Wrangler ProRodeo Tour heads to Clovis, Calif., for second-to-last stop

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. -The Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour will host its second-to-last stop this weekend at the Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo. Contestants will feel the pressure mount as they continue to fight for the Top 12 positions on the Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour leaderboard. The Top 12 contestants after the final Tour stop in Guymon, Okla., will earn a spot at the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-Out in Tulsa, Okla., May 13-14.

The Clovis Rodeo will also play host to the 2006 *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour*. The Xtreme Bulls performance will kick off the Clovis Rodeo on April 27, at 7:00 p.m. PT. 2005 Xtreme Bulls Champion and reigning World Champion Matt Austin of Wills Point, Texas, will be amongst competitors along with current Xtreme Bulls standings leader Jarrod Ford of Greeley, Colo.

Reigning World Champion Will Lowe of Canyon, Texas, was able to solidify the bareback average title at the 2005 edition of the Clovis Rodeo amidst a tough group of competitors. Steer wrestler Rope Myers of Van, Texas, rode away with his share of the payout, finishing with 20.5 seconds on four head and the average title. Four-time Wrangler NFR qualifier Cody Hancock of Taylor, Ariz., captured his first average title of the 2005 season in Clovis with a three head total of 244 points. Hancock was the only bull rider to successfully ride all three bulls.

Team ropers Lance Brooks of Exeter, Calif., and Dennis Watkins of Bakersfield, Calif., saddle bronc rider Cody Wright of Milford, Utah, tie-down roper Matt Shiozawa of Chubbuck, Idaho, and barrel racer Liz Pinkston of San Antonio, Texas, rounded out the 2005 average winners.

The Clovis Rodeo will also be one of the many rodeos participating in the Tough Enough To Wear Pink campaign during the Friday night performance, in which everyone is asked to wear pink in support of breast cancer research. The Trading Post Shopping Center is sponsoring the night's performance by donating an additional \$100 for each event winner wearing pink. For each admission ticket sold for the Friday performance, the Trading Post Shopping Center will also donate 25 cents to the local chapter of the Susan G. Koman Breast Cancer Foundation.

The Clovis Rodeo Association will also match the donations made by the Trading Post Shopping Center. A total of \$200 per event winner and 50 cents per ticket will be given to the fight against breast cancer.

The Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round will be Sunday, April 30 at 2:00 p.m. PT. Fox Sports Network (FSN) will be on hand to capture all the Tour Round action. Check local listings, or visit www.prorodeotour.com, for the times and dates in your area.

Allen finds his groove at the Red Bluff Round-Up

RED BLUFF, Calif. - Saddle bronc rider Rusty Allen found his groove at the 85th Red Bluff Round-Up in Red Bluff, Calif., during the week-end.

Allen of Lehi, Utah, won the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with an 86-point ride on Big Bend Rodeo's Major Disaster en route to the average title. He finished with a two head total of 166 points after finishing in a tie for fifth in the first round with an 80-point score aboard Western Rodeo's Pine Ridge. Allen finished just one point ahead of No. 1 ranked saddle bronc rider Cody DeMoss for the average crown.

DeMoss, of Heflin, La., finished fourth in the first round after posting a score of 81 points on Western Rodeo's Trampoline and was second in the Tour Round with an 84 on Russell Rodeo's Nitro. Allen picked up checks totaling \$4,406,

while DeMoss added another \$3,967 to his season earnings.

The Red Bluff Round-Up marked the tenth stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out upon the conclusion of the Winter Tour.

The Pace Chute-out will be held May 13-14 in Tulsa, Okla. All 12 stops on the Winter Tour will be televised on Fox Sports Network for the first time in history. Check local listings for times in your area.

Three-time all-around world champion Trevor Brazile, two-time Wrangler NFR steer wrestler Ronnie Fields and two-time Wrangler NFR tie-down roper Cade Swor will be featured in the segment on Friday, April 28.

ning the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round in a time of 5.9 seconds. Key of Caldwell, Texas, and Koontz, of Sudan, Texas, picked up their third Tour victory of the 2006 season. They got off to a quick start, winning the first Tour stop at the SandHills Stock Show and Rodeo in Odessa, Texas, and then returned to the top at the Laughlin (Nev.) River Stampede, picking up the Tour Round and average titles. They finished third in the average in Red Bluff with a four head total of 28.1 seconds.

The average title in the team roping was shared by Nelson Linares and his partner, Travis Woodard and Trevor Brazile and Rich Skelton, who turned in identical four head totals of 27.4 seconds. For Brazile, of Decatur, Texas, and Skelton, of Llano, Texas, this was their second consecutive average victory at a Tour rodeo. Two weeks ago they picked up the average title at the Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale, Nev.

Linares, of Plant City, Fla., and Woodard, of Stockton, Calif., finished sixth in the first round with a 6.3-second run, finished out of the money in the second round, placed sixth in the third round with a time of 6.6 and secured a share of the average title with a 6.7-second run in the Tour Round for a fourth place finish.

Brazile and Skelton finished out of the money in the first and second round but rebounded in the third round with a 5.1-second run to take second in the round. They finished just one-tenth of a second ahead of Linares and Woodard in the Tour Round with a time of 6.6 seconds to finish in a tie for the average crown. Linares and Woodard collected checks totaling \$3,353 each, while Brazile and Skelton won \$4,238.

California bull rider Bobby Waller rose to the challenge in Red Bluff, winning the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round and average titles. Waller, of Quail Valley, rode Growney Rodeo's Cash Prize for 92 points to win the Tour Round and finish with a two head total of 170 points, 21 points ahead of the rest of the field. Waller finished eighth in the first round with a 78-point ride on Flying U Rodeo's Dark Water.

Joe Meling of Pendleton, Ore., was second in the average race with 149 points on two head. Meling finished out of the money in the first round but finished third in the Tour Round with a 79 on Flying U Rodeo's Carrisa Plains. Waller pocketed \$3,558, while Meling picked up \$2,283.

Bareback rider Rowdy Buechner was just one point shy in the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round of sweeping both rounds en route to the average title. Buechner, of Sandpoint, Idaho, won the first round with an 84-point score on Flying Five Rodeo's Rhonda Blue but in the Tour Round he finished with an 83 on Big Bend Rodeo's Miss America Title, one point behind 2002 world champion Bobby Mote who turned in an 84 on Big Bend Rodeo's Faded Dice. However, Buechner's two head total of 167 points gave him the average title by five points over Mote, of Culver, Ore. Buechner

won a total of \$5,772, while Mote cashed checks totaling \$2,925.

Jerrad Hofstetter of Athens, Texas, finished atop the leaderboard in the tie-down roping in both the Wrangler Tour Round and the average race. Hofstetter stopped the clock in 9.3 seconds to win the Tour Round en route to the average title of 38.3 seconds on four head. Brazile finished second in the average with a total time of 39.1 seconds. Hofstetter collected checks totaling \$4,766, while Brazile added another \$4,118 to his Red Bluff winnings.

Levi Wisness was the top steer wrestler in Red Bluff. Wisness, of Keene, N.D., won the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with a time of 6.0 seconds en route to the average title with a four head total of 23.2 seconds. Wisness finished in a tie for third in the first round with a run of 5.5 seconds and tied for fifth in the third round with a 5.8-second run.

Wisness won the average with a 2.6 second margin over Clint Robinson of Spanish Fork, Utah. Robinson finished in a tie for first in the second round with a time of 4.8 seconds and was fourth in the Tour Round after stopping the clock in 8.1 seconds. Wisness left Red Bluff with \$5,080, while Robinson picked up \$5,087.

Lindsay Sears went two-for-two on Sunday finishing atop the leaderboard in the Tour Round and the average race. Sears, of Nanton, Alberta, rounded the cloverleaf patten in 17.20 seconds to capture the round victory and finished with a three run total of 52.75 seconds. She tied for sixth in the first round with a 17.70-second run but finished out of the money in the second round. All totaled she left Red Bluff with \$3,751.

The next Wrangler ProRodeo Tour stop will be the Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo on April 30.

Big payday for riders at annual Buc Days ProRodeo in Corpus Christi

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Six-time world champion saddle bronc rider Dan Mortensen pocketed \$5,835 for his eight-second ride at the Buc Days ProRodeo in Corpus Christi, Texas.

Mortensen, of Billings, Mont., rode Frontier Rodeo's Paint Brush for 87 points to capture the title. He finished just one point ahead of world standings leader Cody DeMoss, who rode Frontier Rodeo's Big Bad John for 86 points. DeMoss, of Heflin, La., picked up \$4,474 for his ride.

Bareback riders Andy Martinez and Justin McDaniel shared the title with identical 88-point rides. Martinez, of Pavillion, Wyo., rode Frontier Rodeo's Joy Stick, while McDaniel, of Vernon, Texas, matched Rafter G Rodeo's Topsy Turvy jump for jump. They each picked up a check worth \$5,152.

It was a tie atop the leaderboard in the steer wrestling with Stockton Graves and K.C. Jones finishing with total times of 8.8 seconds on two head. Graves, of Newkirk, Okla., was third in the first round with a 4.6-second run and placed fifth in the second round with a 4.2. Jones, of Decatur, Texas, tied for fifth in the first round with a 4.8-second run and won the second round

after turving his steer in 4.0 seconds, putting him in a tie for the title. Graves won \$3,997, while Jones pocketed \$4,360.

Team ropers Steve Purcella and Britt Bockius won the two head average with a total time of 10.1 seconds, a full second ahead of the second place team of Joe Beaver and Justin Tomlinson. Purcella, of Hereford, Texas, and Bockius, of Claremore, Okla., won the first round with a 4.4-second run and followed that with a run of 5.7 seconds in the second round but finished out of the money. All totaled Purcella and Bockius added \$3,467 each to their 2006 earnings.

Neal Felton of Mountain Home, Texas, won the tie-down roping with an 8.3-second run and picked up a check worth \$4,440.

Cory McFadden of Coleman, Texas, captured the bull riding title after riding Frontier Rodeo's Boobie Dance for 91 points, McFadden won \$6,056 for his eight-second effort.

Denise Adams Fea of Lufkin, Texas, and Chani Payne of Sulphur Springs, Texas, shared the barrel racing title with times of 13.48 seconds. They each won \$3,174.

A total of 413 competitors competed for a total of \$167,633.
