PRCA strikes deal with Vegas property

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association recently signed an eight-year agreement with the South Point Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, owned by Michael Gaughan, making it the newest PRCA National Sponsor.

"We are excited to welcome Michael Gaughan and the South Point Hotel and Casino to our PRCA sponsor family," said PRCA Commissioner Troy Ellerman.

"Michael has always been an avid supporter of the sport of rodeo and a true friend to the contestants and PRCA alike. We look forward to continued growth with his sponsorship."

In the new agreement, the South Point will receive in-arena signage at the 10-day

Wrangler National Finals Rodeo and their flag will be flown during the nightly sponsor presentation that takes place between the tie-down roping and barrel racing. Along with having a presence at the Wrangler NFR, the South Point Hotel and Casino flag will be flown and introduced at PRCA-sanctioned rodeos during the year as an official national sponsor and be listed in all PRCA publications with the other national sponsors.

Another big change with this new agreement is that the Wrangler NFR nightly go-round buckle presentations will move from their current location at the Gold Coast Hotel and Casino, to the South Point

San Antonio rodeo hits home stretch

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – For the seventh time in eight years, the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour makes a visit to the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo. This week, the sport's top cowboys and cowgirls are completing their quests for San Antonio glory and earnings that will determine spots in this summer's highly anticipated playoff system that commences after the 21-stop Tour.

Last year, those who experienced success in the Tour round had good odds of walking away with the lucrative average titles. In 2006, steer wrestler Ronnie Fields of Oklahoma City; team ropers Matt Sherwood of Queen Creek, Ariz./Walt Woodard of Stockton, Calif.; saddle bronc rider Rusty Allen of Lehi, Utah; tie-down roper Matt Shiozawa of Chubbuck, Idaho; and bull rider Wes Silcox of Payson, Utah, enjoyed a super Sunday as they claimed both Tour-round and average titles.

This year, the stakes are even higher for this already lucrative rodeo after the overall purse was raised to an all-time high of more than \$1 million, the season's first event to hit that plateau.

Prior to the Wrangler Tour round, scheduled for 7:30 p.m. CT in the AT&T Center, ProRodeo's top 40 bull riders will take the limelight for the season's third stop on the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour*, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches. Competition is slated for 1 p.m.

On Feb. 1, reigning world champion bull rider B.J. Schumacher started defense of his title by winning the first San Antonio Xtreme Bulls Tour-stop title, riding two bulls for 180 points and checks worth a staggering \$22,052.

Dodge Xtreme Bulls, the PRCA's world

Rodeo News and Notes

- ▶ **Timed events start San Angelo.** Tie-down roping, team roping and barrel racing recently completed early-round competition at the San Angelo (Texas) Stock Show and Rodeo, setting into action the 75th edition of the event.

Regular performances begin Feb. 15 and continue through Feb. 18. After a break, the rodeo hits the home stretch with four performances from Feb. 22-24.

The following captured titles during early-round action: tie-down ropers Jerome Schneeberger of Ponca City, Okla. (Round 1, 8.2 seconds, \$3,059) and Cody James of Monticello, Ark. (Round 2, 7.4 seconds, \$3,059); team ropers Matt Sherwood of Queen Creek, Ariz./Walt Woodard of Stockton, Calif. (4.7 seconds, \$2,798 each) and barrel racer Shelly Anzick (Livingston, Mont., 15.08 seconds, \$2,787).

Meanwhile, steer roping completed its three-head event as reigning steer roping world champion and four-time world champion on all-around cowboy Trevor Brazile of Decatur, Texas, took top honors.

Brazile roped three steers in 35.9 seconds, earning checks worth \$4,827. Rocky Garnett of Pratt, Kan., and Chet Herren of Pawhuska, Okla., shared second place with times of 38.8 seconds. Each earned \$3,703.

- ▶ **San Antonio goes red.** The San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo is asking all rodeo competitors and fans to wear red for their "Go Red Rodeo" day scheduled for Valentine's Day, Feb. 14, in an effort to raise awareness about heart disease for the American Heart Association. For rodeo competitors there is an added bonus for wearing red. Those who turn in the highest score or fastest time of the night in each event will receive a \$500 HEB gift card good for groceries or gasoline.
- ▶ **Pendleton Round-Up recognized.** The Pendleton (Ore.) Round-Up was chosen by *True West* magazine's Gail Woerner as her favorite PRCA rodeo in the Jan. 23 issue. Woerner, of Austin, Texas, has spent the past 20 years interviewing people involved in rodeo and is the author of five books that feature bull riding, saddle bronc riding, roping and rodeo clowns. The Round-Up began in 1910 and has become one of the PRCA's elite events.

San Angelo rodeo marks 75 years

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The San Angelo (Texas) Stock Show & Rodeo isn't the biggest rodeo in Texas, but its committee likes to think big and celebrate its accomplishments in a big way.

This year, the event marks its 75th anniversary. For the first time, pyrotechnics were used in opening ceremonies, and a cowboy cotillion was held Feb. 3 at the 1st Community Credit Union Spur Arena. A social hour, silent auction, drawing, dinner, ceremony and dance were among the activities held at the cotillion.

The 75th San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo – the fifth stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour – runs Feb. 15-18, 22-24. The PRCA rodeo kicked off with qualifying rounds for timed events on Feb. 8 at Spur Arena. The nine main performances at the San Angelo Coliseum begin Thursday, Feb. 15, and the rodeo concludes with the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round on Saturday night, Feb. 24.

More than 1,000 contestants are expected to vie for a total purse close to \$500,000. The rodeo has unlimited entries,

and timed-event contestants may compete in up to four rounds, if they advance to the finals.

In 2006, the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo paid a total purse of nearly \$460,000, a nearly 60 percent increase from the purse offered just four years before. The rodeo joined the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour in 2004.

"We came from just a few years ago barely being in the top 100 to being in the top 10, so we've really grown," said rodeo chairman Mark Duncan, who also serves on the Professional Women's Barrel Racing (PWBR) Board of Directors.

The San Angelo rodeo committee is just as proud of its connection to the community as it is of its total purse, Duncan said. A video montage was played before main performances to remind fans of the rodeo's past and its goals for the future. In doing its research, the rodeo committee realized the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo has been a consistent event in a community that has grown and changed through the years.

starting this December.

As a member of the PRCA sponsor family, South Point also will have a presence on the new www.prorodeo.com, which is set to launch the first of March.

"I've been involved with (PRCA) and the NFR for the last 16 years as a local sponsor," said South Point President and CEO Michael Gaughan. "And considering the fact that we now host the PRCA convention, I thought it was a great time to become a national sponsor."

The South Point Hotel and Casino, which opened its doors in December 2005, is located on 60 acres in the southern part

of Las Vegas in one of the fastest growing segments of the valley. The South Point features a complete Equestrian Complex and 150,000 sq. ft. Convention, Exhibit and Banquet Space, where the 2006 PRCA National Convention was held.

championship bull riding tour, made its San Antonio debut in 2003. Near-capacity crowds of 15,000 have taken in the action in recent years, watching Jarrod Ford of Greeley, Colo., and Matt Austin of Wills Point, Texas, the 2005 world bull riding champion, win Tour-stop titles there in 2006.

In San Antonio, each rider competes for part of the \$75,000 purse and placement in the Xtreme Bulls rankings.

In Xtreme Bulls, every contestant competes in the semifinal round, with the top 15 performers advancing to the final round.

The winner of the two-head average wins that stop's title. *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour* earnings count toward the world standings, which determines qualifiers for the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, Dec. 6-15 in Las Vegas.

The San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo follows the Wrangler Tour's first three stops in Odessa, Texas; Denver; and Rapid City, S.D. The Tour resumes Feb. 15 at the San Angelo (Texas) Stock Show and Rodeo and continues Feb. 17 with the beginning of La Fiesta de los Vaqueros in Tucson, Ariz.
