Eyes on Idaho

DNCFR puts Pocatello on national stage as cowboys compete for prestigious titles

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – For the past 20 years, the city of Pocatello, Idaho, has played host to one of the PRCA's most prestigious and anticipated events, the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo presented by U.S. Smokeless Tobacco. This year marks the 21st installment of the event, which features champions from each of the PRCA's 12 circuits, and national titles will be determined at Holt Arena March 14-17.

Nearly 200 of the PRCA's top circuit cowboys and barrel racers will square off during the four-day event in hopes of claiming championship buckles and major paydays that could help catapult them to the top of the world standings heap. Past champions of the event are a virtual Who's

Who of the rodeo world, including stars such as Fred Whitfield, Dustin Elliott, Cody Ohl, Dan Mortensen, Billy Etbauer, the late Lane Frost, Tuff Hedeman and Ty Murray.

More names will be added to that impressive list this year, and each event will be a wide-open affair. Only one of last year's champions, saddle bronc rider Steve Dollarhide, is returning to defend their title, setting the stage for a host of talented new contestants to claim glory.

Also highlighting this year's field are reigning World Champion Header Matt Sherwood (Turquoise Circuit), 2002 World Champion Bareback Rider Bobby Mote

Big finish: RodeoHouston winds down in historic fashion

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – RodeoHouston, with a \$1.275 million purse that makes it the world's richest regular-season rodeo, concludes this week with the last of five Super Series events, leading to the semifinals and climactic championship round.

The rodeo began Feb. 27 with the first of five individual "super series" rodeos that consist of three rounds each. The top 47 cowboys from last years' world standings, plus three randomly-drawn medical exemptions qualified for entry into the super series rodeos, and there are 10 competitors in each event per super series rodeo.

After three performances, the top four contestants in total money earned in each

event advance to the semifinals, where the scores will be zeroed. Those 20 semifinals contestants will be randomly split into two groups of 10 each for a second semifinal round, scheduled for March 14-15.

The top four cowboys in each 10-man group from the semifinals (eight total) will advance to the final round. However, the cowboys who placed fifth through 10th in the semifinals will have one last shot to advance, competing in one more wild card round on March 16. The top two contestants from that wild card round will advance to the finals, bringing the total number of cowboys in each

Akin Remains Critical 2 Hancock Wins Second Xtreme Bulls Tour Event . . 2

Rodeo News and Notes

- ▶ **Akin remains critical.** PRCA bull rider Lee Akin remains in critical condition in the critical care unit at Baptist Hospital in Montgomery, Ala., following a traumatic brain injury he suffered after being bucked off Smith, Harper and Morgan's Dick Dasteredly on March 8 during the Southeastern Livestock Exposition and Rodeo in Montgomery. Akin, of Weatherford, Okla., suffered a skull fracture after the bull stepped on the left side of his head upon hitting the ground. The Justin SportsMedicine Team was immediately on the scene and assisted in transporting Akin to Baptist Hospital, where he underwent immediate neurosurgery. On March 10, Akin underwent another surgery to relieve additional pressure on his brain. He is currently in a medically induced coma, which is very common with an injury like this as it allows the body to relax and recover more quickly.
- ▶ **Brazile sets Timed Event records.** Trevor Brazile, the reigning and four-time world champion all-around cowboy, added yet another milestone to his growing list of achievements when he won his record fifth Timed Event Championship, which wrapped up March 11 in Guthrie, Okla. In the process, Brazile of Decatur, Texas, also set the five-round aggregate record with an overall time of 281.7 seconds, nearly 6 seconds better than the previous mark of 287.6, set by Daniel Green in 2002. At the Timed Event Championship, 20 top cowboys compete in five rounds of team roping (heading and heeling), tie-down roping, steer wrestling and steer roping. Brazile earned \$50,000 for winning the three-day event and another \$19,000 for posting the fastest time in two rounds and breaking the average record. During the past 12 years of participating in the event, Brazile has earned \$467,500 at the Lazy E Arena.
- ▶ **RodeoHouston on DirecTV.** Late rounds of RodeoHouston will be shown live on DirecTV pay-per-view this week. The first semifinals will be broadcast on March 14 at 7 p.m. CT, with the second semifinal round appearing on March 15 at 7 p.m. CT. The "Wild Card" round will be shown on March 16 at 7 p.m. CT, and the finals will be televised on March 17 at 3 p.m. CT. All programs will be on DirecTV Channel 121 and can be ordered by DirecTV subscribers on their televisions or online at www.directv.com.

Hancock shrugs off injury, wins second Xtreme Bulls Tour event

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Cody Hancock, the 2000 world champion bull rider, won his second *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour* event in four tries this year, conquering the previously unriden Cooper of Southwick and Robertson Rodeo Company en route to the triumph on the Seminole Tribe Reservation on March 10 in Okeechobee, Fla.

Hancock, who scored 91.5 points on Cooper and 178.5 on two rides, earned \$15,058 and moved into the top 10 in the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings. Not bad for a cowboy who was considering not entering Okeechobee due to injury.

Last month, after riding his first bull at the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo, Hancock of Taylor, Ariz., got off

and the bull stepped on his chest. The impact broke one rib, cracked others and slightly punctured one lung.

Instead, Hancock thrived under the competitive spotlight, riding Frontier Rodeo's Clueless for 87 points in the semifinal round, good for a three-way tie for second place and \$2,876.

Jarrold Ford of Greeley, Colo., owned the top score of the semifinals with an 88 aboard Southwick and Robertson's Nickleback. Zeb Lanham of Sweet, Idaho, and Kanin Asay shared second place with Hancock with 87-point rides.

Hancock's 91.5 on Cooper, which had been previously unriden in 18 attempts, was worth \$3,722. He edged Dallas cowboy Bryan Richardson, who earlier posted a 90-point ride.

Allen, Sutton share Montgomery title

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Three-time Wrangler National Finals Rodeo saddle bronc rider Rusty Allen and relative newcomer Billie Sutton shared the top prize at the Southeastern Exposition Livestock Show, which concluded March 10 in Montgomery, Ala.

Allen of Lehi, Utah, and Sutton of Burke, S.D., each recorded 89-point rides, good for \$2,417 apiece. While Allen has ridden in three Wrangler NFRs, Sutton is in just this third year as a professional but coming off a 2006 season that saw him tie for the average title at the Dodge Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo last

November.

Other champions from Montgomery were bareback riders Jason Havens of Prineville, Ore., and Ryan Gray of Cheney, Wash., 87 points, \$2,115 each; bull rider Kanin Asay of Powell, Wyo., 90 points, \$4,010; barrel racer Brittany Pozzi-Pharr, 16.07 seconds, \$2,717; steer wrestler Bucky Harmon of Walnut, Miss., 9.7 seconds on two head, \$2,614; tie-down roper Ben Mayworth of Troy, Ala., 18.9 seconds on two head, \$1,396; and team ropers Miles Kobold of Big Horn, Wyo./Boogie Ray of Mabank, Texas, 10.8 seconds on two head, \$2,373 each.

event in the finals to 10.

After a single round of competition in the finals on March 17, the top four contestants will advance to a "shoot-out round," and that winner will receive the \$50,000 check.

Then, on March 18, ProRodeo's top 40 bull riders will take the limelight for the sea-

son's fifth stop on the Xtreme Bulls Tour, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches. Competition is slated for 3:45 p.m.

In Houston, each rider competes for part of the \$75,000 purse and placement in the Xtreme Bulls rankings.

In Xtreme Bulls, every contestant competes in the semifinal round, with the top 15 performers advancing to the final round. The winner of the two-head average wins that stop's title. Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour earnings count toward the world standings, which determines qualifiers for the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, Dec. 6-15 in Las Vegas.

(Columbia River), 2004 World Champion Steer Wrestler Luke Branquinho (California) and 2000 World Champion Bull Rider Cody Hancock.

Nearly \$400,000 will be up for grabs, and some of the PRCA's best stock will be on display during the four-day event, a prospect that always excites the rodeo's contestants.

"That's a great rodeo," said bareback rider Ben Londo, who won the Dodge California Circuit Finals Rodeo in January. "It's the finals of all the circuits, and next to the (Wrangler) NFR, it's one of the biggest rodeos out there. The horses will be phenomenal there."

Fellow bareback rider Dustin Reeves, who won the Dodge Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo in early November 2006, agrees with Londo and hopes to use past DNCFR experience to carry him to the top.

"For me not making the (Wrangler) National Finals Rodeo or anything, that's the premier event for me to go to right now, so it's real exciting to get to go back again," Reeves said. "I know what to expect there (at the DNCFR) a lot more, and I know what caliber of bucking horses I'm dealing with there. It's just as exciting, but you feel like you know more about what's going on, how the format is and what kind of competition you're up against. It's not as much of a shock to roll in there and ride, so you've got more confidence when you show up

there."

The father-son team of Joe and Joseph Parsons will represent the Turquoise Circuit in tie-down roping, and they will face off against a host of talented ropers that includes current ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings leader Jake Hannum of Ogden, Utah, six-time Wrangler NFR tie-down roper Brad Goodrich of Pendleton, Ore., and Nate Baldwin of Blackfoot, Idaho, the 2004 DNCFR champion.

A "team" title is also up for grabs, as each of the 12 circuits compete to see which circuit's contestants can win the most total money from the event. The Texas Circuit won last year's team competition with \$67,776 in total money, followed by the Wilderness Circuit with \$49,940.

DNCFR Executive Director K.T. Anderson is excited about this year's field and about putting another top-notch event in Pocatello.

"You need a mixture of new guys, former world champions and some people who are knocking on the door to be world champions to make the event successful," Anderson said. "We've got that, and that's what makes our event work very, very well. The cowboys tell us that this is almost like a vacation for them because they're treated so well. This is the only other national event besides the Wrangler NFR that the PRCA has, so we're the other national championship."
