Tour heads West

California Rodeo Salinas plays host to next stop on 2006 summer series

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – For the sixth year in a row, the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour's summer series makes it way West to California Rodeo Salinas. In 2005, the rodeo ranked No. 13 in PRCA rodeos in terms of prize money with a purse of nearly \$280,000.

Action from Salinas, located just off the central California coast about 100 miles south of San Francisco, starts at 6:30 p.m. PT on July 20 for the first of two evening shows. Both weekend performances, including the Wrangler Tour round, are set for 1:15 p.m.

California Rodeo Salinas marks the fourth stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale upon the conclusion of the Summer Tour.

The ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale will

be held Sept. 28-30 in Omaha, Neb. Eight of the 12 stops, including Salinas, on the Summer Tour will be televised on Fox Sports Network. Check local listings for times in your area.

California Rodeo Salinas joined the ProRodeo Tour in 2001.

Last year, bareback rider Ryan Gray of Lubbock, Texas, finished second in the Tour Round and repeated as average champion, scoring 167 points on two head.

Other aggregate champions were steer wrestler Linn Churchill of Valentine, Neb.; team ropers Jakes Barnes of Scottsdale, Ariz./Kory Koontz of Sudan, Texas; saddle bronc rider Bradley Harter of Weatherford, Texas; tie-down roper Monty Lewis of Hereford, Texas; bull rider Jake Littlefield of West Point, Miss.; and barrel racer Sherry Cervi of Marana, Ariz.

New partners win title in Colorado

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – First-year partners Cody Odell and Boogie Ray had set out in 2006 to just get some runs under their belts as a new team. Halfway through the season, they have their eyes on the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo.

The duo from Texas took a big step on Sunday afternoon at the Norris-Penrose Event Center in Colorado Springs, Colo. Odell, of Brashear, and Ray, of Mabank, roped their steer in 5.1 seconds to finish one-tenth of a second out of the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round title but won the average crown with a three-head total of 15.9 seconds, 1.1 seconds ahead of the second-place team of Matt Sherwood and Walt

Woodard.

Ray, who qualified for the Wrangler NFR in 2003, is looking to make a return trip with Odell, who is a steer wrestler-turned-team roper looking for his first trip to the big dance. The team took home \$3,133 each and some valuable Tour points as they head into the second half of the 2006 season.

Shane Schwenke of Harlem, Mont., and his partner Jhett Johnson of Casper, Wyo., won the Tour Round by stopping the clock in 5.0 seconds.

The Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo marked the third stop on the 2006 Wrangler

► **CNFR on TV.** Coverage from the recently completed College National Finals Rodeo in Casper, Wyo., will be aired on College Sports Television in August as a part of four one-hour shows starting at 9 p.m. ET.

CSTV's coverage of the CNFR opens with the "Bulls and Broncs" competition on Aug. 9 and Aug. 11.

Two shows are being dedicated to the CNFR's final round on Aug. 16 and Aug. 18.

ProRodeo announcers Bob Tallman, a member of the ProRodeo Hall of Fame, and perennial Wrangler National Finals Rodeo announcer Boyd Polhamus host the CNFR coverage with Anna Hunt conducting interviews.

CSTV is available on DirecTV (Channel 610) and Dish Network (Channel 152).

► **Stampede headed toward record.** The Calgary Stampede, which ended its 10-day run on July 16, was on the verge of setting an attendance record for the third straight year.

"For the last two years, we've set new attendance records and revenue records, and I think we're well on our way to a third straight year," Stampede president and chairman Steve Allan told the *Calgary Sun*. "We said at the beginning that we were going to have the best Stampede ever and we delivered."

Heading into the final day, attendance figures were 29,000 ahead of the record pace from 2005, when 1,242,928 patrons went through the Calgary turnstiles.

► **Summer Finale tickets.** Tickets for the Summer ProRodeo Tour Finale, Sept. 28-30 at the Qwest Center in Omaha, Neb., are now on sale. The event features the top contestants of the Summer Wrangler ProRodeo Tour.

Tickets start at just \$15 and include admission to nightly concerts featuring Diamond Rio (Sept. 28), Big & Rich, featuring Cowboy Troy (Sept. 29) and Sugarland (Sept. 30).

Colorado bareback rider Tim Shirley finished atop the U.S. Smokeless Tobacco Co. scoreboard with an 84-point ride aboard Vold Rodeo's Sheep Tick to win the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round.

Unfortunately it was not enough for the cowboy from Conifer to capture the average crown. That went to Nevada's Paul Jones, who tallied 168 points on two head. Jones, of Elko, finished in a tie for first in the first round with an 86-point ride and followed it up with an 82 in the Tour Round atop Vold Rodeo's Painted Valley. Jones picked up checks totaling \$6,646, while Shirley walked away with \$3,644.

Chad Hagan saved the best for last on Sunday afternoon. Hagan, of Leesville, La., was the last man out in the steer wrestling competition thanks to a two-head total of 8.0 seconds coming into the final round. He could have played it safe in an effort to capture the average title, but he showed the fans what a champion is made of. He turfed his steer in 3.5 seconds, winning the Tour Round and the average with a three-head total of 11.5 seconds. His closest competitor in the average was Dru Melvin of Tyron, Neb., with a total time of 12.2 seconds. Hagan left Colorado Springs \$4,837 richer.

Steve Dollarhide and Matt Hebbert shared the Tour Round title in the saddle bronc riding with identical 82-point scores. Dollarhide, of Wikieup, Ariz., rode Vold Rodeo's Eclipse, while Hebbert, of Hyannis, Neb., showed his stuff on Vold Rodeo's Hanger. Dollarhide used his ride to propel him to the top of the leaderboard in the average with a two-head total of 162 points. He collected checks totaling \$6,365, while Hebbert won \$2,083.

PRCA rookie tie-down roper Randall Carlisle looked like a veteran on Sunday by turning in a 7.9-second run. Carlisle, of Lipan, Texas, was the first roper out and set a pace that no other roper would catch. Scott Kormos of Teague, Texas, was the closest with his 8.1-second run. Kormos

captured the average title with a total time of 25.4 seconds on three head and pocketed \$5,132.

Making a name for herself on the pro circuit is North Carolina barrel racer Codi Baucom. Baucom, of Carthage, entered the final round in the lead with a two-run total of 34.15 seconds, and remained atop the leaderboard with a total time of 51.52 seconds for three runs. Brandie Halls of Carpenter, Wyo., put the heat on Baucom, turning in a smoking 16.96-second run to win the Tour Round and finish second in the average with a three-run total of 51.67.

Marcus Michaelis of Caldwell, Idaho, took home the average title with a total of 152 points on two head. He posted a 74-point score in the first round and followed it up with a 78 in the Tour Round aboard Triple V Rodeo's High Yella. Ross Kleven and Jed Moore shared the Tour-Round victory with identical 81-point rides. Kleven, of Westminster, Colo., rode Frontier Rodeo's No. 69, while Moore, of Cheyenne, Wyo., faced Frontier Rodeo's BA.

The next stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour will be the California Rodeo Salinas on July 22.

Seven members earn induction into Hall

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - It was a day of celebration for seven deserving individuals as they were inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame and Museum of the American Cowboy in Colorado Springs, Colo., in front of a crowd of 1,200.

The day began with a patriotic opening and The National Day of the Cowboy committee presented a flag to the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. Red Steagall served as the Master of Ceremonies.

This year's class included two-time bull riding world champion Jim Sharp of Stephenville, Texas; 1982 all-around world champion and 1986 tie-down roping world champion Chris Lybbert of Forestburg, Texas; six-time Wrangler National Final Rodeo bullfighter and five-time world champion bullfighter Rob

Smets of Merkel, Texas; 1960 world champion steer wrestler Bob A. Robinson of Hagerman, Idaho; long-time rodeo supporters John and Mildred Farris of Addington, Okla.; and the late Doc Sorensen of Idaho Falls, Idaho, who created the Flying U Rodeo Co. and produced rodeos in Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, Utah, Oregon and Arizona.

"This is a great day to celebrate our Western Heritage and we are honored to induct seven deserving individuals into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame today," said PRCA Commissioner Troy Ellerman.

The Class of 2006 brings the Hall's total members to 189 people and 23 animals.

Wright leads group of cowboys who fatten wallets at \$1.6 million Stampede

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - In 2003, it took saddle bronc rider Cody Wright of Milford, Utah, 10 days to earn \$101,118, doing so at the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, the world's premier rodeo where world champions are crowned every year in Las Vegas.

On July 16, it took Wright exactly 8 seconds to win \$100,000 at the Calgary Stampede, with its eye-boggling purse of \$1.6 million is the world's most lucrative rodeo. He rode Kesler Rodeo's Shady Cat for 90.5 points during "Showdown Sunday," where the top four contestants from the two pools ride and rope for the Calgary Stampede championship.

Wright, who earlier earned \$14,000 in preliminary rounds, walked out of Calgary with \$114,000.

Newly restructured for 2006, the Calgary Stampede consisted of a tournament-style rodeo where the contestants were divided into two pools. The top four money winners in each pool advanced to Sunday's lucrative round. The remaining six competitors in both pools competed for wild-card berths on Saturday, with the top two in each event moving on to Sunday's event.

Other "Showdown Sunday" winners, and total earnings, were bareback rider Davey Shields Jr., of Bashaw, Alberta (\$106,833); steer wrestler Curtis Cassidy of Donalda, Alberta (\$112,500); tie-down roper Jerome Schneeberger of Ponca City, Okla. (\$107,000); barrel racer Joleen Seitz of

Savona, British Columbia (\$107,000); and bull rider Ross Coleman of Molalla, Ore. (\$108,000).

Earnings from Calgary don't count toward the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings nor the standings that determine qualifiers for the Canadian Finals Rodeo.

Shields, who previously won the Stampede's \$50,000 bonus round in 1996 and 2005, claimed the top prize after scoring 91.5 points on Calgary Stampede's Coconut Roll. He is a three-time Canadian champion and four-time Wrangler NFR qualifier. Shields' score was one point better than reigning world bareback champion Will Lowe of Canyon, Texas.

Cassidy, the two-time Canadian High-Point Champion, downed his Showdown steer in 3.4 seconds, two-tenths of a second ahead of Luke Branquinho of Los Alamos, Calif., the 2004 world steer wrestling champion.

Schneeberger watched reigning all-around champion Ryan Jarrett of Summerville, Ga., rope and tie his calf in 7.3 seconds, then went out and beat him by the slimmest of margins with a 7.2-second run.

Coleman was the only bull rider rider to make the eight-second whistle, scoring 92.5 points on Kesler Championship Rodeo's Shiver N Shake.

Seitz completed the pattern in 17.39 seconds for the big payoff. June Holeman of Arcadia, Neb., was second at 17.53.
