Wrangler Tour continues in Austin

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Rodeo Austin, which is entering the final week of competition, winds up March 24 with the seventh stop on the 21-city Wrangler ProRodeo Tour. For the fifth year in a row, Austin is playing host to the Wrangler Tour, which was created in 2000 by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA).

On March 20, the rodeo's home stretch begins with the final five performances in the Travis County Expo Center. Each show starts at 7 p.m. CT.

This year's Wrangler ProRodeo Tour consists of 21 rodeos from January to August. Contestants will choose 15 out of the 21 rodeos to count toward their official Tour Rodeo count and will compete for money this

year versus points as in years past.

At the conclusion of the 21st rodeo, the top 35 contestants in total Tour money and the "wild card," event champions from the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo, will move on to the first Tour Championship event. Fox Sports Network and CBS are scheduled to televise the Championship events.

Among the highlights of early action from Rodeo Austin includes the early comeback of eight-time Wrangler National Finals Rodeo tie-down roper Stran Smith, who underwent shoulder surgery last Nov. 22. Smith had suffered torn ligaments and a dislocated right shoulder during the American Royal Rodeo in Kansas City, Mo., last October and wasn't expected to return to action until early May.

Rodeo News and Notes

- ▶ **Smart claims Houston XB title.** Bull rider Chance Smart may have finished second in both rounds of the latest *Xtreme Bulls Tour* stop March 18 in Houston, but the native of Philadelphia, Miss., ended a whirlwind day on top after scoring 172 points on two rides.

Smart, who leaped into first place in the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour* overall standings, earned \$21,493 for his two rides.

In the semifinal round, Smart scored 85 points on D H & T Rodeo's Cliff's Edge. That score trailed only the 88 turned in by Logan Knibbe aboard Andrews Rodeo's Erks Me.

Later, Smart recorded an 87-point ride aboard D H & T's Cosmo. Smart then watched Fred Boettcher of Rice Lake, Wis., turn in a 90-point effort on D, H and T's Crossfire Hurricane for the top ride of the final round.

In the end, Smart edged Boettcher - the only cowboys to ride both bulls - by one point to win the title. Boettcher earned \$17,099, while Knibbe, the top rider on one bull, pocketed \$13,983.

Through five of 10 stops on the *Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour*, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches, Smart has earned \$30,850 after winning just \$46,535 since joining the PRCA in 2004.

- ▶ **Swingler joins PRCA Board.** Mark Swingler has replaced Tom Feller as a Contract Personnel Director on the PRCA Board of Directors, effective immediately. The Austin, Texas, resident has been a member of the PRCA since 1992 and last year was elected to serve on the PRCA Contract Personnel Executive Council to represent the association's bullfighters and barrelmen.
- ▶ **Injury sidelines Jarrett.** Ryan Jarrett, the 2005 World Champion All-Around Cowboy, will be sidelined until mid-June after tearing the ACL in his right knee while competing in steer wrestling in Odessa, Texas, on Jan. 13. Dr. Tandy Freeman performed surgery on Jarrett to repair the tear on Feb. 4 in Dallas, and the cowboy has been rehabilitating the knee for the past month.
"I just landed on it wrong, and it was just one of those weird deals," said Jarrett, of Summerville, Ga.

Weekend turns 'super' for handful at RodeoHouston

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – For seven cowboys and one cowgirl, RodeoHouston's innovate Super Series and culminating shoot-out round was just that - super.

Team roping father-and-son tandem Mike Beers, the 1984 world champion, and Brandon Beers were their event's top money winners at the rodeo, which started the first of its five Super Series rodeos on Feb. 27 and ended with the shoot out on March 17. The Beers duo roped its steer in 5.6 seconds to win the four-team final round, good for one \$50,000 check and \$63,100 between the two for the rodeo.

RodeoHouston, with its \$1.275 million purse, is the world's richest regular-season rodeo. Top contestants from the five Super Series rodeos advanced to two

semifinal rounds, where a field of 20 competitors was eventually reduced to four for the climactic "shoot-out" round, in which the winner received a \$50,000 check. All RodeoHouston earnings count toward the ProRodeo Cowboys World Standings.

Other shoot-out winners, with total earnings, were bareback rider Bobby Mote of Culver, Ore., 89.5 points, \$56,833; steer wrestler Jule Hazen of Protection, Kan., 3.6 seconds, \$52,500; saddle bronc rider Rusty Allen of Lehi, Utah, 86 points, \$55,000; tie-down roper Houston Hutto of Del Rio, Texas, 8.2 seconds, \$52,500; bull rider B.J. Schumacher of Hillsboro, Wis., 89.5 points, \$56,000; and barrel racer Codi Baucom of Carthage, N.C., 15.53 seconds, \$60,000.

Bennett highlights 2007 DNCFR champs

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – It might have been the luck of the Irish or just pure determination, but after eight trips to the Dodge National Circuit Finals presented by U.S. Smokeless Tobacco Co., steer wrestler Greg Bennett won his first national title.

Bennett of Lake Luzerne, N.Y., turfed his steer in 4.2 seconds in the Wrangler Round on March 17 to capture his first national title, \$14,453 and a year lease on a brand new Dodge truck.

Bareback rider Wes Stevenson, the runner-up in last year's DNCFR, claimed the championship in 2007 after an 87-point
