Wrangler ProRodeo Tour takes a week off before heading to California

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - The Wrangler ProRodeo Tour will take a week off before stopping in Red Bluff, Calif., for the Red Bluff Round-Up.

The Red Bluff Round-Up will be the 10th stop on the 12-city Tour and will give contestants another opportunity to pick up key Wrangler Tour points in their quest to qualify for the \$350,000 Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out, May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla.

Each regular Tour rodeo is one of the top rodeos in the country, and contestants earn Tour points based on their performance at each Tour stop. Fans can catch all the Tour action on Fox Sports Network

(FSN) for the first time in history. Each stop will be televised on FSN within 10 days of the event. Check local listings for times in your area, or log on to www.prorodeo.com or www.prorodeotour.com for the latest TV listings.

Red Bluff is located about 130 miles north of Sacramento, Calif., and in 2005 it ranked 29th among all PRCA-sanctioned rodeos in terms of prize money that totaled \$193,056.

After Red Bluff, contestants will head to the Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo, April 30. The final stop on the Winter Tour will be the Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days Rodeo on May 7.

Brazile firing on all cylinders, takes two in Logandale

LOGANDALE, Nev. - Three-time all-around world champion Trevor Brazile continued his march to a world title, going two-for-two on Sunday night at the Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale, Nev.

Brazile, of Decatur, Texas, is firing on all cylinders right now, winning the average titles in the tie-down roping and team roping at the ninth stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour. Brazile, who was red hot in the tie-down roping in March, has carried that momentum into April. He entered the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round as the No. 1 tie-down roper in the average and he turned in a business-like run of 10.5 seconds to secure the average title with a total time of 37.2 seconds on four head.

Brazile didn't stop there. He carried that momentum into the team roping and he and first year partner, eight-time world champion Rich Skelton, took care of business to finish atop the leaderboard with a total time of 23.1 seconds on four head. Brazile and Skelton, of Llano, Texas, finished sixth-tenths of a second faster than reigning world champion Clay Tryan of Billings, Mont., and Patrick Smith of Midland, Texas, who finished with a total time of 23.7.

"It feels good to finally win in both events," said Brazile, who also picked up the all-around title after winning \$10,643. "So far

this year when I have left a rodeo I have had mixed feelings because I would do well in the tie-down roping but not the team roping, so to put it all together here is great."

Caddo Lewallen of Morrison, Okla., won the Wrangler Tour Round in the tie-down roping with a time of 8.8 seconds, while Wes Goodrich of Scooba, Miss., and Matt Zancanella of Aurora, S.D., won the Tpour Round in the team roping with a quick time of 5.6 seconds.

The Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale, Nev., marked the ninth stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out upon the conclusion of the Winter Tour.

The Pace Chute-out will be held May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla. All 12 stops on the Winter Tour will be televised on Fox Sports Network for the first time in history. Check local listings for times in your area.

Utah's Jess Davis captured the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round win and average title in the bareback riding in Logandale on Sunday. Davis, of Payson, rode Sankey Rodeo's Panther Martin for 88 points in the

Wrangler Tour Round and finished with a two head total of 168 points. Davis, who won La Fiesta de los Vaqueros in Tucson, Ariz., and RodeoHouston earlier this year, edged 2004 World Champion Kelly Timberman by one point in the Tour Round and average totals. Timberman, of Mills, Wyo., rode Growney Brothers' Black Friday for 87 points in the Tour Round and finished with a two head total of 167 points. Davis collected \$3,591, while Timberman picked up \$2,780.

A week ago in Laughlin, Nev., 2004 World Champion Steer Wrestler Luke Branquinho rode two-time PRCA/AQHA Horse of the Year Zan to the winners circle. This week it was Ronnie Fields of Oklahoma City, Okla., who rode Zan to the Tour Round win. Fields stopped the clock in 3.7 seconds and left Logandale \$4,551 richer.

Joey Bell Jr., rode Big Iron, a horse formally owned by 2001 World Champion Rope Myers, to a second-place finish in the Tour round with a 4.0-second run, which was enough to give him the Logandale average title for the second time in his career. Bell, of Malakoff, Texas, finished with a total time of 16.6 seconds on four head and won a total of \$7,373. Bell, who previously won the Clark County Fair & Rodeo in 2004, finished ahead of Fields' four head total of 18.3.

Montana's Josh Reynolds turned in the top ride of the night in the saddle bronc riding with an 86-point ride on Sankey Rodeo's Theodore. Reynolds, of Corvallis, edged Matt Hebbert of Hyannis, Neb., for the Tour Round victory. Hebbert finished with an 85 on Sankey Rodeo's Domino Theory. Reynolds and Hebbert shared the average title after posting identical two head totals of 168 points and took home \$4,293 and \$4,775, respectively. Six-time world champion Dan Mortensen finished just one point behind with 167.

Barrel racer Brittany Pozzi had never entered a Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round as the top barrel racer in the average until Sunday night in Logandale. However, Pozzi, of Victoria, Texas, didn't change her approach to the run in any way and went all out. In the end, it paid off as Pozzi won the

average with a total time of 52.21 seconds on three runs. Pozzi, who picked up a check worth \$6,164, finished second in the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with a 17.21-second run. Chani Payne of Sulphur Springs, Texas, turned in the quickest time of the night with a 17.14-second run.

It was a rough night in the bull riding with only two cowboys making the eight second whistle. Sonny Murphy of Herrimann, Utah, turned in the top score of the night with an 86-point ride aboard Western Rodeo's Spenddrift, but that wasn't enough to capture the average title. Mike Moore of Kankakee, Ill., won the average with a total of 171 points on two head, just one point ahead of Murphy. Moore rode Western Rodeo's Bear Trap for 82 points in the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round to capture the win. Moore collected checks totaling \$4,226, while Murphy won \$3,219.

The next Wrangler ProRodeo Tour stop will be the Red Bluff (Calif.) Round-Up on April 23.
