Tour: Let's play two

Rapid City plays host to next stop

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The Black Hills Stock Show Rodeo, voted the best indoor rodeo in the PRCA in 2002, will host the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour's third stop, Feb. 1-4 in Rapid City, S.D.

The sport's top cowboys and cowgirls will battle it out at the Rushmore Plaza Civic Center, starting Friday at the Badlands Circuit's most lucrative rodeo.

The Black Hills Stock Show Rodeo marks the third stop on the 2007 Wrangler ProRodeo Tour. This year's Wrangler ProRodeo Tour will consist of 21 rodeos from January to August. Contestants will choose 15 out of the 21 rodeos to count toward their official Tour rodeo count and will compete for money this year versus points like in years past.

At the conclusion of the 21st rodeo, the top 35 contestants in total Tour money and the "wild card", event champions from the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo, will

San Antonio starts with Xtreme Bulls

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour presented by B&W Trailer Hitches returns to San Antonio for the fifth straight year as part of the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo. San Antonio fans will see the top 40 PRCA bull riders in the world matched with the best bulls vying for a shot at the title at the AT&T Center on Feb. 1 at 7:30 p.m. CT.

Reigning world bull riding champion B.J. Schumacher of Hillsboro, Wis., and 2004 World Champion Dustin Elliott of North Platte, Neb., headline the list of riders. Also competing are 2000 World Champion Cody Hancock of Taylor, Ariz., and Zeb Lanham of Sweet, Idaho, the Dodge Xtreme Bulls overall champion in 2006.

San Antonio also will host the Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour on Feb. 17.

Xtreme Bulls, the PRCA's world championship bull riding tour, made its San Antonio debut in 2003. Near-capacity crowds of 15,000 have taken in the action in recent

Fort Worth action winds down

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The Southwestern Livestock Exposition and Rodeo, one of the winter's most prestigious rodeos with a total purse nearing \$500,000, wraps up Sunday, Feb. 4 at the Will Rogers Coliseum.

The 30-performance event started Jan. 19 and features many of ProRodeo's top cowboys and cowgirls.

First-round action is complete in bareback riding, saddle bronc riding, tie-down roping and steer wrestling. Those winners are

Cody DeMers, Kimberly, Idaho, and Scotty Drennan, Buffalo, Texas, bareback riding, 84 points; Isaac Diaz, Vernon, Texas, saddle bronc riding, 81 points; Cimarron Boardman, Stephenville, Texas, and Clint Akins, Aubrey, Texas, tie-down roping, 8.3 seconds; and Casey Martin, Sulphur, La., steer wrestling, 3.9 seconds.

The top 12 contestants with the top combined scores and times from preliminary rounds will compete in the final round, scheduled for 7:30 p.m. (CST) Feb. 4.

► **Hancock stands tall in Rapid City.** Cody Hancock didn't dazzle early, but the 2000 world champion bull rider came through when it mattered most. Hancock of Taylor, Ariz., produced the only qualified ride during the final round of the first stop of the Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches in Rapid City, S.D., giving him 239 points on three head and the title.

Hancock failed to place in the first two rounds with scores of 79 and 78, respectively. In the final round, however, he rode Broken Arrow's Liquid Courage for 82 points. That same bull carried Cameron Castleberry of Gillette, Wyo., for 89 points, the highest score of the first round.

Hancock earned \$8,742 for his efforts.

He is joined in the announcer's stand by Tim Fuller of Lewiston, Idaho, who will be making his DNCFR debut.
