Six down, six to go

Dodge City marks Tour's halfway point

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The first half of the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour's summer series wraps up this weekend at the Dodge City Roundup Rodeo. The event, marking its third consecutive year on the Wrangler Tour, gets under way on Aug. 2 with the first of five daily performances at 7:45 p.m. CT at the Dodge City Roundup Arena and concludes with the Wrangler Tour round on Aug. 6.

The rodeo, located in this southwestern Kansas town about a three-hour drive west of Wichita, has been honored by the PRCA nine times as the Rodeo Committee of the Year in 1985-90, as the Outdoor Rodeo Committee of the Year in 1991-92 and the Large Outdoor Rodeo Committee of the Year in 2001.

The Dodge City Roundup Rodeo gives cowboys and cowgirls their sixth opportunities on the 12-city summer Tour at earning Wrangler Tour points in hopes of qualifying for the ProRodeo Summer Tour Finale, Sept. 28-30, in Omaha, Neb. Only the top 12 cowboys and cowgirls in each event's Tour standings following the final Tour stop in Albuquerque, N.M., qualify for the Finale.

Eight of the 12 stops on the Summer

Tour, including Dodge City, will be televised on Fox Sports Network. Check local listings for times in your area.

ProRodeo Hall of Fame stock contractor Harry Vold of Harry Vold Rodeo Company is once again providing his award-winning livestock to the Dodge City Roundup Rodeo.

Last year, five-time world saddle bronc riding champion Billy Etbauer of Edmond, Okla., claimed both the Wrangler Tour round and average title en route to qualifying for his 17th consecutive Wrangler NFR. He clinched the crown with an 88-point ride on Vold's Linda Lou in the final round.

Also, homestate cowboy Cooper Kanngiesser of Zenda – some 115 miles to the east of Dodge City – won the bull riding average on the heels of an 83-point ride aboard Frontier Rodeo's Jack 'O Diamonds in the Tour Round.

Other event aggregate champions were bareback rider D.V. Fennell of Stroud, Okla.; steer wrestler Bob Lummus of Folsom, Miss.; team ropers Jake Barnes of Scottsdale, Ariz./Kory Koontz of Sudan, Texas; tie-down roper Trevor Brazile of Anson, Texas; and barrel racer Brandie Halls of Carpenter, Wyo.

Cowboys enjoy big Cheyenne paydays

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Bareback rider Forest Bramwell and bull rider Dustin Elliott were both ranked in the top 15 of the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings heading into the 110th annual Cheyenne (Wyo.) Frontier Days. However, both cowboys were looking for big wins on Sunday to not only close the gap between them and the top place in the world standings, but to also gain valuable Tour points at the fifth stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour.

Bramwell, of Pagosa Springs, Colo., was ranked 12th in the world standings with

\$34,615 and was matched against Broken Arrow's Hard Luck in the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour round. He rode the horse to an 85-point ride to finish with a total of 250 points on three head, good for \$15,880.

J.D. Garrett Jr., of Grandview, Texas, won the Tour Round after posting an 86-point ride on Vold Rodeo's Dusty Dan.

Elliott entered the Tour round 11th in the world standings with \$48,388 but by the end of the day he had added \$19,962 to his bottom

Rodeo News and Notes

- ▶ **NFR announcer Harwood dies.** Jay Harwood of Chinook, Mont., a five-time National Finals Rodeo announcer and PRCA gold card member, died July 29 of a heart attack while preparing to announce the Gallup (N.M.) Inter-Tribal Indian Ceremonial Rodeo. He was 69.

Funeral services are scheduled for 11 a.m. Aug. 4 at the Pondera Funeral Home in Conrad, Mont.

Harwood, born July 27, 1939, in Browning, Mont., first announced at an amateur rodeo in Brewster, Wash., an eventually went on to announce the NFR in Oklahoma City five times (1974-75, 1978, 1980 and 1982) in addition to the Canadian Finals Rodeo (1975-76).

Harwood is survived by his wife, Diana; sons Terry, Tom, Fred, Jay, Charles, Clint; daughter, Donna; and several grandchildren.

Harwood served 38 years with the Indian Health Service as a senior executive service appointee, where he earned the military rank Brigadier General. In 2005, he was inducted into the Montana Pro Rodeo Hall and Wall of Fame as a Montana rodeo announcer legend.

- ▶ **Brazile, O'Neill win in Deadwood.** Three-time world all-around champion Trevor Brazile of Anson, Texas, along with reigning world saddle bronc riding champion Jeff Willert of Belvidere, S.D., and Glen O'Neill of Didsbury, Alberta, the 2002 world saddle bronc riding champion, were among the group of winners at the recently concluded Deadwood (S.D.) Days of '76 Rodeo.

Brazile, who holds the top spot in the all-around, tie-down roping and steer roping, recorded a time of 16.8 seconds on two head and earned \$3,678.

O'Neill and Willert were two of three saddle bronc riders to score 85 points to split the title. They were joined by Marty Hebb of Eagle Butte, S.D. Each earned \$3,270.

Other average champions in Deadwood were Tyson Thompson, Templeton, Calif., bareback riding, 89 points on Korkow Rodeos' Booger's Pet, \$3,895; Clint Craig, Mena, Ark., bull riding, 91 points on Korkow Rodeos' Redneck, \$3,548; Jake Rinehart, Highmore, S.D., steer wrestling, 8.1 seconds on two head, \$5,291; Turtle Powell, Alpine, Texas/Mickey Gomez, Snyder, Texas, team roping, 12.2 seconds on two head, \$2,295 each; Scott Snedecor, Uvalde, Texas, steer roping, 34.1 seconds on three head, \$4,939; and Terra Bynum, Lubbock, Texas, and Jill Moody, Letcher, S.D., barrel racing, 16.46 seconds, \$2,867 each.

- ▶ **CNFR on TV.** Coverage from the recently completed College National Finals Rodeo in Casper, Wyo., will be aired on College Sports Television in August as a part of four one-hour shows starting at 9 p.m. ET.

CSTV's coverage of the CNFR opens with the "Bulls and Broncs" competition on Aug. 9 and Aug. 11.

line. He posted a 91-point ride on Triple V Rodeo's Q to win the Tour Round and secure the average title with 256 points on three head.

The Cheyenne (Wyo.) Frontier Days marked the fifth stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale upon the conclusion of the Summer Tour. The ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale will be held Sept. 28-30 in Omaha, Neb.

Clint Robinson has been on a roll as of late and he notched the biggest win of his career on Sunday, winning the tie-down roping title at the Cheyenne Frontier Days. Robinson, of Spanish Fork, Utah, finished more than three seconds ahead of the rest of the field with a three-head total of 37.1 seconds and pocketed \$19,597. It marked the second consecutive big weekend for Robinson, who won \$14,065 after picking up the all-around, team roping and tie-down roping titles at his hometown rodeo in Spanish Fork and the all-around title at the Ogden (Utah) Pioneer Days Rodeo.

Five-time world champion tie-down roper Cody Ohl won the Tour Round with a blistering time of 11.1 seconds and finished second in the average with a total time of 40.2 seconds on three head.

Six-time world champion saddle bronc rider Dan Mortensen was a little cautious when he saw his draw for the Tour Round in Cheyenne. He had drawn a familiar foe, Burch Rodeo's Blood Brother, which he had been on three previous times. Prior to the Sunday match-up, the score was 2-1 in favor of Blood Brother. Mortensen, of Billings, Mont., led the average with 168 points on two head and would be the final competitor to nod his head in the final round.

Mortensen matched the horse jump for jump and finished with an 83-point ride, winning the average with a three head total of 251 points and tied for the Tour Round win with Cody Wright of Milford, Utah. Wright teamed with Gold Buckle Rodeo's Grengo Honeymoon for 83 points.

Mortensen, who picked up his second career win in Cheyenne, finished second in the first round with a score of 85 points and placed third in the second round with an 83-point ride. In all he picked up \$18,843.

Steer wrestler Linn Churchill was the biggest money winner in Cheyenne, leaving the Wyoming State Capitol with \$23,446. Churchill, of Valentine, Neb., won the average with a three-head total of 22.0 seconds,

1.3 seconds ahead of his closest competitor Glen Clark with a total time of 23.3. The 37-year old finished fourth in the first round with at time of 6.6 seconds, won the second round in 6.3 seconds and secured his first average title at Cheyenne with a 9.1-second run in the Tour Round, good for fourth. Clark, of Streetman, Texas, won the Tour Round with a 7.3-second run.

Team ropers Colter Todd and Cesar de la Cruz found out on Sunday that anything is possible in Cheyenne. Todd, of Marana, Ariz., and de la Cruz, of Tucson, Ariz., entered the final round nearly a second behind the leaders Jay and Randon Adams of Logandale, Nev. The young duo went out and made a solid run, stopping the clock in 9.5 seconds and captured their first Cheyenne title and checks totaling \$14,804 each. The duo from Arizona was second in the first round with a time of 7.2 seconds, finished out of the money in the second round and was third in the Tour Round with a time of 9.5 seconds to secure the average title. Garrett Tonozzi of Fruita, Colo., and York Gill of Memphis, Tenn., won the Tour Round, stopping the clock in 8.8 seconds.
