# Rodeo's best set to battle it out in Tulsa this week

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - The Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour came to a dramatic close in Guymon with a handful of guys moving into the top 12 and earning berths to the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out at the Tulsa (Okla.) Convention Center, May 13-14.

The event, which will boast a purse of \$350,000, will be held in Tulsa for the first time in the event's history. The last time the State of Oklahoma hosted one of the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association's premier events was more than 20 years ago when the National Finals Rodeo was in Oklahoma City. The last NFR in Oklahoma was in 1984 before it moved to his current location in Las Vegas.

Three-time All-Around World Champion Trevor Brazile will be the only contestant competing in two events. Brazile, of Decatur, Texas, earned berths in the team roping with partner Rich Skelton and in the tie-down roping. He will be the No. 1 tie-down roper at the Pace Chute-out after collecting 146.5 points. Four-time world cham-

pion tie-down roper Cody Ohl finished second in the standings with 109 points, with seven-time and reigning World Champion Fred Whitfield in third with 107.25.

Two-time and reigning World Champion bareback rider Will Lowe leads a strong field into Tulsa. Lowe, of Canyon, Texas, collected 118.83 points to finish in the top stop in the Winter Tour standings. This will be Lowe's ninth Pace Series event, and he will be looking to win his sixth title, the most of any PRCA contestant.

Life has been good for steer wrestler Dean Gorsuch, and he hopes it will continue through the Pace Chute-out. Gorsuch of Gering, Neb., leads a strong field into Tulsa after collecting 92 points. His biggest point totals came at the National Western Stock Show and Rodeo in Denver and at the Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale, Nev., where he collected 24 and 22 points, respectively. Two world champions are among the list of 12 steer wrestlers sched-

# Guymon provided last ditch effort for contestants to qualify for Pace Chute-out

GUYMON, Okla. - It was do or die for many contestants as they entered the 12th and final stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour in Guymon, Okla., on Sunday afternoon. Two such cowboys were steer wrestlers Shawn Greenfield and reigning World Champion Lee Graves. They entered Sunday's final round needing to pick up some valuable Tour points to earn berths in the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out in Tulsa, Okla., May 13-14.

Greenfield and Graves shared the average title with four-head totals of 18.6 seconds. Greenfield, of Lakeview, Ore., finished in a tie for third in the Tour Round with a run of 4.4 seconds, while Graves was second at 4.3.

"It was a big day for me," said Graves, who won \$6,866 in Guymon. "I had to place in the short round and the average to make it to

Tulsa, which I did. I've been on a mission here these past three weeks, so it's kind of fun that it panned out the way it did."

When the dust had settled, Greenfield finished the Winter Tour with 66 points, while Graves totaled 62.5, to finish seventh and eighth, respectively, in the Tour standings.

"I drew the steer that was darn sure a lay-up for me today," said Greenfield, who collected checks totaling \$6,655. "All I had to do was go in and do my part. I rode Lee's horse (Perry) here, and he gave me all the opportunities and I took advantage of them."

Sean Mulligan, of Coleman, Okla., won the Tour Round with a time of 4.2 seconds. He finished the Winter Tour ranked second in the standings.

- ▶ **Jim Shoulders Great Western Weekend.** Tulsa (Okla.) will host one of professional rodeo's most prestigious events - the championship finals of the Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour known as the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out - as well as a *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour* stop and a Western trade fair during a three-day festival honoring Oklahoma rodeo legend and native Tulsan Jim Shoulders at the Tulsa Convention Center on May 12-14.

*The Jim Shoulders Great Western Weekend* will open on Friday, May 12, at 8 p.m. with a *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour* event and continues Saturday and Sunday with the Pace Chute-out. Saturday's performance begins at 8 p.m. at the Convention Center Arena, while the championship finals begins at 3 p.m.

- ▶ **Willert eyeing return to arena.** Reigning World Champion Saddle Bronc Rider Jeff Willert broke his left wrist (riding hand) the first of March at the Matagorda County Fair and Livestock Exposition in Bay City, Texas, and has been waiting for it to heal.

Willert, of Belvidere, S.D., broke the navicular bone after landing on it wrong. He has had it in a cast since the injury and will get the cast off this Thursday, May 11. He is hoping to return to the arena by June 8 for the rodeo in Garden City, Kan.

The Guymon Pioneer Days Rodeo marked the 12th and final stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Winter Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out upon the conclusion of the Winter Tour.

In the bareback riding, Bo Casper finished in a tie for the Tour Round win with 2005 Guymon champion Matt Mosher with identical 86-point rides. Casper, of Fort Scott, Kan., rode Powder River Rodeo's After Midnight, while Mosher, of Wildhorse, Colo., rode Carr Pro Rodeo's Riverboat Annie. Casper, however, finished one point ahead of Mosher for the average title this year, finishing with 169 points on two head. Casper won \$3,660, with Mosher picking up \$2,718.

Andy Martinez of Pavillion, Wyo., needed five Tour points to move into the top 12 and earn a berth to Tulsa. Martinez rode Carr Pro Rodeo's Black Smoke for 81 points and finished in a tie for sixth in the round, good for 6.5 points. He bumped out Jason Jeter of Mansfield, Texas. The other bareback rider who used Guymon to earn a berth to Tulsa was J.D. Garrett Jr. of Grandview, Texas, who finished the Winter Tour ranked seventh in the standings.

David Key and Kory Koontz are quickly becoming a team to be reckoned with. Key, of Caldwell, Texas, and Koontz, of Sudan, Texas, picked up their third Winter Tour victory with a run of 7.1 seconds. Their closest competitors were Bubba Strait and Brock Hanson with a 12.2-second run in the Tour Round. With the run, Key and Koontz also collected the average title with a four-head total of 40.8 seconds and a check worth \$4,831. Their previous Tour Round victories came in Odessa, Texas, and Laughlin, Nev.

In the saddle bronc riding, Canadian Rod Hay finished atop the leaderboard, winning the average with a two-head total of 171 points and pocketed \$5,166. Hay, of Wildwood, Alberta, finished three points ahead of Chad Ferley for the title. Six-time world champion Dan Mortensen won the Tour Round with an 87-point ride on Vold Rodeo's Hanger. Ferley was second with an 85 on Korkow Rodeo's Queenie and Hay was third with an 84 on Carr Pro Rodeo's Lone Star. All three will be in Tulsa this week battling for the finale title.

Fred Whitfield closed out the Winter Tour with the average win in the tie-down roping after turning in four solid runs to finish with a total time of 33.4 seconds. Whitfield, of Hockley, Texas, finished ahead of Clint Robinson of Spanish Fork, Utah, with a 34.8 total. Robinson won the Tour Round after stopping the clock in 7.5 seconds. Whitfield added \$8,363 to his 2006 earnings, while Robinson picked up \$5,766. Robinson also

competed in the steer wrestling and team roping and picked up the all-around title after collecting a total of \$6,143.

Barrel racer Brittany Pozzi has been on a tear as of late. Pozzi, of Victoria, Texas, added another win to her resume, stopping the clock in 17.17 seconds for the Tour Round win, and finished with a three-run total of 52.70 for the average title. She pocketed checks worth \$6,367 while in Guymon. Pozzi finished the Winter Tour first in the standings with 156.33 points, while her next closest competitor was Mary Burger with 96.25.

Bull rider Fred Boettcher picked up both the Tour Round and the average titles in Guymon. Boettcher, of Rice Lake, Wis., rode Powder River Rodeo's Black Smoke for 88 points in the Tour Round and finished with a two-head total of 169 points. All totaled, he won \$3,458. Boettcher will make the trek to Tulsa for the Pace Chute-out as well as the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Hard Ride* stop. Sonny Murphy of Herriman, Utah, was second in the round with an 83 on Powder River Rodeo's Mojo and second in the average with 165. He will join Boettcher in Tulsa this week.

Ralph Williams of Skiatook, Okla., won the average title in the steer roping at the Guymon Pioneer Days. He finished with a total time of 76.8 seconds on five head and won a total of \$9,769. J.P. Wickett of Sallisaw, Okla., was second with a total time of 81 seconds. He pocketed \$9,184.

uled to compete in Tulsa. 2004 World Champion Luke Branquinho and 2005 World Champion Lee Graves qualified in the sixth and eighth positions, respectively.

The team roping should be a hotly contested event in Tulsa as well. Reigning world champions Clay Tryan and Patrick Smith are among the list that includes Brazile and Skelton, Speed Williams and Clay O'Brien Cooper, Matt Sherwood and Walt Woodard and David Key and Kory Koontz. Sherwood, of Queen Creek, Ariz., finished atop the Tour standings on the heading side with 77.25 points, while Koontz, of Sudan, Texas, took top honors in the heeling with 86.5 points.

It has been a three-way dog fight so far in the saddle bronc riding in 2006. Six-time world champion Dan Mortensen, five-time World Champion Billy Etbauer and two-time world champion runner-up Cody DeMoss have been in a tight battle all year in the Tour and world standings. All three will make the trek to Tulsa with Mortensen leading the way with 129.25 points, followed by Etbauer with 108.5 and DeMoss with 107.5.

Saddle bronc riding also had the tightest race for the 12th and final spot. Jess Martin edged reigning World Champion Jeff Willert by a mere .58 points.

Barrel racer Brittany Pozzi has definitely found her groove recently. Pozzi, of Victoria, Texas, blew away the rest of the field finishing with 156.33 points. Mary Burger of Pauls Valley, Okla., was second in the Tour standings with 96.25 points. Making her first appearance at a Pace Series event will be Andrea Jones of Twin Falls, Idaho. Jones is the older sister of saddle bronc rider Rusty Allen of Lehi, Utah. Allen earned a berth in the Pace Chute-out after finishing sixth in the standings.

2006 Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo Champion Sonny Murphy, leads a field of bull riders into Tulsa that includes three world champions. Murphy, of Herriman, Utah, finished atop the Tour standings with 93 points. Reigning World Champion Matt Austin was second with 87.5 and 2004 World Champion Dustin Elliott was third with 76.75 points. 2000 World Champion Cody Hancock qualified for his ninth Pace Series event and will be looking to add a fifth Pace title to his resume. All four will compete in the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour* that precedes the Pace Chute-out in Tulsa on Friday, May 12.

The first round of the Pace Chute-out will be Saturday, May 13 at 8 p.m. CT with the semifinals and finals slated for Sunday, May 14 at 3 p.m. CT. CBS Sports will televise the final round on June 3 at 2 p.m. ET.

## Petry wins steer wrestling title at hometown rodeo

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Steer wrestler Darrell Petry of Beaumont, Texas, thrilled the hometown fans by winning his event title at the YMBL Championship Rodeo, May 4-6, at Ford Park.

Petry stopped the clock in 4.1 seconds, good for \$1,501.

Heath Ford of Greeley, Colo., took top honors in bareback riding. He scored 87 points on Beutler and Son Rodeo's Free Fall, earning a check worth \$1,756. Ford, whose brother Jarrod and cousin Royce both qualified for the Wrangler NFR in 2005 in bull riding and bareback riding, respectively, just missed out last year. He finished 17th in the final world bareback riding standings.

In tie-down roping, Chad McGee of Iowa, La., topped the

field by roping and tying his calf in 8.4 seconds and earning \$1,977.

Saddle bronc riders Wes Burns of Canyon, Texas, and Colin Stalley of Riverton, Wyo., shared the crown after each scoring 82 points on Beutler & Son Rodeo's Many Bubbles and First Command, respectively. Each pocketed \$1,625.

Trent Cormier of Houma, La., bested the bull riding field with an 87-point effort aboard Beutler and Son Rodeo's Many Charms, good for \$2,222.

The tandem of Shane Philipp and John Philipp, both from Washington, Texas, turned in the fastest time in team roping. The duo stopped the clock in 5.5 seconds, earning the title and \$1,226 each.
