No Tour, no problem

Week off in Wrangler summer series doesn't mean lack of lucrative rodeos

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – For the past eight weekends, the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour's summer series has been going virtually non stop. But when the series takes this weekend off, don't expect PRCA cowboys to follow suit.

There's just too much going on despite the Wrangler Tour's short hiatus.

Thirty PRCA-sanctioned rodeos from Georgia to the West Coast highlight the week ahead, with most of the action focusing on two small towns in Washington separated by some four hours, another in a coastal valley overlooking the Pacific Ocean in southern California and one in the scenic Rocky Mountains in Colorado.

Washington plays host to the Kitsap County Fair and Rodeo and Horse Heaven Roundup in Bremerton and Kennewick, respectively. Both events start Aug. 23 and end Aug. 26.

Bremerton offers \$6,500 added money per event in its four-performance rodeo, which begins each day at 7 p.m. PT. Growney Brothers Rodeo Company is the

primary stock contractor, while Korkow Rodeos, Powder River Rodeo LLC, Sankey Rodeo Company and Western Rodeos, Inc., also are supplying livestock for the rodeo.

Kennewick also has four performances, starting at 7:25 p.m. each day, and offers \$5,500 added money in each event. Flying Five Rodeo Company and Big Bend Rodeo Company are bringing their world-class livestock to the rodeo.

In just five years, the Rancho Mission Viejo Rodeo in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., has become one of the PRCA's best. The rodeo, located halfway between Los Angeles and San Diego, is ProRodeo's biggest two-day rodeo, offering \$20,000 of added money in each event. The event starts Aug. 26 at 4 p.m. PT and ends Aug. 27 at 1:30 p.m.

The Colorado State Fair in Pueblo continues this week with daily performances at 7 p.m. MT. The event, which offers \$7,500 of added money in each event, starts Aug. 25 and continues with the fifth and final performance on Aug. 29.

Wright makes noise with Caldwell win

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Saddle bronc rider Cody Wright is one of the more quiet cowboys on the circuit today, but he let his riding do the talking at the Caldwell (Idaho) Night Rodeo on Saturday.

Wright, of Milford, Utah, won the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round en route to the average title and a \$7,071 payday. The 29-year old rode Burch Rodeo's Mullin Hill for 86 points to win the Tour Round and finish just one point ahead of Jesse Bail for the round victory. Wright finished the two head average with 170 points, two points ahead of

Bryce Miller with 166. Wright turned in an 82-point ride aboard Burch Rodeo's Kern River to finish fourth in the first round, a round won by 2002 World Champion Glen O'Neill with an 86-point ride aboard Powder River Rodeo's Sundown.

The Caldwell (Idaho) Night Rodeo marked the eighth stop on the 2006 Wrangler ProRodeo Summer Tour. Contestants not only compete for money at the Tour rodeos, but for valuable Tour points that qualify them for the

- **Brazile extends lead in Canby.** Trevor Brazile of Decatur, Texas, a three-time world all-around champion, teamed with eight-time world team roping champ Rich Skelton to win the team roping average title at the Clackamas County Fair and Rodeo in Canby, Ore.

Brazile also claimed the rodeo's all-around title, winning \$4,634 in team roping and tie-down roping.

Brazile, with \$210,252 in all-around earnings, has a lead of more than \$112,000 over his nearest competitor, Clint Robinson of Spanish Fork, Utah.

The tandem earned \$3,419 after roping two steers in 9.7 seconds, tying the team of Keven Daniel of Altha, Fla., and Nick Simmons of Colcord, Okla., who earned \$3,581 each.

ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale upon the conclusion of the Summer Tour.

The ProRodeo Tour Summer Finale will be held Sept. 28-30 in Omaha, Neb. Eight of the 12 stops, including Caldwell, on the Summer Tour will be televised on Fox Sports Network. Check local listings for times in your area.

The biggest money winner coming out of Caldwell this year was two-time world champion bareback rider Will Lowe, who finished atop the leaderboard in both rounds and won a total of \$8,961.

It was a logjam on the leaderboard in the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with three cowboys tying for first - Jess Davis, Royce Ford and Lowe. Lowe drew another horse out of the Burch Rodeo string, this time Big 85, while Davis climbed aboard Calgary Stampede's Coconut Roll and Ford was matched with Powder River Rodeo's Big Chill. They all rode to identical 84 point scores to share the Tour Round victory.

However, Lowe's two scores put him atop the leaderboard in the average with 170 points on two head. Scotty Drennan of Buffalo, Texas, finished second with 167.

Tie-down roper Mike Johnson continues to persevere despite the injuries he has sustained this year. Johnson, of Henryetta, Okla., started the year nursing a groin injury sustained at the 2005 Wrangler NFR and, as of late, has been battling an eye injury that happened when a rope popped back and hit him in the eye. On Saturday night, he proved that injuries aren't going to get him down as he roped and tied his calf in 7.9 seconds to win the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round and finished third in the average with a three-head total of 25.3 seconds.

Idaho's own Matt Shiozawa picked up the average win with a total time of 24.8 seconds on three head, while Cody Ohl of Hico, Texas, finished second with a total time of 25.2 seconds. Shiozawa, of Chubbuck, Idaho, finished sixth in the first round with a time of 8.3 seconds and tied for the win, with Jon Peek, in the second round with a rodeo best time of 7.8 seconds. Although he finished out of the money in the Tour Round, Shiozawa still picked up checks totaling \$7,883.

California steer wrestler Ethan Thouvenell emerged victorious in Caldwell winning the three-head average with a total time of 15.0 seconds. Thouvenell, of Knights Landing, finished out of the money in the first round but returned in the second round for a third place finish after posting a time of 4.3 seconds. He secured the average title

with a 4.9-second run in the Tour Round, which was quick enough for a third place finish in the round. Tanner Milan of Cochrane, Alberta, won the Tour Round with a rodeo best time of 3.7 seconds.

Team ropers Matt Sherwood and Walt Woodard are on track to qualify for their first Wrangler NFR as a team and they helped their cause with another \$6,520 each after winning the average title in Caldwell. Sherwood, of Snowflake, Ariz., and Woodard, of Stockton, Calif., won the three-head average with a time of 16.4 seconds. Britt Williams of Hammond, Mont., and Caleb Twisselman of Santa Margarita, Calif., won the Tour Round in 5.3 seconds.

It was a rough night for the bull riders as all 12 of them hit the arena dirt before the eight-second whistle in the Tour Round. As a result, the average title was shared by D.J. Domangue of San Angelo, Texas, and Logan Knibbe of Rockdale, Texas. Domangue rode Powder River Rodeo's Black Smoke in the first round, while Knibbe battled Powder River Rodeo's Holy Moley. They each scored 91 points, tying for the first round title, which eventually earned them shares of the average title. They each won \$8,376.
