Wrangler ProRodeo Tour makes second Nevada stop in Logandale

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - The Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale, Nev., which starts April 6, is the ninth stop on the 12-city Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour.

The Logandale Rodeo, which made its Wrangler ProRodeo Tour debut in 2004, gives contestants another opportunity to pick up key Wrangler Tour points in their quest to qualify for the \$350,000 Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out, May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla.

Each regular Tour rodeo is one of the top rodeos in the country, and contestants earn Tour points based on their performance at each Tour stop. Fans can catch all the Tour action on Fox Sports Network (FSN) for the first time in history. Each stop will be televised on FSN within 10 days of the event. Check local listings for times in your area, or log on to www.prorodeo.com or www.pro-rodeotour.com for the latest TV listings.

Logandale is located about 60 miles northeast of Las Vegas, and in 2005 it ranked 25th among all PRCA-sanctioned rodeos in terms of prize money that totaled \$211,342.

At the 2005 Clark County Fair and Rodeo, six-time world champion saddle bronc rider Dan Mortensen recorded his first win of the season after returning from a broken ankle that kept him sidelined for the 2004 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo. He swept the saddle bronc riding competition after post-

ing a score of 89 points in the Tour Round to finish with 171 points on two head. Steer wrestler Todd Suhm won the Tour Round with a 4.8-second run and captured the average title with a total time of 14.4 seconds on two head.

The bareback riding saw Matt Mosher post the highest score in the Tour Round with a 90-point ride, while Ryan Gray won the average with 171 points on two head. In the team roping, Charles Pogue and Boogie Ray stopped the clock in 6.2 seconds for the Tour Rpmid victory, while Colter Todd and Cesar De La Cruz won the average with a time of 25.9 seconds on three head. Tie-down roper Justin Maass captured the Tour Round victory with a 7.5-second run, while Mike Johnson finished atop the average race with a time of 25.7 seconds on three head. Brittany Pozzi won the Tour Round, finishing with a 17.50-second run and Amanda Clayman won the average with a total time of 52.69 seconds on three runs. Zeb Lanham won the Tour Round with an 86, while B.J. Schumacher won the average with 170 points on two head.

After Logandale, contestants will head to California for the Red Bluff (Calif.) Round-up, April 23, and the Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo, April 30. The final stop on the Winter Tour will be the Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days Rodeo on May 7.

Whitfield, Ohl, Brazile battle it out in Laughlin for tie-down roping title

LAUGHLIN, Nev. - It was a classic match-up in the tie-down roping at the 2006 edition of the Laughlin (Nev.) River Stampede on Sunday afternoon.

Seven-time and reigning World Champion Tie-Down Roper Fred Whitfield, four-time world champion Cody Ohl and three-time all-around world champion Trevor Brazile were three of the final four ropers on Sunday.

Brazile, of Decatur, Texas, was the first to go, turning in an 8.7-second run. Following Brazile was young gun Joseph

Parsons of Marana, Ariz., who took care of business by overtaking the lead with an 8.4. Whitfield, who lives for pressure situations, backed into the box next and showed the sold-out crowd how a champion rises to the occasion. Whitfield, of Hockley, Texas, finished with a time of 7.9 seconds. The final competitor was Ohl, of Hico, Texas, who drew a tough calf and finished with an 8.8-second run.

When the dust had settled, Whitfield had collected the Tour Round victory, but

- ▶ **Cloverdale, Redding rodeos partner for bonus prize money event.** The Cloverdale Rodeo & Exhibition Association and the Redding Rodeo Association are pleased to announce the 2006 ProRodeo West Coast Trail \$14,000 Bonus Prize Money program, sponsored by the Dodge Truck Dealers of BC (British Columbia) and the Redding Bank of Commerce.

The committees from both communities have been working on this concept for the past several years and believe this program will be a win-win for contestants, committees and fans alike.

"We have been working for the past two years on developing a Bonus Prize Money Program that would be a win-win for both Cloverdale & Redding," said Redding Rodeo Chairman Bennett Gooch. "This announcement certainly shows how ProRodeo committees and sponsors can work together."

To win the bonus prize money of \$2,000 per event, rodeo contestants must win their respective rodeo event at both the Cloverdale and Redding Rodeos. Ohl hung on to win the average title with a total time of 24.4 seconds on three head, just one-tenth of a second ahead of Whitfield with a 24.5.

"I didn't think I had drawn the best calf, but I got a good start, got it on him quick and fortunately for me it stayed down," said Whitfield on his Tour Round victory. "I think the Tour points I picked up here should get me into the finale, but I have three rodeos (Logandale, Nev., Clovis, Calif., and Guymon, Okla.) left that I can count, so I am going to try and add to my total."

Ohl, who was second in the world standings prior to Laughlin, won \$6,764, while Whitfield picked up \$5,513. Both competitors have been making each run and rodeo count. Prior to Laughlin, Ohl had only been to six rodeos, picking up total winnings of \$34,432, while Whitfield had won \$22,892 at seven rodeos.

The Laughlin (Nev.) River Stampede marked the eighth stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour.

Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out upon the conclusion of the Winter Tour.

The Pace Chute-out will be held May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla. All 12 stops on the Winter Tour will be televised on Fox Sports Network for the first time in history. Check local listings for times in your area.

Two-time and reigning World Champion Bareback Rider Will Lowe has been in the driver's seat the whole year in both the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings and the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour standings. Lowe, of Canyon, Texas, continued his dominance by winning the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round in Laughlin with an 84-point ride on Bar T Rodeo's Red Ears. He outdistanced Forest Bramwell of Pagosa Springs, Colo., who finished with an 83 on Bar T Rodeo's Second Chance. However, Bramwell picked up the average title with 162 points on two head. For Bramwell, it was a breakthrough after a slow winter, and he hopes to continue the momentum through the spring and summer. Bramwell won a total of \$3,738, while Lowe collected \$1,200.

2004 world champion Luke Branquinho smoked the steer wrestling field on Sunday with a time of 3.8 seconds to win the Wrangler Tour Round.

Branquinho, of Los Alamos, Calif., missed the majority of the 2005 season with a torn pectoral muscle, but he is back and has found a good partner in Zan, the two-time AQHA Steer Wrestling Horse-of-the-Year owned by Rodney Burks. Branquinho has ridden that horse a total of seven times and has won or placed on him every time but once.

Colorado bulldogger Josh Peek finished just behind Branquinho in the Tour round with a 4.1-second run, but collected the average title with a total time of 12.8 seconds on three head. Peek, of Pueblo, Colo., edged Branquinho by six-tenths of a second to win the average. Peek pocketed \$5,140 in Laughlin, with Branquinho taking home \$4,966.

Team ropers David Key and Kory Koontz collected their second Tour Round victory of the winter series in Laughlin on Sunday. Key, of Caldwell, Texas, and Koontz, of Sudan, Texas, stopped the clock in 5.2 seconds to finish ahead of Brazile and his partner, eight-time world champion Rich Skelton, who finished with a 5.9. Key and Koontz, who won the Tour Round at the first Tour stop in Odessa, Texas, also picked up the average title in Laughlin with a total time of 16.1 seconds

on three head, 2.7 seconds faster than the second-place teams. Steve Purcella and Britt Bockius tied for second place in the average with Matt Funk and Bucky Campbell with total time of 18.8 seconds on three head.

Key and Koontz picked up \$3,909 in Laughlin and more importantly, they picked up 23 valuable Tour points, which will help them secure a spot in the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out field as the Winter Tour winds down.

Brazile, who qualified for Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round in both the team roping and tie-down roping, won the all-around title in Laughlin after winning a total of \$4,584 in two events.

PRCA stock contractor Roy Honeycutt predicted the ride of the day when he saw six-time world champion Dan Mortensen teamed with his bronc Top Gun for the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round, and the ride didn't disappoint owner or rider. Mortensen, of Billings, Mont., finished atop the leaderboard in the Tour Round after posting a score of 85 points, outdistancing five-time world champion Billy Etbauer and Cody Martin, who each turned in scores of 82. Etbauer, of Edmond, Okla., rode Burns Rodeo's Rim Rock, while Martin, of Waco, Texas, danced with Honeycutt Rodeo's Round Robin.

Cody "Hot Sauce" DeMoss keeps racking up average titles after collecting yet another win in Laughlin. DeMoss, of Heflin, La., finished with 164 points on two head, adding \$4,658 to his

world standings.

Canadian barrel racer Deb Renger added another Tour Round victory to her accomplishments for 2006 and she did so in a rodeo-best time. Renger, of Okotoks, Alberta, rode her 10-year-old Rainer clocking a time of 16.75 seconds. The fastest run prior to Sunday's final round was turned in by Terri Kaye Kirkland in the second round with a 16.91-second run. Renger left Laughlin \$4,807 richer. Kim Squires of Carnegie, Okla., won the average title with three clean runs totaling 51.45 seconds and pocketed \$5,876 in Laughlin.

For the past couple of weeks, bull rider Jason McClain has been watching his traveling partner Cody Hancock pull off big wins in Houston and Austin. On Sunday afternoon, it was McClain's turn to bask in the limelight. McClain, of Lewis, Colo., was one of only four riders to successfully make the eight-second whistle, and he did so by turning in an 84 on Honeycutt Rodeo's Black Elk. He also captured the average title with a total of 163 points on two head.

2004 world champion bull rider Dustin Elliott finished just one point out of first place in the average after turning in a 79 in the Tour Round on Bar T Rodeo's Bo Honk. McClain picked up checks totaling \$3,597, while Elliott, of North Platte, Neb., won \$4,335.

The next Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour stop will be the Clark County Fair & Rodeo in Logandale, Nev., on April 8.

Klein, Youngers land Xtreme Bulls as boat sponsor

TULSA, Okla. - Until now, stories of the ones that got away may have been the main source of bull on the Bassmaster Tournament Trail; however, that changed recently with the announcement that the *2006 Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour* has become the new boat sponsor for BASS legend Gary Klein and competitive angler Charlie Youngers.

"Rodeo fans like to fish, and a lot of anglers are bull riding fans, so it made sense for us to create a cross-promotional platform for the two sports," said Jim Wilburn, president and CEO of Winnercomm, which acquired the licensing rights to the PRCA's Xtreme Bulls Tour in 2005. Tulsa-based Winnercomm is one of the largest third-party producers of programming for ESPN. The company originates a wide range of television coverage of professional rodeo and bass fishing and manages the ProRodeo and Outdoors Web sites on ESPN.com.

Klein and Youngers compete in the CITGO Bassmaster Elite Series, which has 15 tournament stops in 2006. Klein, 48, of Weatherford, Texas, has appeared in 24 Bassmaster Classics and has total cash earnings of more than \$947,000. His career highlights include eight tournament titles, 66 top-10 finishes, 112 top-20 finishes and 183 top-50 finishes. Klein is a member of BASS, Association of BASS Professionals and the Triton/Mercury pro team.

Youngers, 54, of Oviedo, Fla., competed in the 2000 BASS Classic; career highlights include four Top 10 finishes, seven top-20 finishes and 13 top-50 finishes in major tournament events. He is a member of BASS, Association of BASS Professionals and the Triton/Mercury pro team.
