# Rodeo Austin comes to a close Saturday

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - The 69th annual Rodeo Austin will come to a close on Saturday, March 25, at the Travis County Expo Center. Rodeo Austin will mark the seventh stop on the 12-stop Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour, which will wrap up on May 7 with the Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days.

Saddle bronc rider Cody DeMoss leads the field with 163 points on two head, with five-time world champion Billy Etbauer close on his heels with 162 points. Jesse Bail leads the bull riding with a 91-point score with reigning World Champion Matt Austin just one point behind. Bareback rider Josh Cole is in the driver's seat with 166 points on two-head.

Texas tie-down roper Cade Swor leads the pack with a total time of 18.2 seconds on two head, while Tommy Cook is atop the leaderboard in the steer wrestling with a two-head total of 8.2 seconds. Tee

Woolman and Cory Petska hold the top spot in the team roping with a two-head time of 10.7 seconds and Michelle Simms is the top barrel racer with 30.03 seconds on two runs.

There are four more performances slated before the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round on Saturday. The top 12 in the average (except for bull riding, which will be top 12 in the round) will advance to the Tour Round on Saturday night, which will be televised on Fox Sports Net. From Austin, contestants will make the trek out West for the remaining stops on the Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour which include Laughlin (Nev.) River Stampede, April 2; Clark County Fair & Rodeo, Logandale, Nev., April 9; Red Bluff (Calif.) Round-up, April 23; Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo, April 30; Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days Rodeo, May 7.

# Decison pays off for Davis, Stroh and Brazile to capture titles at RodeoHouston

HOUSTON - It might not have been an easy decision for three of ProRodeo's best, but their decision paid off.

Bareback rider Jess Davis, saddle bronc rider Shaun Stroh and three-time all-around world champion Trevor Brazile returned to Houston on Saturday from Pocatello, Idaho, where they had been competing in the 20th annual Dodge National Circuit Finals. All three qualified for the final round in Houston, as well as the semifinals at the DNCFR, and were faced with a decision to return to Houston to try and capture a title or stay in Pocatello for a chance at a DNCFR title. They all returned to Houston, and all three won their event titles. Brazile, of Decatur, Texas, had hoped to make it back to Pocatello, but bad weather kept him from returning to the DNCFR.

Davis, of Payson, Utah, won his first bareback riding title in Houston after collecting 333 points on four head. He finished seven points ahead of the rest of

the field with Andy Martinez of Pavillion, Wyo., taking second with 326 points.

Davis won the first round with an 86-point ride aboard two-time PRCA Bareback Horse of the Year Grated Coconut out of the Calgary Stampede string. He drew another Calgary horse in the second round to finish seventh with an 81 on Enemy Rocket and tied for fourth in the third round with an 83 on Brookman Rodeo's Cop Out. In the final round, Davis finished in a three-way tie for fourth with an 83 on Cervi Championship Rodeo's Multichem Hostage. Davis collected checks totaling \$16,494.

Stroh, of Glendive, Mont., finished 10 points ahead of the field with 329 points on four head to win the title. Jesse Bail of Camp Crook, S.D., was second with 319 points. Stroh stayed consistent throughout the four rounds, picking up a share of the round victory in the third round. In that round, he tied with Bobby Griswold for the

top spot with a score of 83 points on Cervi Championship's Grit Your Teeth. Prior to that ride, Stroh finished in a tie for seventh in the first round with a score of 78 points on Andrews Rodeo's Show Boy and was second in the second round with an 85 on Vold Rodeo's Multichem Hanger. The final round found Stroh in a tie for second with Bail with matching scores of 83 points. Stroh rode Cervi Championship's Multichem Rio Bravo, while Bail drew Burch Rodeo's Tokyo Massage. Stroh won a total of \$18,298, while Bail picked up \$13,095 for his efforts.

Brazile has been in a champion's zone the month of March, and he added to his total winnings for the month with his win in Houston. Brazile, who won \$72,000 at the Wrangler Timed Event Championship the first of the month, won the tie-down roping title with a total time of 37.0 seconds on four head and picked up another \$12,123.

He finished in a tie for second in the first round with Cody Ohl after stopping the clock in 8.6 seconds and tied for fifth in the second round with Brad Goodrich and Scott Kormos with an 8.7. He finished out of the money in the third round, which was won by C.R. Bradley with an 8.2-second run, but took fifth in the final round with a 9.7 to clinch the title. Tim Pharr of Resaca, Ga., was second in the average with a total time of 38.3 seconds on four head.

Brazile won the first and second rounds and the average at the DNCFR and picked up \$9,395. However, the only money that will count toward his world standings will be his money won in Houston.

2000 world champion bull rider Cody Hancock won the average title in Houston with a total of 330 points on four head. Hancock, of Taylor, Ariz., was the only cowboy to make the eight-second whistle on all four of his bulls. Hancock was second in the first round with an 87-point ride on Rafter H Rodeo's Boss Man, tied for the win in the second round with an 84 atop Rafter H Rodeo's Hillbilly, did not place in the money in the third round and finished third in the final round with an 84 on Cervi & Guidry's Final Dose. All totaled, Hancock won \$18,113. Canadian Chad Besplug, who is going to school in Odessa, Texas, finished second in the average with 245 points on three and won \$13,676.

Steer wrestler Dean Gorsuch of Gering, Neb., seems to excel at RodeoHouston, and this year was no different. Gorsuch, who qualified for his first Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in 2005, won the average at the 2006 edition of RodeoHouston with a total time of 19.2 seconds on four head. In 2005, Gorsuch didn't win the average, but won the final round with a time of 4.0 seconds. This

year, he finished sixth in the first round with a time of 5.3 seconds, was second in the second round with a 4.3, finished out of the money in the third round and was second in the final round with a 4.6.

Gorsuch finished 2.6 seconds ahead of the rest of the field. Birch Negaard of Buffalo, S.D., was second in the average with a total time of 21.8 seconds. Gorsuch pocketed \$12,973, while Negaard collected checks totaling \$7,920.

It was a logjam at the top of the leaderboard in the team roping with eight-time world champion Speed Williams of Llano, Texas, and seven-time world champion Clay O'Brien Cooper of Morgan Mill, Texas, sharing the average title with David Key of Caldwell, Texas, and Kory Koontz of Sudan, Texas, after posting identical times of 23.6 seconds on four head.

Williams and Cooper, who formed their partnership at the beginning of the year, have been on a roll after collecting their first win in February in Belton, Texas. Williams and Cooper were seventh in the first round with a 6.2-second run, finished in a tie for eighth in the second round with a 6.0, tied for seventh in the third round with a 5.7 and was second in the final round with a 5.7. When the dust had settled, they left Houston with \$6,321 each.

Key and Koontz kicked off their partnership in January with a Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round victory at the Sandhills Stock Show and Rodeo in Odessa, Texas, and have carried their momentum through March, picking up their biggest win as partners in Houston. Key and Koontz were third in the first round after turning in a 5.8 second run, finished out of the money in the second round, finished in a tie for seventh in the third round with a 5.7 and was third in the final round with a 6.0. All totaled they won \$7,354 each.

For the second year in a row, two-time world champion barrel racer Kelly Kaminski found her name atop the leaderboard in Houston. Kaminski, of nearby Bellville, Texas, finished in a tie for the top spot in 2006 with Tammy Key of Ledbetter, Texas. Both ladies turned in four clean runs to finish with a total time of 65.05 seconds.

Kaminski finished fourth in the first and second rounds with runs of 16.26 and 16.33 seconds, respectively. In the third round, she finished in a tie for eighth with a 16.33 and was second in the final round with a 16.13, her fastest time of the rodeo. Kaminski, who won back-to-back world titles, collected \$12,651.

Key turned in her fastest time of the rodeo, 16.10 seconds, to win the first round. In the second round, she finished seventh with a run of 16.41 and was third in the third round with a 16.12-second run. Key won a total of \$13,187.
