor has pledged to improve rodeo facilities at local fairgrounds across the state, \$700,000 in funding to support 4-H rodeo programs, junior high and high school rodeo programs, as well as college scholarships and open rodeo programs. Governor Richardson has also announced that this year will also see New Mexico's first-ever Collegiate Rodeo Finals, an annual event that will allow New Mexico's five higher-education institutions with rodeo programs to face off for the state rodeo title.

Last year, Governor Richardson created the New Mexico Rodeo Council, and he supports building the new equestrian facility that was recommended to him by the Council. The Governor has asked the Rodeo Council to identify a location for this facility that will best suit the needs of the most New Mexicans.

"This is not part of the deal, but it seems to make sense to locate this equestrian facility within easy access of the PRCA's world-class operation in Albuquerque," said Governor Richardson.
