Ahead of the pack

RodeoHouston shapes standings leaders in roughstock events during first half of '07

EDITOR'S NOTE: For the next two weeks, the PRCA news release is focusing on each event heading into the summer run. This week, the roughstock events – bareback riding, saddle bronc riding and bull riding – are profiled. Look for a focus on the timed events next week.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Halfway through 2007 ProRodeo season, standings leaders in the roughstock events of bareback riding, saddle bronc riding and bull riding have pronounced leads in their respective specialties, thanks to RodeoHouston and its innovative Super Series bracket system and big-time payoffs.

The rodeo, which ran from Feb. 27-March 17 at Reliant Stadium, debuted a new bracket-style format and record \$50,000 payouts to the champions, setting the stage for high drama on the event's final day. The rodeo paid \$1,139,998 to a total of 202 contestants, with the champions of the Super Series Championship virtually punching their tickets for the

Wrangler NFR in the process.

Early skeptics of the rodeo questioned the complicated format – which featured five separate Super Series rodeos and a Wild Card round that led up to the Super Series Championship – and the dropoff in the payout of \$50,000 to \$3,500 from first to second place.

Contestants, especially, left the arena pleased with the outcome. Just ask 2002 World Champion Bareback Rider Bobby Mote, Reigning World Bull Riding Champion B.J. Schmacher and three-time Wrangler NFR saddle bronc qualifier Rusty Allen. Thanks to winning Houston's big prize, those three cowboys hold large

Cowtown Rodeo opener highlights week ahead

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – When Memorial Day weekend rolls around, it's time for another one of ProRodeo's great traditions to start another year of fun and entertainment in the Mid-Atlantic region. On May 26, the Cowtown Rodeo in Pilesgrove, N.J., starts its 53rd season as the country's longest-running Saturday night rodeo.

The Cowtown Rodeo was founded in 1929 by Howard "Stoney" Harris Jr. It ran every year until World War II forced the rodeo to close. In 1955, Howard Harris III restarted the rodeo, and the third generation of the Harris clan, Grant, runs Cowtown now.

The Saturday night rodeo, which starts

at 7:30 p.m., is scheduled to continue through the last weekend in September.

The Cowtown Rodeo highlights the Memorial Day weekend, which offers cowboys and cowgirls events in 11 venues from coast to coast, including the Will Rogers Stampede in Claremore, Okla. Started by veterans following the end of World War II, the Will Rogers Stampede rolls on as one of Oklahoma's oldest PRCA rodeos. This week, the event enters its seventh decade as its 61st edition kicks off on May 24 for the first of three nightly performances at Will Rogers Stampede Arena.

Each event offers \$2,001 in added money per event, up from \$1,750 in 2006.

Rodeo News and Notes

- ▶ **Barton home after surgery.** PRCA announcer Derek Barton of Wheatland, Wyo., underwent successful colon cancer surgery on May 15 and recently returned home after a weeklong hospital stay at Cheyenne (Wyo.) Regional Medical Center.

Next for Barton, 42, is a scheduled June 8 appointment with a specialist to discuss the strategy for beating the disease, which has spread to his lymph nodes. Barton expects to start both radiation and chemotherapy treatments later this summer.

"The doctors feel real good about the colon cancer surgery and isolating it there," Barton said. "Now it's dealing with it in the lymph nodes. We think we caught it early enough, and it's just a matter of getting the radiation going and getting it taken care of. It's sure nice to get home, though."

A colonoscopy on May 10 revealed an aggressive form of the disease found in his colon.

- ▶ **Bull rider Joslin injured.** Kyle Joslin, a bull rider from Caldwell, Idaho, will miss the next six months after sustaining a back injury that required surgery at the Redding (Calif.) Rodeo. According to the *Redding Record Searchlight*, Joslin made a qualified ride on May 18, but after dismounting and landing on the ground, his bull, named Oscar, turned and hit him in the back. He was removed from the arena on a stretcher.

The following day, he underwent surgery for repair a dislocated cervical spine.

- ▶ **Pink chaps for TETWP.** Leather Design, a company owned by designer B.J. Griffin, is stepping up to help raise money for breast cancer charities. Griffin, of Powell, Wyo., is producing specially designed chaps and chinks featuring the Wrangler logo, and 10 percent of the profit from sales of the chaps and chinks are being donated to the cause. Saddle bronc rider Jake Griffin wore a pair of the chaps at this year's Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo, and both the chaps and chinks are available for sale. Oakes, Silcox split Redding title

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. — Bull riders Zack Oakes and Wes Silcox both recorded 85-point rides at the Redding (Calif.) Rodeo, earning a share of the title and \$4,342.

Earlier this year, Oakes, of Tonasket, Wash., won the title at the Xtreme Bulls Tour stop in Laughlin, Nev. It's the second recent winning weekend for Silcox, who claimed the average title on May 6 at the Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days.

Other champions from the Redding

Rodeo were bareback rider Clint Cannon of Waller, Texas, 87 points, \$4,993; steer wrestler K.C. Jones of Decatur, Texas, total time not available, \$3,836; team ropers Riley Minor and Brady Minor, both of Ellensburg, Wash., 10.3 seconds on two head, \$3,869 each; saddle bronc rider Dusty Hausauer of Dickinson, N.D., 81 points, \$4,785; tie-down roper Jared Arave of Blackfoot, Idaho, 19.6 seconds on two head, \$3,344; and barrel racer Sherry Cervi of Marana, Ariz., 17.33 seconds, \$3,254.

leads heading into the summer run.

Mote, of Culver, Ore., who won \$56,833 in Houston, had more than double the prize money earned by second-ranked Kelly Timberman, the 2004 world champion bareback rider. Timberman of Mills, Wyo., enjoyed success elsewhere, including the average victory at the Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale, Nev., and a share of the title at the Silver Spurs 118th Semi-annual Rodeo in Kissimmee, Fla.

Other top performances by bareback riders during the first half of the season included Reigning and three-time World Bareback Riding Champion Will Lowe starting his season in style by winning the average title at the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo. Lowe later suffered a broken leg and injuries to his ankle and knee in San Francisco and won't return until the Fourth of July run.

Roughstock hand Cody DeMers of Kimberly, Idaho, won titles at three major rodeos this winter and spring, highlighted by an arena-record 90 points at the Buc Days Pro Rodeo in Corpus Christi. DeMers also claimed titles at La Fiesta de los Vaqueros in Tucson, Ariz., and the Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days.

Schumacher, of Hillsboro, Wis., who won his first world title in 2005, bagged \$56,000 at RodeoHouston and also won \$22,052 at the San Antonio stop on the Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour, presented by B&W Trailer Hitches, on Feb. 1. Schumacher was nearly \$30,000 ahead of the pack that included Chance Smart of Philadelphia, Miss., who was the big winner at the Xtreme Bulls stop in Houston; J.W. Harris of May, Texas, the overall winner in Corpus Christi, Texas; Cooper Kanngiesser of Zenda, Kan., the

Dodge National Circuit Finals champion who also claimed the title at the Laughlin (Nev.) River Stampede; and 2000 World Champion Bull Rider Cody Hancock of Taylor, Ariz., a two-time winner on the Dodge Xtreme Bulls Tour.

Allen, who left last year's Wrangler NFR barely able to move due to a variety of injuries, proved healthy enough when he stood the tallest in Houston, winning \$55,000. Allen actually enjoyed success long before Houston when he earned the average title at the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show in Fort Worth, Texas. Allen also earned a share of the title at the Southeastern Livestock Expo Rodeo in Montgomery, Ala., putting the cap on a first half that saw the Lehi, Utah, cowboy bag more than \$84,000, more than any other cowboy in a single event.

The pool of talented riders behind Allen, however, isn't about to let him ride away without a fight. Newcomer Taos Muncy of Cedarvale, N.M., trails Allen by some \$45,000 but has shown the ability to ride in the clutch by winning a share of the title in San Antonio and Guymon, Okla. Cody Wright of Milford, Utah, a four-time Wrangler NFR qualifier, ranks No. 3 and had a solid first half, highlighted by triumphs in San Antonio and Red Bluff, Calif. Brad Harter of Weatherford, Texas, won the title at the National Western Stock Show and Rodeo in Denver and later added Laughlin, Nev., to his list of 2007 accomplishments. And don't forget about Rod Hay, the eight-time Canadian champion and 17-time Wrangler NFR contestant, who earned the title in Tucson, Ariz., before splitting the overall crown in both Corpus Christi and Guymon.
