# Spring's last call

## Guymon hosts final Tour stop until June

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days rodeo is marking its diamond anniversary, celebrating the Sooner State's Centennial and tallying another year as a Wrangler ProRodeo Tour stop, May 4-6.

Rodeo action at the Henry C. Hitch Pioneer Arena is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Friday, May 4, followed by two performances on Saturday, May 5 at 2 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., and wraps up with the short go-around at 2 p.m. on Sunday, May 6. Planned special entertainment for the short-go is Tommy Lucia and monkey, Whiplash.

A stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour since its inception in 2000, the Guymon Pioneer Days rodeo was voted the PRCA Large Outdoor Rodeo of the Year in 2002. The rodeo marks the final Tour stop until

the Reno (Nev.) Rodeo, June 15-23.

Other events in Guymon include the procession of riding clubs and mule trains at 11 a.m. on Friday, May 4. The Pioneer Day Parade is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, May 5. Rodeo Dances at the Elks are planned for the evenings of May 4 and May 5. The carnival is scheduled to run from May 2-5.

The Pioneer Days Celebration began in 1933 when city leaders wanted to hold a gathering to bring folks to town to help businesses in the midst of the Depression when Guymon was the epicenter of the Dust Bowl. Leaders chose to celebrate the first weekend in May to mark the Organic Act of May 2, 1890, which made "No Man's Land" – the Panhandle – part of the territory of Oklahoma.

## DeMers fights odds, wins in Corpus Christi

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Neither the elements, the fear of lost gear nor, prior knowledge of his draw could deter roughstock cowboy Cody DeMers. All that went out the window when the Kimberly, Idaho, cowboy set an arena record at the Buc Days Pro Rodeo in Corpus Christi, Texas, with a 90-point bareback ride aboard Frontier Rodeo's Buckskin Sal.

DeMers recorded the ride during the first performance on April 25, and the first 90-point ride in the 16-year history of the rodeo stood through the weekend and gave him a championship check worth \$5,095.

DeMers also won the rodeo's all-around title, earning a total of \$5,906 in bareback riding and saddle bronc riding.

It did however, come with a few obstacles.

## Veteran ropers gain ground in Clovis

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Team ropers David Key and Kory Koontz found themselves in unfamiliar positions entering the Clovis (Calif.) Rodeo. Both cowboys, who have 20 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo appearances between them, stood outside the top 15 ropers in both heading and heeling.

Following an impressive performance in Clovis, however, the two returned to familiar territory, serving notice that they could be a force once the season hits full stride next month. Key of Caldwell, Texas, and Koontz of Sudan, Texas, roped their Wrangler ProRodeo Tour-Round steer in a winning time of 5.4 seconds, clinching the aver-

## Rodeo News and Notes

- **Upgrade for Akin.** Doctors at Baptist Medical Center South in Montgomery, Ala. have gotten injured bull rider Lee Akin's seizures under control and are optimistic he can be moved out of the intensive care unit into a private room on April 30, Dr. Will Smith said April 27.

Akin, 32, suffered a traumatic brain injury March 8 after he was bucked off the bull Dick Dasterly and stepped on during the Southeastern Livestock Exposition and Rodeo. He has undergone two surgeries to relieve swelling in his brain and is facing a lengthy recovery period.

"He responds to his wife's voice sometimes by slowly turning his head toward her," Dr. Smith said, "but he does not speak and he does not respond to verbal commands to squeeze your hand or move his fingers. He can move his left leg and both arms, but it is not purposeful movement."

Akin, of Weatherford, Okla., qualified for the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in 2001, finishing third in the world standings with earnings of \$135,166 behind Blue Stone and Cody Hancock.

The PRCA Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund is supplying funds for the family's living expenses, but the greater concern is covering the cost of medical treatment. making scheduled stopover in Houston and instead went directly to Corpus Christi without his luggage, including his rodeo gear bag. Fortunately, DeMers' gear bag arrived about 40 minutes prior to the start of the rodeo.

"The score being that high and everything was great, but I was just excited to have everything come together," DeMers said.

DeMers' haul in Corpus Christi certainly helped his standing on the 2007 Wrangler ProRodeo Tour and his hopes of reaching the first of four Tour Playoff events later this summer. At the conclusion of the 21-stop tour in early August, the top 35 contestants in total Tour money and the "wild card," event champions from the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo, will move on to the first Tour Championship event, Aug. 14-18 in Caldwell, Idaho. Fox Sports Network and CBS are scheduled to televise all four playoff events.

Elsewhere, four saddle bronc riders scored 85 points to share the title; Jess Martin of Dillon, Mont.; Cody DeMoss of Heflin, La.; Bradley Harter of Weatherford, Texas; and Rod Hay of Wildwood, Alberta, each earned \$4,107.

Other champions in Corpus Christi were steer wrestler Chad Van Campen of Granada, Colo.; team ropers Coleman Proctor of Miami, Okla./Jake Long of Alva, Okla.; tie-down ropers Nathan Steinberg of Conroe, Texas, and

age title – 22.9 on four head – and checks worth \$5,984 each.

Key and Koontz were just a few of ProRodeo's top cowboys to earn titles at the Clovis Rodeo, which marked its 93rd edition in 2007.

Reigning and four-time world champion all-around cowboy Trevor Brazile of Decatur, Texas, earned the rodeo's tie-down roping average crown. Brazile roped and tied four calves in 33.8 seconds, outdistancing Wrangler Tour Round champion Blake Huckabee of Shreveport, La., by one second.

Steer wrestler Luke Branquinho of Los Alamos, Calif., the 2004 world champion, topped his event after four rounds. Branquinho recorded a total time of 22.9 seconds and pocketed \$3,825 following the three-day rodeo.

Other champions in Clovis were bareback rider Royce Ford of Briggsdale, Colo.; saddle bronc rider Cody Horwedel of Cholame, Calif.; bull rider Ted Bert of Modesto, Calif.; and barrel racer Molly Powell of Stephenville, Texas.
