Cowboy 'Sense'

Kentucky Derby-winning trainer got start as ProRodeo bull rider

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Before Carl Nafzger became a world-class horse racing trainer – one of just 18 in 133 years to have won the Kentucky Derby twice – he was also a world-class bull rider on the ProRodeo circuit.

He was rated No. 3 in the world in 1963, and for three years straight he made the National Finals Rodeo, finishing 10th in 1964 and 14th in 1965.

In the days leading up to his May 5 Derby win with Street Sense, Nafzger told Tom Archdeacon of the *Dayton (Ohio) Daily News* how the first time he ever got his name in the paper, it was for bull riding. He proudly showed the clipping to a circuit veteran just before going out the

next day and getting tossed by a bull. "Too bad that bull can't read," the old-timer told him.

Like all bull riders, Nafzger paid a steep price for his success over 12 years on the circuit (1959-71).

"Broke my nose seven times," Nafzger said. "Broke my leg. Broke every bone basically. Got a rod in my leg ... But my teeth now, they work a whole lot better'n some folks' cause I can take mine out."

And yet he said training thoroughbreds is tougher: "You get beat up mentally, and that's a lot worse."

Veteran, newcomer share Guymon title

GUYMON, Okla. – Many rodeo fans already know the name Rod Hay. On Sunday, fans got a glimpse of a future star saddle bronc rider by the name of Taos Muncy. The veteran and the newcomer tied for the two-head average title at the 75th Guymon (Okla.) Pioneer Days Rodeo, the 13th of 21 stops on the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour.

Hay, of Wildwood, Alberta, Canada, is a 17-time Wrangler National Finals Rodeo qualifier and has made it to the Super Bowl of professional rodeo every year since 1992.

Muncy has had his pro card just two years. The 19-year-old native of Cedarvale, N.M., attends Oklahoma Panhandle State University, located about

10 miles from Guymon in Goodwell.

The saddle bronc riders finished Oklahoma's richest rodeo knotted with a total of 170 points on two horses. Muncy earned checks worth \$3,822 while Hay pocketed \$3,465.

"It's awesome," said Muncy, who has studied Hay's riding skills. "It couldn't be any better than to tie with him."

Hay, who carried a first-round score of 82 points into the finals, won the Wrangler ProRodeo Tour Round with an 88-point ride on Night Train of Powder River Rodeo.

"He rides all different types of horses the same," said Muncy about Hay. "Some

► **Akin heads home.** Bull rider Lee Akin was transported to an Oklahoma City hospital on an Airvac flight May 7 to continue treatment for the traumatic brain injury he suffered at the Southeastern Livestock Exposition and Rodeo in Montgomery, Ala.

Akin, 32, was injured March 8 when he was bucked off Dick Dasterdly and then stepped on by the bull. Akin underwent two surgeries at Baptist Medical Center South in Montgomery, Ala, and is facing at least one more at the University of Oklahoma Trauma Center before beginning rehabilitation, according to Dr. Will Smith.

The attending physicians in Montgomery were able to get Akin's seizures under control late last month and he was able to move out of the Intensive Care Unit on April 30. When Akin's condition remained stable for a week, the decision was made to transfer him to a facility closer to his home in Weatherford, Okla.

The PRCA Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund is supplying funds for the family's living expenses, but the greater concern is covering the cost of medical treatment. ► **Battles fundraiser.** A team roping fundraiser is scheduled for May 12 in Paris, Texas, to further aid in the mounting medical bills for PRCA Gold Card member Charlie Battles, who suffered a stroke on March 23.

The event will be accompanied by live and silent auctions.

Battles is recovering at a rehabilitation facility near his home in Detroit, Texas, after experiencing paralysis on his right side and trouble speaking. guys get along with certain horses. He gets along with all of them. He's really consistent."

Muncy clinched the tie with Hay by scoring 87 points on Carr Pro Rodeo's Coffee Bean in the Tour Round.

"These young guys aren't asking for any special favors," Hay said. "They're coming out and taking the money where they can."

In other events, J.D. Kibbe of Portales, N.M., placed first in the tie-down roping and also claimed all-around cowboy honors. He also qualified for the Tour Round in team roping and finished fifth in the average with heeler Nano Garza of Las Cruces, N.M.

Coming off a record-setting win at the Buc Days Pro Rodeo in Corpus Christi, Texas, Cody DeMers of Kimberly, Idaho, won another Tour stop, his third Tour win of the year, by finishing first in bareback riding with a combined two-head score of 169 points.

Chris Lawson of Gonzales, Texas, and Jade Corkill of Fallon, Nev., partnered to win the team roping with a four-head time of 41.1 seconds. Buffalo, Okla., cowboy Buster Record Jr., the 2002 World Champion Steer Roper, won his signature event in 84.5 seconds on five head. Hunter Cure of Electra, Texas, was the fastest in the steer wrestling by finishing with a time of 18.1 seconds on four head.

Cassie Moseley of Texico, N.M., won the barrel racing title with horse, Mitey Man, an 8-year-old gelding she trained herself. Moseley's three-run time was 49.76 seconds. In bull riding, Wesley Silcox demonstrated he is back in strong fashion after overcoming a nagging injury to the wrist of his free arm. The Payson, Utah, cowboy, who scored 88 points in the first round, tallied 91 points on Spin Dippin' of Stace Smith Pro Rodeo in the Tour Round to win the event.

It had been 17 years since Nafzger, 65, last got to the infield at Churchill Downs to pick up the garland of roses, with Unbridled in 1990. He had been back to the Derby only once in the intervening years and that horse – Vicar in 1999 – finished 18th.

Wrangler ProRodeo Tour in early August, the top 35 contestants (35 teams in team roping) in total Tour money and the "Wild Card," event champion from the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo will move on to the first Tour Championship event, Aug. 14-18, in Caldwell, Idaho. "Somebody asked why keep training if you didn't think you'd be back to the Derby?" Nafzger told the *Dayton Daily News*. "And I said, 'Have you ever heard that old saying?' I never had an owner commit suicide who had a good 2-year-old in the barn."
