Midseason report

Big start has Brazile on top in two events

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Three-time world champion all-around cowboy Trevor Brazile of Decatur, Texas, had very little go wrong during the first half of the 2006 ProRodeo season. Brazile sits first in both the all-around and tie-down roping standings.

While he won three straight all-around titles from 2002 through 2004, Brazile is still shooting for his first event title; he has finished runner-up in steer roping six times and has ranked as high as third in tie-down roping and sixth in team roping.

Brazile's big move started at the end of

February when he won the tie-down roping average title at La Fiesta de los Vaqueros in Tucson, Ariz. In March, he walked away with event titles in consecutive weeks at RodeoHouston, Rodeo Austin (Texas) and in Huntsville, Texas.

Right behind Brazile are three tie-down ropers who have combined for the last 11 world titles – Fred Whitfield of Hockley, Texas (7); Cody Ohl of Hico, Texas (3) and Monty Lewis of Hereford, Texas (1).

Austin eyes repeat, leaders seek first-time gold

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – It didn't take Matt Austin long to regain his momentum from a record-setting 2005 that saw him blaze unprecedented paths to his first world title. Halfway through 2006, the Wills Point, Texas, bull rider is in a familiar position - on top of the world standings.

Last year, Austin emerged from the pack during the second half of the season and won a record \$320,766 in the process. He's hoping for the same recipe this year after another solid winter and spring. He started the year with a bang, winning the *Dodge Xtreme*

Bulls Ride Hard Tour title in San Antonio on Feb. 13.

A handful of other bull riders are trying to make history of their own. Wesley Silcox of Payson, Utah, is roughly \$10,000 behind Austin and had big average wins in Fort Worth, Texas and San Antonio. Sonny Murphy of Herriman, Utah, sits in third place, while Jason McClain of Lewis, Colo., powered by a victory in last month's Xtreme Bulls tour stop in Tulsa, Okla., is in solid

Week ahead features big stakes in Sisters, Livermore

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Lucrative rodeos in three different ProRodeo circuits highlight the first full week of June as the season transitions into the summer stretch.

This weekend, cowboys have 24 PRCA rodeos from which to choose, highlighted by the Beef Empire Days PRCA Rodeo, June 8-10 in Garden City, Kan.; the Sisters (Ore.) Rodeo, June 9-11; and the Livermore (Calif.) Rodeo, June 10-11.

A stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour in 2001, the Sisters Rodeo, dubbed "The Biggest Little Show in the World" is holding its 66th edition at the Sisters Rodeo Ground. The four-performance rodeo – which offers \$7,500 in added money per

event – has two nightly shows at 7 p.m. (PT) June 9 and 10 and a pair of afternoon events at 1 p.m. June 10-11.

Livermore offers \$5,000 of added money in each event and has two matinee performances at 2 p.m. (PT) on June 10-11. The award-winning Growney Brothers Rodeo Company is providing the livestock.

For those who can't travel to the West Coast, a suitable alternative can be found in Garden City, where Korkow Rodeos is bringing its livestock to the Beef Empire Days Rodeo. The rodeo offers \$4,000 of added money per event and consists of three nightly performances at 7:05 p.m. CT.

- ▶ **NIRA aims high.** The National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA) recently welcomed the U.S. Air Force as its newest sponsor.

The agreement starts next week at the College National Finals Rodeo in Casper, Wyo., and will continue throughout the 2006-07 rodeo season. U.S. Air Force personnel will attend many of the NIRA's events next season and will present flags and banners at each site.

- ▶ **Texas Stampede donation.** The Dallas-based Texas Stampede recently announced a \$300,000 donation to Children's Medical Center in Dallas as a result of its annual fundraising effort, which included the Pace Picante ProRodeo Classic and concert series held last November at the American Airlines Center.

The gift brings the Texas Stampede's total contribution to Children's Medical Center and associated pediatric programs to more than \$2.5 million since the organization was founded in 2001. The Stampede's events are presented by a staff of six and more than 750 volunteers.

This year's ProRodeo Tour Championship Finale, presented by the Texas Stampede, is Nov. 10-12 at the American Airlines Center.

Lowe, Burk capture Fort Smith titles

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Two-time and reigning world bareback riding champion Will Lowe of Canyon, Texas, and perennial Wrangler National Finals Rodeo tie-down roper Blair Burk of Durant, Okla., highlighted the champions from the recently completed Old Fort Days Rodeo in Fort Smith, Ark.

Lowe scored 82 points on David Bailey Rodeo Company's Cherokee Bill and earned \$2,936.

Burk, an 11-time Wrangler NFR qualifier, roped and tied two calves in 15.7 seconds, good for \$3,088.

Bull rider Bobby Welsh of Gillette, Wyo., who suffered an injured shoulder at last month's *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride*

Hard Tour stop in Tulsa, Okla., showed no ill effects in Fort Smith. He rode Bailey Rodeo's Tar Baby for 88 points and the event crown worth \$3,791.

Other champions in Fort Smith were Bobby Griswold, Geary, Okla., and Heith DeMoss, Crowville, La., saddle bronc riding, 84 points on Harry Vold's Desert Shield and Dry Creek, respectively, \$2,845 each; Stockton Graves, Newkirk, Okla., steer wrestling, 8.7 seconds on two head, \$3,268; Nick Sartain, Yukon, Okla./Shannon Frascht, Alva, Okla., team roping, 11.5 seconds on two head, \$2,031 each; and Mary Burger, Pauls Valley, Okla., and Carrie Thompson, Morton, Miss., barrel racing, 16.31 seconds, \$2,566 each.

In steer wrestling, Ronnie Fields of Oklahoma City used a \$20,000 payday at last month's Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out in Tulsa, Okla., to power into the top spot. He leads Dean Gorsuch of Gering, Neb., by more than \$3,000. Luke Branquinho of Los Alamos, Calif., and Lee Graves of Calgary, Alberta, who won world titles in 2003 and 2005, respectively, enjoyed solid springs and are positioned in the top five in the standings.

Incidentally, the top three bulldoggers have one thing in common – their horse, Zan, the two-time AQHA/PRCA Steer Wrestling Horse of the Year owned by Rodney Burks. Fields rode the horse to victory in Tulsa, Gorsuch in Houston for his biggest win and Branquinho at the Wrangler Tour round in Laughlin, Nev.

position in fourth. Cody Hancock of Taylor, Ariz., the 2000 world champion, sits in sixth after a spring highlighted by average wins at RodeoHouston and Rodeo Austin (Texas).

Saddle bronc rider Cody DeMoss of Heflin, La., leads a pair of legends atop the world standings as he seeks his first world title. DeMoss holds an advantage of more than \$25,000 over six-time world saddle bronc riding champion Dan Mortensen of Billings, Mont. Behind Mortensen is five-time world champion Billy Etbauer of Edmond, Okla. Chad Ferley of Oelrichs, S.D., fueled by average victories in Odessa, Texas, and San Angelo, Texas, is ranked fourth.

The top three bareback riders in the world standings heading into summer have

In team roping, eight-time world champion Speed Williams of Llano, Texas, and Clay O'Brien Cooper of Morgan Mill, Texas, joined forces this year and lead the world standings in their respective discipline. With the \$18,875 each earned at the Pace Chute-out, both more than doubled their season earnings.

Williams and Cooper have plenty of company – a little more than \$4,000 separates the top four headers, while some \$6,000 is all that's between the top four heelers. Teams within a big paycheck of vaulting to the top include Travis Tryan of Billings, Mont./Allen Bach of Weatherford, Texas; David Key of Caldwell, Texas/Kory Koontz of Sudan, Texas; and Matt Sherwood of Queen Creek, Ariz./Walt Woodard of Stockton, Calif.

never stood on the world champions' podium in Las Vegas, which should make for an exciting second half. Andy Martinez of Pavillion, Wyo., and Chris Harris of Itasca, Texas, are in a virtual tie with Wes Stevenson of Kaufman, Texas, just \$4,000 behind. Lurking behind are a pair of world champions in Will Lowe of Canyon, Texas, and Bobby Mote of Culver, Ore.

Lowe, the reigning world champ who also earned a gold buckle in 2003, is ranked fourth, while Mote, the 2002 world champ who was the runner-up the year before, sits in fifth. Both enjoyed highlight-filled first halves, with Lowe claiming top honors at the National Western Stock Show and Rodeo in Denver, while Mote won the average at the Grand National Rodeo in San Francisco.
