Pace Chute-out paychecks boost Williams, O'Brien Cooper to top

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - In two short nights, eight-time world champion team roper Speed Williams of Llano, Texas, and seven-time world champ Clay O'Brien Cooper of Morgan Mill, Texas, eclipsed their entire earnings total from the first four-plus months of the season.

Now, they're both on top of their respective disciplines in the latest edition of the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings.

That's the potential of the lucrative Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out, which concluded this weekend in Tulsa, Okla., with a prize purse of \$350,000.

Williams and Cooper won Saturday's first round and Sunday's semifinal round before sharing the top spot in the finals with Travis Tryan of Billings, Mont., and three-time world champion Allen Bach of Weatherford, Texas. Williams and Cooper won the championship based on a tie-breaker reverting to the previous round.

They started their partnership in January following legendary careers with different partners - Williams and Rich Skelton won eight consecutive world team roping titles from 1997-2004, while Cooper and Jake Barnes won seven titles together (1985-89, 1992, 1994).

Williams and Cooper were far from the only cowboys to make big jumps in world standings on the heels of Pace Chute-out suc-

cess. Besides team roping, three other events also have new leaders after Tulsa.

Steer wrestler Ronnie Fields of Oklahoma City, Okla., won his event and \$20,000, more than any other contestant. In the process, he leapfrogged previous standings leader Dean Gorsuch of Gering, Neb.

Bareback rider Andy Martinez of Pavillion, Wyo., the only 2005 Pace Chute-out champion to repeat, earned \$19,500 and moved from sixth to first.

Barrel racer Mary Burger of Pauls Valley, Okla., also parlayed a championship weekend in Tulsa into reaching the top spot in the world standings. Burger earned \$19,000 and jumped up two places.

Other Pace Chute-out champions also made significant leaps in the world standings.

Zack Oakes of Tonasket, Wash., won the bull riding title and \$18,000, vaulting from 21st to fourth.

Rod Hay of Wildwood, Alberta, an eight-time Canadian champion, took home his first crystal cup in Tulsa. He also earned \$17,000 and jumped from 10th to fifth in the world standings.

Monty Lewis of Hereford, Texas, the 2004 world tie-down roping title, took top honors in Tulsa and earned \$15,000, giving him a boost from fifth to fourth in the world standings.

McClain runs table in Tulsa en route to big payday

TULSA, Okla. - Jason McClain made a clean sweep on Friday night at the fourth stop on the Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour at the Tulsa Convention Center in Tulsa, Okla., Friday night.

McClain, of Lewis, Colo., rode Andrews Rodeo's Culpepper for 85 points to finish atop the leaderboard in the first round. He returned for the Dodge Championship Round and posted a 94-point ride on Cervi & Guidry Rodeo's Hot Damn, finishing just a point off the Xtreme Bulls record of 95 points shared by eight cowboys. McClain finished with 179 points on two head to

pocket \$17,258 for the evening.

"Tonight was great, and the whole night felt good," McClain said. "The first bull I had (Culpepper), I won Deadwood, S.D., on him, so I knew he was going to be pretty good. Having Hot Dam in the short round was great because I'd been 91 and 89 on him before. I figured it (his final-round ride) was 90 or 91, but I guess they liked it."

Reigning World Champion Matt Austin also had a big night, but finished five points off the pace in the average race. Austin, of Wills Point, Texas, rode Powder River Rodeo's Extreme in

- ▶ **JCCF hits \$4 million mark.** The Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund, formed in 1989 to assist injured cowboys and their families, recently surpassed the \$4 million mark. To date, the JCCF has given more than \$4,042,000 to 632 cowboys in need of "a hand up."

The fund helps injured rodeo athletes and families afford everyday living expenses such as mortgages, car payments, food and utilities while they are hurt and unable to compete. Unique among charities, 100 percent of donations to the JCCF go directly to help cowboys. The Justin Boot Company and the PRCA cover all the administrative expenses for the fund.

- ▶ **Gray out with broken leg.** Bareback rider Ryan Gray of Cheney, Wash., will miss the next 4-6 weeks after suffering a broken right leg Thursday at the Cowboy Capital of the World Rodeo in Stephenville, Texas.

Gray, who's ranked fourth in the Jack Daniel's World Standings, considers himself fortunate since it was the fibula, the smaller bone of the lower leg.

"It wasn't a bad break, and it could have been a lot worse," Gray said. "I'll take a little time off and come back when I'm back at 100 percent."

Gray suffered the injury when his horse, Frontier Rodeo's Big Bad John, ran him into the fence after his ride. His spur became hung up in the fence, leading to the fracture.

Gray, who is marrying Lacy Bohlander on Saturday in Phoenix, will spend his down time with his new wife and completing renovations on their new home just northeast of Lubbock, Texas.

"I may be hobbling around during the wedding a little, but it shouldn't be too bad," Gray said. "This gives me the opportunity to spend some extra time with my wife and work on the house before the summer rodeo season."

The injury forced Gray to turn out of last weekend's Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out in Tulsa, Okla. Jason Jeter of Mansfield, Texas, took his place in Tulsa.

the first round for 83 points and returned in the Dodge Championship Round to ride Cervi & Guidry Rodeo's Excess Energy for 91 points to finish in a tie for second with Travis Sellers.

Sellers, riding with a broken bone in his riding hand, spurred Southwick, Robertson, Wilson Rodeo's Mean Machine for 91 points in the Dodge Round. Austin won \$9,926 to move past Jarrod Ford for the top spot in the Dodge Xtreme Bulls standings with \$34,739. Sellers, of Wentzville, Mo., picked up \$7,219 to move into fourth place with \$24,182.

The rank PRCA stock won most of the

battles at the Tulsa Convention Center. Of the 52 total trips Friday night, only 13 resulted in qualified rides. In addition, McClain, Austin and Sellers were the only three cowboys to cover both of their bulls.

It was a busy night for the Justin SportsMedicine Team as well. In addition to Sellers' injury, bull riders D.J. Domangue (fractured right leg), Kanin Asay (lower right leg contusion) and bullfighter Shorty Gorham (broken humerus in his left shoulder) also visited the training room.

Ohl claims hometown title in Stephenville

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Five-time world champion Cody Ohl of Hico, Texas, claimed top honors in his event of tie-down roping this weekend at the Cowboy Capital of the World Rodeo in nearby Stephenville, Texas.

Ohl, a four-time world tie-down roping champion, recorded a time of 16.4 seconds on two head for the title at \$3,342.

Ohl, however, wasn't the only world champion to win an average title in Stephenville.

Ryan Jarrett of Summerville, Ga., the reigning world all-around champion, claimed a share of the steer wrestling title with K.C. Jones of Decatur, Texas. Both turfed two steers in 9.8 seconds.

Jones bagged \$1,770, while Jarrett earned \$1,174.

Bareback rider Chad Klein, a Louisianan now living in Stephenville, had his event's top ride of the rodeo, a 79-point effort aboard Frontier Rodeo's Little General that was good for \$1,809.

Saddle bronc rider Wes Burns of Canyon, Texas, topped the leaderboard and earned \$1,906 with a 79-point ride on Frontier Rodeo's Buffy.

Bryan Richardson of Dallas, Texas; Kyle Miller of Waller, Texas; and Trey Broussard of Estherwood, La., each scored 82 points on Frontier Rodeo's Boobie Dance, Switchfoot and Double Vision, respectively, to share the bull riding title. Each won \$1,437.

Another shared title came in team roping, where the tandems of Thomas Braman of Refugio, Texas, and B.J. Dugger of Three Rivers, Texas; and David Key of Caldwell, Texas, and Kory Koontz of Sudan, Texas, roped two steers in 11.3 seconds.

Key/Koontz each took home \$2,341, while Braman/Dugger won \$1,413 apiece.

Barrel racer Cindy Wheeler of Fredericksburg, Texas, clocked the fastest time of 16.77 seconds to win the title.
