San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo boasts seven figures for 2007 event

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo committee continues to raise the bar in ProRodeo. In addition to boasting the sport's top cowboys and cowgirls along with premier livestock, rodeo officials have increased the total purse to more than \$1 million.

The first of two events on the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour*, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches, helped kick off the 58th annual San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo on Feb. 1 at the AT&T Center. The other Dodge Xtreme Bulls performance is Feb. 17. The 19-performance rodeo, also the fourth stop on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour, began Feb. 2 and concludes during the Feb. 17 night show.

Last year, more than 1 million people attended the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, with about 300,000 on hand for the rodeo and two Dodge Xtreme Bulls Ride Hard Tour performances. The San Antonio rodeo was voted the 2006 PRCA Large Indoor Rodeo of the Year for the second straight year at the Wrangler National Finals

Rodeo in Las Vegas.

This year's total purse of \$1,000,500 is part of the committee's commitment to grow its event and the sport of rodeo, according to Executive Director Keith Martin. The rodeo committee's contribution has doubled from \$375,000 in 2006 to \$712,500 in 2007.

"We're trying to create new rodeo fans and new rodeo heroes - our contestants," Martin said. "We feel that by increasing the purse and the awareness of the sport everyone will benefit."

The San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo will be the first rodeo of the regular season to offer a million-dollar purse. RodeoHouston, which runs Feb. 27-March 18, increased its purse to \$1.275 million, officials announced in November.

RodeoHouston and the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo are the only regular-season PRCA rodeos to surpass the \$1 million mark. The Wrangler NFR is the sport's richest rodeo, with a total purse of \$5.375 million in 2006.

Elshere spurs way to Rapid City crown

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – While most of America was watching the Super Bowl on Sunday, ProRodeo's finest were competing for top money in their quest for rodeo's super bowl - the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in December. The Black Hills Stock Show and Rodeo in Rapid City, S.D., was the stop this past weekend where competitors were hoping to score some big bucks.

2006 Wrangler NFR saddle bronc riding average champion J.J. Elshere dominated his event in his home state to take home the average title. Elshere, of Quinn, won the first

round and later finished in a three-way tie for first with 2005 World Champion Jeff Willert and Willert's traveling partner, Chet Johnson, in the Tour Round. In the end, Elshere finished with a two-head total of 167 points, earning \$7,125 en route to the title.

The Black Hills Stock Show and Rodeo marked the third stop on the 2007 Wrangler ProRodeo Tour. This year's Wrangler ProRodeo Tour consists of 21 rodeos from January through August. Contestants will

Rodeo News and Notes

- ▶ **Ohl claims Fort Worth win.** Cody Ohl, the reigning and five-time world champion tie-down roper, claimed the average title and \$12,222 at the Southwestern Exposition Livestock Show Rodeo, which wrapped up its 30-performance event Feb. 4 in Fort Worth, Texas.

Ohl, who won the overall title by 2.5 seconds over Justin Macha, placed in all three rounds. He clinched the championship with a 9.7-second run in the final round, sharing the top spot with Jim Bob Mayes of Scroggins, Texas. Earlier, Ohl placed second in the second round and eighth in the first round.

Other average champions in Fort Worth were bareback rider Evan Jayne of Marseille, France, 404 points on five head, \$9,112; steer wrestler Shawn Greenfield of Lakeview, Ore., \$12,508; team ropers Speed Williams of Llano, Texas/Dean Tuftin of Prineville, Ore., and Keven Daniel of Altha, Fla./Travis Graves of Jay, Okla., 14.6 seconds on three head, \$5,050 and \$7,175, respectively; saddle bronc rider Rusty Allen of Lehi, Utah, 329 points on four head, \$7,985; bull rider McKennon Wimberly of Cool, Texas, 240 points on three head, \$12,670; and barrel racer Brittany Pozzi-Pharr of Victoria, Texas, 50.73 seconds on three runs, \$13,082.

- ▶ **San Antonio good to Schumacher.** Reigning world champion bull rider B.J. Schumacher won the San Antonio Xtreme Bulls Tour event on Feb. 1, the second stop on the 2007 Tour. It was the second time Schumacher has won the San Antonio Xtreme Bulls stop, the first coming in 2004. In 2005, he won the average crown at the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, adding to his list of accomplishments in the Texas metropolis.

The Xtreme Bulls triumph was his latest victory in the city that always seems to treat him well. He stuffed a check worth \$22,052 into his pocket thanks to his latest San Antonio victory after winning the first round and placing in the final round (88) as well. He scored 180 points on two head and narrowly won the average, beating out Kanin Asay, who finished with 179 points. Schumacher picked up \$11,985 of his total winnings for claiming the average.

Schumacher was teamed up with one of his favorite draws, XS Energy of the Cervi & Guidry string, during the first round, and it showed. Together, the duo scored 92 points, besting J.W. Harris' 91-point ride for the round win.

Schumacher's 92-point ride in the first round tied the record at the AT&T Center, a record he set in 2005. Last year, Wesley Silcox tied the record with his own 92-point score.

Asay, who placed third in the first round, second in the final round and second in the average, picked up the biggest payday of his career, \$18,258 total.

- ▶ **San Antonio goes red.** The San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo is asking all rodeo competitors and fans to wear red for their "Go Red Rodeo" day scheduled for Valentine's Day, Feb. 14, in an effort to raise awareness about heart disease for the American Heart Association. For rodeo competitors there is an added bonus for wearing red. Those who turn in the highest score or fastest time of the night in each event will receive a \$500 HEB gift card good for groceries or gasoline.

choose 15 out of the 21 rodeos to count toward their official Tour Rodeo count and will compete for money this year instead of points as in years past.

At the conclusion of the 21st rodeo, the top 35 contestants in total Tour money and the "wild card," event champions from the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo, will move on to the first Tour Championship event. From there, the top 22 in total Tour money, as well as the wild card from the DNCFR and the champion from the first Tour Championship event will advance to the field of 24 to the second Tour Championship event. At the conclusion of that rodeo, the field will be cut to 12, then to eight and finally to four. The Championship sites will be released at a later date. Fox Sports Network and CBS are scheduled to televise the Championship events only.

Jess Davis took top honors in the bareback riding riding two horses for 168 points and pocketing \$6,178.

Steer wrestlers Levi Wisness and Justin Thompson couldn't seem to separate themselves on the leaderboard, even after three runs. Wisness, of Keene, N.D., and Thompson, of North Platte, Neb., tied for the average win with identical times of 16.2 seconds on three head and they each pocketed checks totaling \$3,961. Bill Boyce of Lewistown, Mont., won the Tour round in a time of 4.0 seconds.

Consistency was the key for tie-down roper Michael Otero en route to the average title in Rapid City. Otero, of Foley, Ala., finished in a tie for seventh in the first round with a time of 9.8 seconds, but finished out of the money in the second round with a 10.2-second run. He returned in the Tour Round on Sunday, posting an 8.0-second run to finish in a tie for second with Trent Creager and just one-tenth of a second off the winning run turned in by Boe Brown with a 7.9. In the end, it was Otero atop the leaderboard with a total time of 28.0 seconds on three head, followed by Brown, of Harrold, S.D., with a 28.7. Otero won \$3,304 for his efforts.

Colorado team ropers Nick Pullara and C.L. Morgan took top honors over the weekend in Rapid City after roping three-head in a time of 16.6 seconds. Pullara, of Pueblo, and Morgan, of Avondale, won the first round with a time of 4.7 seconds, and finished second in the Tour Round with run totaling 5.7 seconds. Shane Schwenke and Marty Becker won the Tour Round with a

5.5-second run. Pullara and Morgan each picked up \$4,903 in Rapid City.

Brenda Seeley of Lander, Wyo., won the barrel racing average title by one one-hundredth of a second over Mel Bachand of Belle Fourche, S.D. Seeley finished with 25.04 seconds on two runs, while Bachand turned in a 25.05. Bachand also won the Tour Round in a time of 12.46 seconds. Seeley won \$4,372, while Bachand picked up \$3,480.

Bull rider Seth Glause reigned supreme in Rapid City winning the two head average with 169 points. Glause, of Rock Springs, Wyo., won the first round with an 87-point ride on Burch Rodeo's Magic Man and then finished second in the Tour Round behind South Dakota's Jesse Bail. Bail, of Camp Crook, rode Southwick, Robertson and Wilson's Jimmy Ray for 87 points to win the round, while Glause finished second with an 82. When the dust had settled it was Glause who finished atop the leaderboard followed closely by Bail with 168 points. Glause picked up \$6,277, while Bail won \$3,610.
