Rodeo Austin ready for another stellar event

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Rodeo fans and athletes are just days away from the 69th annual rodeo extravaganza Rodeo Austin, March 11-25, at the Travis County Expo Center. Rodeo Austin is the seventh stop on the 12-stop Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour, which will wrap up in May with the Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days.

Cowboys and cowgirls alike are waiting to pocket a portion of the more than \$230,000 available at this year's event. Rodeo Austin paid out \$236,000 last year, making it the 17th highest paying PRCA rodeo for 2005.

The top 12 contestants in each event on the ProRodeo Tour at the end of the 12 events will compete at the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out in Tulsa, Okla., May 13-14.

Coming back to do battle for a third average bareback riding title at Rodeo Austin is Colorado's Royce Ford. Last year, he had a dynamic career-best 92-point ride on Bennie Buetler's horse Zinger, which was sired by Buetler's well-known horse Commotion.

Zinger, 7, has been a part of the

Wrangler NFR eliminator pen and has been voted as one of the rankest horses in competition.

Defending saddle bronc riding champion, Cody DeMoss of Crowville, La., stuck an 87-point ride in the semifinals last year on Buetler's standout bronc Secret Agent. DeMoss is leading in the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings and will no doubt work hard to keep his lead through Rodeo Austin.

Brittany Pozzi of Victoria, Texas, made a great showing at the 2005 Wrangler NFR, and she is in the top 20 in the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings. She will be working to beat out as many as 75 other barrel racers in her title defense at Rodeo Austin.

The PRCA Xtreme Bulls will be bucking fans out of the stands with a Division II event with one performance on March 11 at 7 p.m.

Adding to the rodeo thrills and spills will be more than 5,000 junior livestock participants, a chuckwagon cookoff, which was started in 1985 and continues to grow strong, a carnival and commercial exhibits.

Wrangler Timed Event Championship is decided by first tie-breaker

GUTHRIE, Okla. - At one of the classic Wrangler Timed Event Championship events in history, Trevor Brazile proved why he is considered the current "King of the Cowboys" during the 2006 event held at the Lazy E Arena.

In the event's 21-year history, no competition had ever ended in a tie for first place. That is exactly what happened during the Lucchese Boots Final Round when three-time WTEC Champion Brazile from Decatur, Texas, and four-time WTEC Champion K.C. Jones from Hawk Springs, Wyo., tied with 337.3 seconds after com-

peting on twenty-five head of livestock over three grueling days of competition. The result was overtime.

If a tie should occur, the rules state that the two cowboys would "match" each other in a five-head competition and compete on each others' cattle from the fifth round. After the stunned crowd settled, Brazile and Jones, two WTEC titans matched each other, with Brazile ending up the champion with a time of 50.5 seconds compared to Jones' 75.4.

"This is probably the most spe-

▶ Winnercomm sold for \$90 million.

Winnercomm, the Tulsa, Okla.-based production company that holds the licensing and marketing rights to the Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour and manages espn.com's ProRodeo pages, has been sold to a group of private investors for \$90 million, according to the Street & Smith's SportsBusiness Journal.

Parallel Investment Partners from Dallas and Harbert Management of Birmingham, Ala., will assume majority ownership of the company, with Winnercomm CEO Jim Wilburn and his brother, John, maintaining a sizeable part of the ownership. Winnercomm, which produces more than 1,500 hours of sports television each year, is ESPN's largest outside source of programming.

"It means accelerated growth," Jim Wilburn told the SBJ regarding the sale. "For the last 25 years and especially the last 10 years, all our growth has been organic. We've hired people and serviced areas as the demand dictated. Now, we're going to be much more aggressive as it relates to acquisitions of smaller companies."

Wilburn told the SBJ that, under the new agreement, the new ownership will be in the background, and the company's current management team will stay in place. Wilburn began the company in 1981.

▶ Sproul, de la Cruz win Mike Cervi Jr. roping event.

Team ropers Shane Sproul and Cesar de la Cruz won the average title at the 2006 Mike Cervi Jr. Memorial Team Roping on Feb. 22, pocketing \$17,220 each. Chad Masters and York Gill, who each won \$12,915, finished second in the event, which is held in honor of roper Mike Cervi Jr., who died in a plane crash in 2001.

The annual jackpot team roping has been held during the La Fiesta de los Vaqueros rodeo week since the early 1980s. Previously named the Aros Roping Classic and the Tubac Championship Roping, Tucson, Ariz., roper George Aros agreed to change the name and

cial," said Brazile when asked about his other titles. "The way it happened, I could not have written it any better."

The win secured many new WTEC records for Brazile. He now holds the records for the most money won at a WTEC competition (\$72,000), the highest career WTEC earnings to date (\$398,500), the newest member of the Four-Time Champion Fraternity (which includes Jones and Paul Tierney from Oral, S.D.), broke his own arena record set last year for the fastest go-round (43.5 on five head) for a \$3,000 bonus and became the only winner of a WTEC tie-breaker (defeated Jones for the Championship).

Brazile, who has won three Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association All-Around World Championships, won his first WTEC title in 1998, then finally found his groove again during the three-day runs in 2003 and 2004. Jones and Brazile seemed to be a good fit, given the fact that Brazile is the first cowboy in ProRodeo history to qualify for the National Finals Rodeo in each of the four roping disciplines—steer roping, tie-down roping, team heading and heeling.

At last year's WNFR, Brazile was the front-runner going into the all-around race only to be upset by Ryan Jarrett from Summerville, Ga., this past December in Las Vegas. Jarrett competed for the first time at this year's WTEC and finished in a respectable eighth position, earning \$3,000.

"Iron-Man" competition had many story lines. Perennial WNFR qualifier Cash Myers from Athens, Texas, jumped out to the early lead in the competition. But a few slips in the third round cost Myers the lead and eventually the title. Those slips provided the opening for past WTEC champions which included Tierney, Jimmie Cooper of Monument, N.M., Jones and last year's champion Kyle Lockett from Ivanhoe, Calif., to emerge as front-runners during the marathon-type event.

After taking a no-time with a 60-second penalty in the first run of the event, Brazile quietly won three rounds and pulled himself back into the competition. Brazile battled his way back to take a 30-second lead going into the steer wrestling event during the final performance.

"I never wanted to take a sixty right off the bat, but looking back it was a blessing in disguise. It enabled me to go a little harder at the rounds," Brazile said.

In the steer wrestling event, the only event that Brazile does not compete in full-time, he missed his steer on his first try. Brazile remounted his horse and gave chase, eventually throwing the animal in 43.0 seconds. The lead was gone. Jones held on during his steer roping run to put the pressure back on Brazile. Brazile backed into the box needing a 15.0-second run to win the event.

The result was a 15.1 and a tie with Jones after 25 head. After the tie-breaker match, Jones

would take home a hefty second-place paycheck of \$25,000, Tierney finished third worth \$15,000 and Lockett would place fourth for \$10,000.

"You always think about what you could have done different," Jones said. "You just hope to learn from your mistakes and come back a little more ready next year."

In another aspect of the WTEC, the fastest rounds are paid for the entire event. Brazile collected another \$19,000 (First, Second and Fifth) for his efforts in combination with his bonus for a grand total of \$72,000. A complete detail of the WTEC results can be found on the final page of this release or at www.lazye.com/arena.

The top 20 timed event cowboys in the world were invited to compete at the 22nd annual event held at the fabulous Lazy E Arena. The WTEC is considered as one of pro rodeo's most unique events and is a true test of versatility and stamina. Each contestant is required to compete in all five timed events: tie-down roping, steer roping, team roping heading and heeling and steer wrestling.

The event was developed by the Lazy E in 1985 to determine the best all-around timed event cowboy in the world. Today's professional rodeo cowboys no longer compete in multiple events, but specialize in one possibly two. This event attracts the biggest names in the rodeo industry that represent 28 World Championship titles, in addition to thousands of fans from across the country.

The Wrangler Timed Event Championship is sponsored by Wrangler in conjunction with Pepsi Cola, Lucchese Boots, Bud Light, Jack Daniels, Priefert Manufacturing, Hot Heels, U.S. Smokeless Tobacco, News 9, and the Holiday Inn Hotels and Suites.

focus of the roping in 2003 when Cervi's widow, two-time world champion barrel racer Sherry Cervi, expressed interest in establishing an event in her husband's honor.

Contestants in the Tucson rodeo typically enter the non-sanctioned team roping event. Proceeds from admission to the event - \$10,000 this year - benefit the Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund.

Cervi Jr. joined the PRCA in 1994. His best year was 1999, when he finished 16th in the world standings, just missing the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo. He was killed in September of 2001 in a private plane crash in Marshfield, Wis., at the age of 30.
