## Contestants set to do battle at the 20th annual Dodge National Circuit Finals

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - ProRodeo's best circuit cowboys will converge on the small town of Pocatello, Idaho, this week for the 20th annual Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo. A total of 192 contestants will make the trek to Pocatello for a share of the \$400,000 purse, a brand new Dodge truck and DNCFR title.

The DNCFR is the crowning event of the PRCA's circuit system of regional competition. National circuit champions are determined in an elimination-style event which has taken place each March in Pocatello since its inception in 1987.

The DNCFR operates under a tournament style system. Contestants compete in two preliminary rounds starting Wednesday, March 15 at 7 p.m. at Holt Arena on the campus of Idaho State University. The top eight contestants in each event advance to the semifinals slated for Saturday, March 18 at 7 p.m. After completion of the semifinals, the top four contestants in each event advance to the final round, known as the Wrangler Round, where the national titles are decided.

Rowdy Buechner of Sandpoint, Idaho, qualified for his first DNCFR after winning the year-end and average bareback riding titles in the Columbia River Circuit. Buechner, 25, competed at his first Wrangler NFR in 2005 and

finished the year ranked seventh in the world with \$125,681.

Buechner began riding when he was 4 years old and got involved in rodeo through his family. His father didn't want him competing in other sports because he was afraid he might get hurt and not be able to compete in rodeo. He got his name Rowdy, because his mother liked the name and his father thought it was a good rodeo name.

2002 world champion Bobby Mote will join Buechner in representing the Columbia River Circuit in the bareback riding. Mote, of Culver, Ore., will be looking for his first DNCFR title.

2003 DNCFR bareback riding champion Tom McFarland will be looking to add another DNCFR title to his impressive resume. McFarland, of Wickenburg, Ariz., will represent the Turquoise Circuit.

Craig Cavaness leads a strong field of steer wrestlers that includes Wrangler NFR qualifier Stockton Graves, cancer survivor Levi Rosser and two-event standout Clint Robinson.

Cavaness, of Brenham, Texas, qualified for the 2006 DNCFR after winning the average title at the Texas Circuit Finals, marking his third trip to Pocatello. A true circuit cowboy,

## Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour heads into downhill stretch

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - With six Tour stops in the books for the 2006 season, Rodeo Austin could be a turning point for some contestants with just six stops remaining in the Winter Tour.

The 69th annual Rodeo Austin got underway over the weekend and comes to a close on Saturday, March 25 at the Travis County Expo Center. Rodeo Austin is the seventh stop on the 12-stop Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour, which will wrap up on May 7 with the Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days.

Cowboys and cowgirls alike are waiting to pocket a portion of the more than \$230,000 available at this year's event and earn some valuable Wrangler ProRodeo Tour points.

The top 12 contestants in each event on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour at the end of the 12 events will compete at the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out in Tulsa, Okla., May 13-14, where a \$350,000 purse is up for grabs.

The remaining stops on the Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour include Laughlin (Nev.) River Stampede, April 2; Clark County Fair & Rodeo, Logandale, Nev., April 9; Red Bluff (Calif.) Round-up, April 23; Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo, April 30; Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days Rodeo, May 7.

The Jim Shoulders Great Western Weekend will open on Friday, May 12, at 8 p.m. with an *Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour* event and continues Saturday and Sunday with the Pace Chute-out.

Cavaness spends most of his time working as a firefighter in the Houston. His uncle was a full time firefighter and he served as Cavaness' inspiration to become a firefighter.

Graves, of Newkirk, Okla., qualified for his second Wrangler NFR in 2005 and finished the year ranked seventh in the world. Graves will represent the Prairie Circuit after winning the year-end circuit title.

Before March 22, 2002, a broken barrier was the difference between failure and success in the rodeo arena for Rosser. Now it's just a broken piece of string that needs to be picked up.

Four years ago, Rosser, of Gridley, Calif., was home on spring break from college and went to the doctor because he hadn't been feeling well. That afternoon the doctor informed him that he had stage 3 cancer and he underwent surgery immediately. The cancer had already spread to his lymph nodes and lungs, prompting the quick decision for surgery. Because of the early diagnosis, doctors told him had a 98-percent chance of survival.

Following surgery, Rosser's mother, Bonnie, did some internet research for a chemotherapy doctor. The name she found was Dr. Craig Nichols of the Oregon Health and Sciences University staff. Dr. Nichols had several great credentials including serving as seven-time Tour de France champion Lance Armstrong's doctor. The Rosser's scheduled an appointment with Dr. Nichols and began treatment immediately. Upon completion of his treatment, Rosser was given a clean bill of health and has been cancer-free ever since.

Rosser, who comes from a large rodeo family, will compete at his second DNCFR in Pocatello, Idaho. He is the grandson of PRCA Stock Contractor and PRCA Board of Directors member Cotton Rosser, who runs the Flying U Rodeo Company, and the son of Lee Rosser, who runs the Rosser Rodeo Company. For Levi, the DNCFR is the largest rodeo he has competed in and an event title would be his greatest rodeo accomplishment.

Robinson, of Spanish Fork, Utah, will be making his second consecutive trip to the DNCFR after winning the average title at the Wilderness Circuit Finals.

Robinson's father, Lance, was an accomplished tie-down roper, steer wrestler and team roper in the PRCA. He qualified for the Wrangler NFR nine times (1982-84, 1987-88 in steer wrestling and 1980, 1984-86 in tie-down roping) and finished as the all-around runner-up in 1987.

In 2005, Robinson finished 12th in the all-around world standings with \$72,557, was 32nd in the steer wrestling with \$30,285 and finished 30th in the tie-down roping with \$31,817.

Robinson will be in Pocatello with his traveling partner Nate Baldwin, who will be competing in the tie-down roping.

Baldwin of nearby Rigby, Idaho, will be looking to recapture his title at the DNCFR this weekend. Baldwin used the hometown

crowd in 2004 to secure his first DNCFR tie-down roping title. He qualified for this year's DNCFR after winning the year-end title in the Wilderness Circuit.

Baldwin finished the 2005 season ranked 17th in the world with \$58,795. This will mark Baldwin's fifth trip to the DNCFR, which he grew up watching.

No contestant has made the trip to Pocatello more times than tie-down roper Bill Huber of Albia, Iowa. Huber will compete in his 19th DNCFR this week representing the Great Lakes Circuit. The only DNCFR he missed was in 2004, when Troy Amoss and Chip Porterfield represented the Great Lakes Circuit.

In 2002, Huber won the tie-down roping title after qualifying for the prestigious event 16 consecutive years. In fact, he not only won the title, but did so with an arena-record run. Huber set the arena record at 7.4 seconds to capture his first and only title. His record still stands today.

Barrel racer Shelly Anzick of Livingston, Mont., dominated the 2005 DNCFR en route to her first title. Anzick is back this year to defend her title, but will face some stiff competition in Barbra West of Oak Harbor, Wash., Delores Toole of Manter, Kan., and Sheri Sinor Estrada of Alamogordo, N.M.

The bull riding field will be lead by Beau Hill of West Glacier, Mont., and Jarrod Ford of Greeley, Colo.

Hill qualified for this year's DNCFR after winning the year-end and average titles in the Montana Circuit. At the 2004 Wrangler NFR, he tore the tendon in his wrist in half and was forced to have it removed. With the injury, he was out of commission until April of 2005. When he started riding again, he tore his groin muscle and had to stop again. In August, he got healthy and went on to qualify for the circuit finals.

Ford earned his trip to the DNCFR after winning the year-end title in the Mountain States Circuit. Ford, 25, qualified for his first Wrangler NFR in 2005 and finished seventh in the world with \$148,724.

Ford comes from a long line of rodeo greats. His father, Glen, qualified for the Wrangler NFR in 1976. His uncle, Bruce, is a five-time world champion bareback rider and has been inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. His brother, Heath, is a top ranked bareback rider, while cousin, Royce, has qualified for the Wrangler NFR the past three years. Ford travels with 2004 DNCFR and world champion bull rider Dustin Elliott.

The 2006 DNCFR gets underway on Wednesday night with half the field competing in the first round followed by the second half on Thursday. Second round competition will begin on Friday night. DNCFR champions will be crowned on Saturday night.

# Southeastern Livestock Expo Rodeo comes to a close in Montgomery

MONTGOMERY, Ala. - The Southeastern Livestock Expo Rodeo came to a close in Montgomery, Ala., on Saturday with some of ProRodeo's best atop the leaderboard.

In bareback riding there was a three-way tie for first place with Jason Havens, Matt Mosher and Matt Bright all turning in 84-point rides. Havens, of Redmond, Ore., was matched with Carr Rodeo's Black Coffee, while Mosher, of Wildhorse, Colo., recorded his 84 atop Stace Smith ProRodeo's Fire Wood. Bright, of Martin, Tenn., posted his winning ride on Carr Rodeo's River Boat Annie. They each pocketed \$2,177.

The saddle bronc riding ended in a tie as well, with Ira Slagowski and Jeremy Meeks each posting 82-point rides. Slagowski, of Carlin, Nev., rode Carr Rodeo's Teddy Bear, while Meeks, of Batesland, S.D., recorded his winning ride on Carr Rodeo's Ginger Snap. Each took home a check worth \$2,641.

Texas bull rider Chad Eubank turned in an 87-point ride on Stace Smith ProRodeo's Barbed Wire to finish atop the leaderboard in Montgomery. Eubank, of Cleburne, won a check for \$2,797 for his eight-second ride.

Taw Avery of Zachary, La., used the Southeastern Livestock Expo Rodeo as a warm-up for this week's Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo in Pocatello, Idaho. Avery won the average title in the steer wrestling with a total time of 8.3 seconds on two head, edging Clint Robinson and Casey Martin by one-tenth of a second. Avery finished third in the second round with a run of 3.8 seconds boosting his earnings total in Montgomery to \$3,162.

Avery and Robinson will face each other again at the DNCFR as they represent the Southeastern and Wilderness Circuits, respectively.

Robinson, of Spanish Fork, Utah, was a busy guy, competing in steer wrestling, tie-down roping and team roping in Montgomery. Robinson won \$2,338 in the steer wrestling and another \$2,180 in the tie-down roping after finishing in a tie for first in the second round with a time of 8.1 seconds and fourth in the average with a total time of 20.0 seconds on two head. Robinson teamed with 2005 All-Around Champion Ryan Jarrett for the team roping, picking up an additional \$736 after finishing in a tie for second in the first round with a time of 5.1 seconds.

Justin Thigpen of Waycross, Ga., smoked the tie-down roping field, winning the average in a total time of 17.0 seconds on two head. Thigpen's next closest competitor was Michael Otero of Lowndesboro, Ala., who finished in a total time of 18.8 seconds. Thigpen won \$3,741 after placing in both rounds.

Glynn Robinson and Ashlee Swedenburg captured the team roping title with a total time of 10.8 seconds on two head. Robinson, of West Point, Mo., and Swedenburg, of Reform, Ala., picked up \$1,914 each for their win.

Kim Brown finished atop the leaderboard in the barrel racing with a time of 16.32 seconds. Brown, of Middleburg, Fla., outdistanced Denise Adams Fea of Lufkin, Texas, who finished with a time of 16.52. Brown picked up a check worth \$2,344, while Adams Fea won \$1,993.
