Logandale hosts next Tour stop

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The Clark County Fair and Rodeo, which starts April 12, is making its fourth consecutive appearance on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour. This weekend, cowboys and cowgirls will not only compete for part of a purse that exceeded \$250,000 in 2006, but earnings that apply toward the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour and inclusion into the newly formed playoff system later this summer.

Logandale, which is located some 60 miles northeast of Las Vegas, is the ninth stop on the 21-city Tour. The four-performance rodeo, which wraps up on April 15, is first of two Silver State stops on the 2007 schedule. The Reno Rodeo hosts the 14th stop, June 15-23.

This year's Wrangler Tour consists of 21 rodeos through August. At the conclusion of the 21st rodeo, the top 35 contestants in total

Laughlin primed for Xtreme Bulls

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour* presented by B&W Trailer Hitches makes the first of two consecutive visits to Nevada this weekend. Fans at the Laughlin (Nev.) Arena – located some 90 miles south of Las Vegas – will see 40 of the top PRCA bull riders in the world go up against the best bulls and a shot at a total purse of \$50,000. The Tour visits the Reno Rodeo in June

Laughlin, the sixth stop on the 10-city Tour, features two matinee performances April 14-15. Each show is scheduled to start at 1 p.m. PT.

Dustin Elliott of North Platte, Neb., the 2004 world champion bull rider, and 2000 World Champion Bull Rider Cody Hancock of Taylor, Ariz., a two-time winner on the 2007 Xtreme Bulls Tour, headline the list of riders. Also scheduled to compete are

PRCA elections bring about new faces

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The results are in. PRCA members were notified on March 30 that they had been elected to serve on one of the PRCA's various Executive Councils and the PRCA Competition Committee.

Seven of the members were re-elected to the posts they have held for the past two years, while the other six are newly elected members. They will all serve two-year terms, and the other spots on the Executive Councils that were not up for vote this year will be voted on next year.

Ballots were mailed out on Feb. 24 and

were due back to the PRCA's auditors, who manage the elections, by March 26. The nearly 2,000 votes that were submitted were then processed, and the elected members officially took office on April 1.

The members who were re-elected were: Myron Duarte, bull riding representative, Contestant Executive Council; Bret Tonzzi, team roping representative, Contestant Executive Council; Jim Sutton, representative for committees adding \$10,001-\$25,000, Rodeo Committee Executive Council; John

- ▶ **Austin grounded for season.** Matt Austin, the 2005 world champion bull rider whose 2006 season was cut short by pelvic and groin injuries, recently underwent knee surgery and will miss the balance of this rodeo season.

Austin of Wills Point, Texas, who had surgery last Dec. 15 to repair several torn muscles in his abdominal and groin areas, had hoped to return to action at this weekend's Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour stop in Logandale, Nev. However, he injured his right knee recently while working at the family ranch and suffered a torn meniscus.

That, already complicated by a torn ACL in the same knee from a 2004 injury, led to surgery, which was performed April 3 in Dallas.

Expect to see Austin just in time for the 2008 rodeo season, which starts Oct. 1.

"I want to be riding, but I want to be 100 percent, too," said Austin, who was filling in the time by competing and finishing second out of 102 contestants in a bull futurity in Stephenville, Texas. "I'll be all healed up after this and get off to a fresh start in 2008. I tell my dad (Lonnie) that I'd done pretty well on one good leg. Now, I'll be riding with two good legs."

In 2005, Austin set the PRCA's single-season event earnings record with \$320,766 en route to his first world title.

The PRCA's Executive Council members perform a variety of functions crucial to the association. In addition, the Contestant Executive Council plays a direct role in setting entry fees for rodeos with total purses above \$10,000 and helps set policies on contestant compensation and qualifications.

The contestant representatives and general membership representative also serve on the PRCA's Competition Committee, which holds meetings to act on the rules
