No Tour, no problem

Big-money events come to Redding, Surrey

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – There is more than one month between events on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour, but cowboys and cowgirls won't have any problem finding rodeos with healthy payoffs and the top livestock in the business.

The Redding (Calif.) Rodeo and Cloverdale Rodeo & Exhibition in Surrey, British Columbia, start later this week and give contestants plenty of reasons to stay on the rodeo trail until the Wrangler Tour resumes on June 15 at the Reno (Nev.) Rodeo.

Action in Redding, located in northern California about 215 miles north of San Francisco, starts May 17. The three-performance rodeo, which was among the cities on the 2000 summer Wrangler Tour and 2001 winter Wrangler Tour, concludes on May 19. The rodeo starts at 7:15 p.m. PT each day. Growney Brothers Rodeo Company, led by 2000 PRCA Stock Contractor of the Year John Growney, is bringing its best to Redding, which includes some of the toughest bulls in the

PRCA. Additional livestock is being provided by California companies Russell Rodeo and Western Rodeos.

The rodeo also features \$9,000 in added money per event.

The Cloverdale Rodeo & Exhibition kicks off a three-day holiday weekend in Canada. The six-performance rodeo starts May 18 and ends on May 21, Victoria Day.

The Greg and Duane Kesler tandem is providing the bucking stock at the rodeo, which makes Cloverdale a can't-miss stop for bareback and saddle bronc riders. The Keslers came away with more honors at the 2006 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo when Country Cat was named top saddle bronc of the event. In addition, the company is known for Painted Smile, the three-time PRCA Saddle Bronc of the Year, and Skoal's Alley Cat, the 1998. Also, Kesler Championship Rodeo is turning loose its stellar pen of bareback horses. Previously, Kesler Championship Rodeo was honored

Injury sidelines Duarte for six months

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Bull rider Myron Duarte, an eight-time qualifier for the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, will be out of competition for at least six months following surgery to repair a torn rotator cuff in Duarte's right shoulder.

Dr. Pepper Murray of Salt Lake City performed the surgery May 1 and told Duarte that not only should he not do any more bull riding this season, but that he should not do anything strenuous for at least four months.

"He (Dr. Murray) said it was a bad enough tear that if I'd ridden another bull it

could have ended my career," said Duarte, 39. "He said he probably would not have been able to fix it. It wasn't just the bull riding. It was a question of not being able to lift my arm over my head. That got my attention in a big way."

The injury occurred at the Laughlin (Nev.) River Stampede on March 29. Duarte said he knew something was wrong with his shoulder when he left the arena that night and by the next morning he couldn't lift his arm and could barely move

▶ **Barton diagnosed with cancer.** PRCA announcer Derek Barton of Wheatland, Wyo., was recently diagnosed with colon cancer and is scheduled to undergo surgery on May 15 at Cheyenne (Wyo.) Regional Medical Center.

The announcement was made May 11 via an e-mailed press release from KYCN-KZEW in Wheatland, where Barton serves as a weekday morning radio personality. Barton confirmed the report from his home on May 14.

"Something told me to go to the doctor," said Barton, 42, who became a PRCA member in 2001. "I wasn't feeling right. As healthy as I've been, I knew something wasn't right."

A colonoscopy on May 10 revealed an aggressive form of the disease found in his colon.

"I had a physical about a month ago, and everything was fine," Barton said. "When I started not feeling well, I got checked again. Now, I have an aggressive form of cancer that doctors aren't used to seeing in the colon. I'm in good hands, though."

Barton expects to be hospitalized for about one week. He said there's a 75 percent chance that he'll begin chemotherapy treatments afterward.

A native of Wheatland, located about an hour north of Cheyenne, Barton announces 30-40 rodeos per year, ranging from high school to professional. He and his wife Jamie are parents of three daughters: Ciji, Cassidi and Kaithlynn.

Melvin, reconstructed shoulder, make season debut in Guymon

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Although Dru Melvin's right shoulder popped out of place nine times last season, the Tryon, Neb., steer wrestler said that qualifying for his first Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, despite the pain, made it all worth it.

"I don't have any regrets," said Melvin, 24. "I was fresh out of college, on the road and in the mix for a world title. All of the sudden, my dreams of being at the Finals were coming true. I just had to suck it up and keep going."

Melvin, who underwent surgery last Dec. 14 at the Kansas Orthopedic Center in Wichita, Kan., to completely reconstruct his shoulder's anterior ligament, returned to the rodeo arena for the Guymon Pioneer Days, May 4-6, winning \$5,141 after placing second in the third round with a solid time of 4.2 seconds and finishing fourth overall.

One year ago at the Pace Picante ProRodeo Chute-out in Tulsa, Okla., Melvin reached out for his steer but missed, landing awkwardly on his

it without pain.

"I was first told it might just be a muscle thing," Duarte said, "and I thought I could wait it out. It just never got any better."

It was Duarte's seventh surgery since Nov. 2003, four on his knees and one each for a broken forearm, broken jaw and the shoulder.

This will be the longest interruption to Duarte's 16-year rodeo career. A surgery on his left shoulder in Jan. 1998 sidelined him for nearly five months and a knee operation in 2004 put him on the shelf for four months.

"It's tough because I was off to a pretty good start with about \$16,000 (\$15,454) in a limited schedule and I've been riding good," Duarte said. "I placed at San Antonio, Houston, Tucson (Ariz.) and won at Bay City (Texas)."

shoulder. Still a contender for the Wrangler NFR, Melvin continued to compete, experiencing his share of peaks and valleys along the way.

"They hauled me off in a stretcher in Cheyenne (Wyo.), then I came back a week later and won Phillipsburg (Kan.)," Melvin said. "It was like that all year. But I'm back in the mix now, and I'm glad to be back."

It was Melvin's plan all along to return in Guymon to give himself time to regain his rhythm and confidence in time for the lucrative summer season. After four head in Guymon, it appears he's on his way.

"I'm pretty well self motivated, and I knew I needed to be completely healthy when I came back," Melvin said. "That made me want to do the rehab that much more. The shoulder really felt good in Guymon. I had two solid runs and won a little money. I hope to be in full swing by Reno (Nev.) and be at it for the rest of the summer."

Duarte is 31st in the world standings with the heart of the season lying just out of his reach.

As much as Duarte hated the news, he knew better than to doubt Dr. Murray's verdict.

"This is the same doctor," Duarte said, "who told me I could ride again seven days after an arthroscopic knee surgery. And I won at Cody (Wyo.) on the eighth day after surgery – the biggest Fourth of July rodeo. I trust his judgment."

Duarte, of Auburn, Wash., has career earnings of \$951,463. He made it to the Wrangler NFR in 1995-97, 1999, 2002-04, finishing in the top five in the world three times, in 1996, 2002 and 2003.

He is the bull-riding representative on the PRCA Contestant Executive Council and has a syndicated radio show about rodeo in Hawaii.

offers \$20,000 of added money per event.
