Top college hands compete for crowns at CNFR

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Nearly 400 of the best college cowboys and cowgirls representing colleges and universities in 11 regions across the United States are competing this week at the College National Finals Rodeo (CNFR) at the Casper Events Center.

The 57th CNFR kicked off June 11 with a performance of bareback riding, saddle bronc riding and bull riding.

Slack is scheduled from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. MT on June 12-13. Daily performances start at 7 p.m. June 14. The rodeo culminates

with the championship round at 7 p.m. June 17. College Sports Television is providing final-round coverage and will air CNFR action later this summer.

Tickets for slack and each individual performance range from \$6 to \$16. Ticket packages are also available. Call the Casper Events Center at (800) 442-2256 for more information.

Championships will be awarded to men's and women's team and men's and women's all-around, as well as the event winners

Summer Tour begins journey to Finale

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – For the seventh straight time, the Reno Rodeo highlights the Summer Series of the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour. And for the fifth year in a row, the event, called the “Wildest, Richest Rodeo in the West” kicks off the summer's 12-stop Wrangler Tour. In 2005, the Reno Rodeo ranked No. 5 among rodeos in terms of prize money, offering more than \$425,000.

The Reno Rodeo gets started on June 16 at 7 p.m. PT for the first of nine performances. Events at 7 p.m. follow each

day, including the Wrangler Tour round on June 24 at 7 p.m.

Contestants can start earning Tour points in Reno in hopes of qualifying for the ProRodeo Summer Tour Finale, Sept. 28-Sept. 30, in Omaha, Neb. Only the top 12 cowboys and cowgirls in each event's Tour standings following the final Tour stop in Albuquerque, N.M., on Sept. 23 qualify for the Summer Finale, which takes place in the Qwest Center in Omaha.

Dodge Xtreme Bulls starts Reno Rodeo

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Reigning world bull riding champion and current world standings leader Matt Austin of Wills Point, Texas, and fellow world champions Dustin Elliott (2004) of North Platte, Neb., and Cody Hancock (2000) of Taylor, Ariz., highlight the 40-man field for this week's *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour* stop. For the fourth consecutive year, the Reno Rodeo is playing host to the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association's (PRCA) best bull riders and bulls as they compete for a shot at the title on June 15 at 7 p.m. PT.

Reno is the fifth Xtreme Bulls tour destination in 2006. Jarrod Ford of Greeley, Colo., won the first event in San Antonio on Feb. 3, while Austin claimed the title in San Antonio 10 days later. Steve Woolsey took top honors April 27 at the Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo. Jason McClain of Lewis, Colo., won the last stop May 12 in Tulsa, Okla.

Fourteen of the top 15 bull riders in the current world standings, led by Austin, are

Rodeo News and Notes

- ▶ **Rodeo in Brazil.** Roughstock hand Cody DeMers of Kimberly, Idaho, and other PRCA cowboys enjoyed success and good times at the Jaguariuna Rodeo, May 18-21 in Jaguariuma, Brazil, just outside of Sao Paulo.

DeMers was part of the PRCA team sent to Brazil to compete at the event.

Bareback rider Dave Worsfold, an Australian now living in Gillette, Wyo., won his event title, while DeMers claimed the saddle bronc riding crown. Steve Woolsey of Eagle Mountain, Utah, was the top bull rider on four head.

"The stands were full," DeMers said. "There were more people to watch that rodeo than most rodeos I've ever been to. It was a carnival. What I've learned about Brazilians is they look for any reason to party. This was a big deal to them."

The event, organized by PRCA member Jim Ivory of Gillette, Wyo., also included PRCA pickup men Lewis Feild - a ProRodeo Hall of Fame member - and Van Vannoy; bull riders Zeb Lanham of Sweet, Idaho, and Wesley Silcox of Payson, Utah.

"We've sent a PRCA group over there several times, but we hadn't won anything," Feild said. "They were very hospitable and were happy to have us there. And they were excited that our guys won. It was a fabulous experience and neat to see."

- ▶ **Charitable CNFR.** This Friday's performance at the College National Finals Rodeo (CNFR) is being designed Tough Enough To Wear Pink (TETWP) night, and the Shane Drury Scholarship will be presented, as well.

The TETWP initiative, which was started during the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in 2005, supports research for breast cancer by wearing pink.

Drury, a 2000 National Finals Rodeo qualifier, has been battling cancer.

Money raised Friday will be split between the Susan G. Komen Foundation and the Shane Drury Scholarship.

- ▶ **Reno cattle drive starts.** The Reno (Nev.) Rodeo Cattle Drive is under way to kick off the 87th rodeo, led by trail boss Marie Gaspari-Crawford, the first woman to ever hold the title. The cattle drive is held over five days, leading a herd of 400 rodeo steers that are driven north of Reno, near the California state line, to the rodeo grounds in downtown Reno on June 15.

During the journey, 49 guests and the crew of 35 volunteers will travel 100 miles through Northern Nevada covering 2,300 acres. Guests will come from 12 states and as far away as the Netherlands.

Myers sweeps both rounds en route to title in Sisters

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Timed-event cowboy Cash Myers of Athens, Texas, put on a show at the Sisters (Ore.) Rodeo last weekend, winning both rounds in tie-down roping en route to the title.

Myers won the first round with a time of 9.2 seconds and added an 8.3-second run to win the second round. His total time of 17.5 seconds beat the rest of the field by more than 3 seconds.

He earned \$4,104 and moved into the Top 15 in tie-down roping.

Oregon roughstock riders claimed event titles in bareback riding and saddle bronc riding.

Bobby Mote, the 2002 world bareback riding champion from Culver, Ore.,

rode Beard Rodeo's Little Darling for 86 points and the title, worth \$4,318.

Johnny Hammack of Paulina, Ore., topped the saddle bronc riding field after his 81-point ride aboard Beard Rodeo's Back Door. Hammack earned \$4,617 for his efforts.

Other champions in Sisters were Zeb Lanham, Sweet, Idaho, bull riding, 86 points on Corey and Horst Rodeo's Far North, \$4,916; Rod Lyman, Victor, Mont., steer wrestling, 10.2 seconds on two, \$3,656; Jake Stanley, Hermiston, Ore./Brady Minor, Ellensburg, Wash., team roping, 11.7 seconds on two, \$2,475 each; and Kelli Kamm, Stanfield, Ore., barrel racing, 17.74 seconds, \$2,940.

Brazile, Skelton rope win in Garden City

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Three-time world all-around champion Trevor Brazile of Decatur, Texas, teamed with eight-time world team roping champion Rich Skelton of Llano, Texas, to win the team roping average title last weekend at the Beef Empire Days Rodeo in Garden City, Kan.

The tandem tied for third in the first round and tied for first in the second round. Each won \$3,687 after roping two steers in 11.8 seconds.

Brazile also was the rodeo's all-around champion, winning \$3,819 between team roping and tie-down roping.

Bull rider B.J. Schumacher of Hillsboro, Wis., had the highest-scored

ride of the rodeo, a 90-point effort aboard Frontier Rodeo's Slobber Knocker, good for \$2,579.

Chad Klein of Stephenville, Texas, won the bareback riding title. He scored 86 points on Korkow Rodeo's Spiked Punch and won \$2,200.

Other champions in Garden City were Matt Hebbert, Hyannis, Neb., and Marty Hebb, Eagle Butte, S.D., saddle bronc riding, 84 points on Korkow Rodeo's Surprise and Queenie, respectively, \$2,319 each; Kolby Ungeheuer, Columbus, Kan., tie-down roping, 19.9 seconds on two, \$3,004; and Gabe Ledoux, Kaplan, La., steer wrestling, 9.5 seconds on two, \$3,755.

scheduled to ride in Reno. Bobby Welsh of Gillette, Wyo., who suffered a shoulder injury at the last *Ride Hard Tour* stop in Tulsa, Okla., is not in the 40-man lineup.

In Xtreme Bulls, every contestant competes in the semifinal round, with the top 15 performers advancing to the Dodge round. The winner of the two-head average wins that stop's title. Monies won at Xtreme Bulls count toward the ProRodeo World Standings, which determines qualifiers for the Wrangler NFR, Nov. 30-Dec. 9 in Las Vegas.

ESPN and ESPN2 are the exclusive networks for Dodge Xtreme Bulls, which will broadcast the Reno highlights in a one-hour show on July 15 at 2 p.m. ET on ESPN and July 13 at midnight ET on ESPN2.

in bareback riding, barrel racing, breakaway roping, bull riding, goat tying, saddle bronc riding, team roping, tie-down roping, and steer wrestling.

Student athletes will also be competing for more than \$200,000 in scholarships from the U.S. Smokeless Tobacco Co. Scholarship Awards Program.

This year's field is highlighted by the return of three reigning champions: men's all-around and bareback riding - Ben Londo, Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo; and team roping - Ryan Carter/Kollin Von Ahn, Southeast Oklahoma State University.

Four previous champions also made it back to Casper: bareback rider Ryan Gray of Texas Tech, who won the 2004 title while attending Odessa (Texas) College; Marty Eakin of West Texas A&M, the 2004 tie-down roping champion; Hunter Cure of Texas Tech, who won the 2004

steer wrestling title; and Chad Day of Dickinson (N.D.) State University, who was the team roping (heading) champ in 2004.

Last year's other champions are as follows: Men's and women's team - Tarleton State University (Stephenville, Texas); women's all-around - Marcey Teixeira, Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo; steer wrestling - Tyrel Turner, Central Wyoming College and Trel Etbauer, Oklahoma Panhandle State University; saddle bronc riding - Cory Horwedel, Oklahoma Panhandle State University; tie-down roping - Ryan Watkins, Tarleton State University; bull riding - Matt Austin, Hill (Texas) College; barrel racing - Nataly Tatone, University of Nevada Las Vegas; breakaway roping - Erica Brown, Oklahoma Panhandle State University; and goat tying - Stephanie Jacks, Wharton County (Texas) Junior College.

Lanham rides to triumph in Livermore

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Bull rider Zeb Lanham of Sweet, Idaho, rode Growney Brothers Rodeo's Hearts of Gold for 87 points to win his event title at the Livermore (Calif.) Rodeo.

Lanham, who also won the bull riding title at the Sisters (Ore.) Rodeo during the weekend, earned \$3,249 in Livermore.

Cash Myers of Athens, Texas, also had success in both Sisters and Livermore. Myers claimed Livermore's

one-head title with a time of 8.6 seconds, good for \$1,857.

Other winners were Paul Jones, Elko, Nev., bareback riding, 80 points; Justin Arnold, Atascadero, Calif., saddle bronc riding, 81 points; Linn Churchill, Valentine, Neb., 4.6 seconds; Justin Spence, Modesto, Calif./Gary Ford, Denair, Calif., team roping, 5.4 seconds; and Rachael Myllymaki, Arlee, Mont., barrel racing, 17.56 seconds.

Just like with the 12-city Wrangler Winter Tour, which kicked off in January in Denver, contestants competing in the 12-city Summer Tour select 10 of the 12 events as his/her official Wrangler Tour entries. This change allows contestants flexibility when deciding when and where to compete.

The rest of the Wrangler Tour rodeos, and their locations, are: World's Oldest Rodeo (Prescott, Ariz.); Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo (Colorado Springs, Colo.); California Rodeo Salinas; Cheyenne (Wyo.) Frontier Days; Dodge City (Kan.) Round-Up Rodeo; Farm-City Pro Rodeo (Hermiston, Ore.); Caldwell (Idaho) Night Rodeo; Ellensburg (Wash.) Rodeo; Puyallup (Wash.) Rodeo; Pendleton (Ore.) Round-Up; and New Mexico State Fair (Albuquerque).

Reno all-around and average champions win a set of spurs and a jumpstart into the lucrative Fourth of July run. Since 1998, seven cowboys and one cowgirl have walked out of Reno with championship spurs and later that year won a world title: Trevor Brazile (all-around, 2002-03, tie-down roping, 2004); Dan Mortensen (saddle bronc, 2003); Cody Ohl (all-around, 2001); Jeff Collins (bareback riding, 2000); Speed Williams/Rich Skelton (team roping, 2000); Ty Murray (all-around, 1998); and Kristie Peterson (barrel racing, 1998).
