Champs top list

Brazile, Mortensen rake in the most over lucrative Cowboy Christmas week

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Trevor Brazile and Dan Mortensen topped the Cowboy Christmas leaderboard, earning nearly \$47,000 between them in eight days.

Brazile of Decatur, Texas, the three-time world all-around champion, bagged \$24,894 in tie-down roping, team roping (with Rich Skelton) and steer roping. His top payday took place at the West of the Pecos (Texas) Rodeo, where he doubled up, winning average titles in tie-down roping and steer roping for a combined \$12,801. He won the tie-down roping title in Window Rock, Ariz., and also placed at rodeos in Greeley, Colo., and Prescott, Ariz., in both tie-down roping and team roping.

He added to his leads in the all-around, tie-down roping and steer roping. He is seeking his first event world title.

Mortensen of Billings, Mont., a six-time world saddle bronc riding champion, won \$21,770 at seven rodeos, highlighted by an 85-point ride at the Cody (Wyo.) Stampede. He shared the title and won \$8,955.

He also won the title at Livingston (Mont.) Round Up with an 84-point ride that

was worth \$4,161. He also placed at three Canadian rodeos – Swift Current, Airdrie and Williams Lake – along with Greeley, Colo.; and Dickinson, N.D.

Brazile and Mortensen were among eight cowboys to win at least \$15,000 since July 27, when the Fourth of July run officially began.

Luke Branquinho of Los Alamos, Calif., the 2004 world steer wrestling champion, won \$20,722 in only three rodeos. He claimed average titles in Greeley, Colo., and St. Paul, Ore., and finished fifth in Cody, Wyo.

Clayton Williams of Carthage, Texas, won the most among bull riders, bagging \$19,395. More than half (\$11,229) came after winning the title in Cody, Wyo. He also tied for second in St. Paul, Ore., and placed at the Lexington, Ky., stop on the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour*, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches.

Other top performances came from Cody Wright of Milford, Utah (\$19,228), J.C. Bean of Goldendale, Wash. (\$19,123), Cody DeMoss of Heflin, La., (\$15,518) and Joe Beaver of Huntsville, Texas (\$15,470).

Lyman highlights Prescott champs

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Steer wrestler Rod Lyman celebrated America's birthday with a fireworks-type performance at the World's Oldest Rodeo in Prescott, Ariz.

Lyman, of Victor, Mont., smoked the field with a three head total of 16.6 seconds, while Justin Blaine Davis was second with a 19.1. Lyman, a 16-time Wrangler National Finals Rodeo qualifier, finished in a tie for fourth in the first round and placed second in the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with a

time of 5.1 seconds. Lyman added \$4,375 to his 2006 rodeo earnings and moved to the top of the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour standings with 23.50 points, just half a point better than reigning world champion Lee Graves.

Davis, of Bartonville, Texas, won the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round, stopping the clock in 4.3 seconds.

The World's Oldest Rodeo marked the

► **Bean wins in Kentucky.** J.C. Bean of Goldendale, Wash., was the only rider to cover all three bulls at the Lexington, Ky., edition of the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour*, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches. Bean scored 258.5 points and earned \$12,859 in Rupp Arena on June 30-July 1.

See all the rides and wrecks from Lexington on July 15 at 3 p.m. ET and July 22 at 11 p.m. ET on ESPN2.

In the first round, Bean scored 82.5 points on Silverado Rodeo Company's Tootie Fruity but didn't place in the second round. His 90.5-point ride aboard Harlan Robertson's Texas clinched Bean's first Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour-stop title.

► **Author to visit Hall.** Alan Geoffrion, the author of *Broken Trail*, a book that was turned into an AMC two-part miniseries starring Robert Duvall and Thomas Haden Church, will be at the ProRodeo Hall of Fame in Colorado Springs, Colo., on the afternoon of July 19 to sign copies of his book.

Set in the 1880s, *Broken Trail* follows the story of two horsemen (Duvall and Church) who wrangle horses for sale to the British empire and become involved in the lives of five Chinese women who were being kidnapped and sold in the West. The miniseries aired June 25-26 and was AMC's first original production.

Geoffrion's 248-page book is in its fourth printing with Fulcrum Publishing and was released earlier this year. He and Duvall are neighbors in Tennessee, and the two decided to work together on the project because of their love of horses and the Western lifestyle. Geoffrion is co-owner of the Virginia-based Campbell House Stables, which has provided horses to buyers across the country for years.

second stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale upon the conclusion of the Summer Tour.

The ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale will be held Sept. 28-30 in Omaha, Neb. Eight of the 12 stops, including Prescott, on the Summer Tour will be televised on Fox Sports Network. Check local listings for times in your area.

Bareback rider Andy Martinez has been on a tear since winning the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out title in May. Martinez, of Pavillion, Wyo., captured the average title with 165 points on two head and moved to the top of the Tour standings with 49 points. Martinez, who won the Tour round at the first stop in Reno, Nev., finished second in the Tour Round with an 84 on Vold Rodeo's I'm A Tiger. Jerad Schlegel of Burns, Colo., rode Vold Rodeo's Sheep Tick for 85 points to win the Tour Round and finish in a tie for second in the average with Wes Stevenson with a two head total of 160 points. Martinez pocketed \$5,022.

Texas team ropers David Key and Kory Koontz made good use of their time in Arizona. Key, of Caldwell, and Koontz, of Sudan, won the average with a three-head total of 18.4 seconds. The duo won the first round with a time of 5.9 seconds and later finished fourth in the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with a time of 6.3 seconds. All totaled they each left Prescott \$5,697 richer.

David Motes and Richard Durham picked up the Tour Round victory after stopping the clock in 5.7 seconds. Shain Sproul and Cory Petska lead the Tour standings with 39 points with Key and Koontz right on their heels with 33.

Canadian Rod Hay took care of business in Prescott, winning the Tour Round and average titles. Hay, of Wildwood, Alberta, rode Frontier Rodeo's Linda Lou for 87-points to win the Tour Round and finished with a two head total of 166 points. Hay picked up checks worth \$5,939.

World standings leader Cody DeMoss finished three points behind Hay for the average title. DeMoss, of Heflin, La., finished with 163 points and picked up \$6,008 to extend his lead in the world standings. DeMoss also leads the saddle bronc riding field in the Tour standings with 31.50 points.

Justin Maass captured the Tour Round and average victories in Prescott. Maass, of Giddings, Texas, won the Tour Round with an 8.2-second run and picked up the average

title with 27.0 seconds on three head. Maass picked up checks totaling \$3,840.

Barrel racer Sheri Sinor Estrada placed in every round and won the Tour Round en route to the average title in Prescott. Sinor Estrada, of Alamogordo, N.M., finished fourth in the first round with a 17.51-second run, was third in the second round with a run of 17.47 and won the Tour Round, stopping the clock in 17.06 seconds. She finished with a three-run total of 52.04 seconds, faster than two-time world champion Sherry Cervi, who tallied a 52.46-second average.

The bulls were the big winners during the Tour round in Prescott. Shawn Proctor of Tooele, Utah, was the only one to make the eight-second whistle. He rode Broken Arrow Rodeo's Superjacket for 82 points, giving him the average title with 154 points on two head. 2004 World Champion Dustin Elliott finished second in the average with 83 points on one, after first round winner Jarrod Craig missed the Tour Round. Craig, of Hillsboro, Texas, won the first round with an 85 on Broken Arrow's China Grove. Proctor won checks totaling \$4,447, while Elliott picked up \$5,035.

This was the first year for Prescott to be a stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour.

The next stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour will be the Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo in Colorado Springs, Colo., July 16.
